Dear guests of airBaltic,

As we embrace the springtime month of March, the aviation industry is already anticipating the transition to the summer flight schedule. Accordingly, *airBaltic* is set to provide 13 new destinations from the Baltics and Tampere, thereby extending our network to more than 100 direct routes. This time, the focus is on central and southeastern Europe, introducing cities such as Chisinau, Pristina, Skopje, and Tirana, with an aim to further diversify our product. However, the list of recent events at the airline is equally diverse, which I am eager to share with you today.

The expansion of our network coincides with significant milestones in the growth of *airBaltic's* fleet. We have recently celebrated the arrival of our 47^{th} *Airbus A220-300* aircraft, marking our largest fleet to date. This addition is not just about numbers; it also highlights our commitment to innovation and sustainability, as evidenced by surpassing 150,000 flights with the *A220-300* since its introduction in 2016. Moreover, this year we're looking forward to reaching the milestone of 15 million passengers carried on the *A220-300*.

Our efforts and strategic decisions at the start of this year have been recognised on the international stage as well, with *airBaltic* receiving the Europe's Second-Youngest Aircraft Fleet 2023 distinction awarded by *ch-aviation*. This achievement, which emphasises our fleet's average age of 3.8 years, positions us among Europe's most modern airlines.

But we're not stopping there. Further demonstrating the airline's commitment to progress and development, *airBaltic* has just launched the construction of the Baltic Cargo Hub at RIX Riga Airport. Scheduled to become the largest facility of its kind in the Baltics, this project will elevate the whole Latvian aviation sector and set new regional standards in air cargo logistics.

Alongside our infrastructure advancements, we must also highlight the *airBaltic* Pilot Academy. With the 21st group of new students already enrolled (bringing us to the milestone of our 200th student) and more than 120 active students (of which more than 10% are female), the academy is a beacon of our investment in the future of aviation.

Overall, the first quarter of 2024 has started off the year dynamically. As an ambitious airline, *airBaltic* will continue to demonstrate its strong and growing position in the Baltic market through extensive connectivity options within Europe and beyond as well as through its diverse, high-quality services and state-of-the-art innovations.


TAMPERE BURLESQUE EXPERIENCE March 15-17



MORE ABOUT airBaltic DISC **GOLF PARK**

You've most likely heard of golf and frisbee, but the younger sibling of these sports - disc golf - has yet to gain wider recognition in Latvia. To promote this fun activity and make Riga an appealing destination for those passionate about an active lifestyle and outdoor activities, airBaltic has recently partnered with Ufogolf Disc Golf Park in Mežaparks, Riga's picturesque forest district. The disc golf park, which opened back in 2013, will continue to host numerous local and international

airBaltic Disc Golf Park offers two specialty courses: the Main Course with 19 baskets, and the Beginners' Course with ten baskets. It takes a few hours to complete each course, making disc golf a great way to spend time outdoors and explore the enchanting forest. The pine trees in Mežaparks create natural obstacles that add an extra layer of challenge and strategy to the game. In addition, a game can be accompanied by a refreshing stroll to nearby Ķīšezers Lake for magnificent views.

Thanks to its active nature and no direct contact with the ground, unlike golf, this sport can be played throughout the year regardless of weather conditions.

IN THE WORLD

The first disc golf games were played in the 1960s, and there are currently around 255,000 registered players in the world. Even though it's unclear where the idea of disc golf first emerged, Finland, Sweden, and Estonia are among the countries with the highest density of disc golf courses. Every year, disc golf enthusiasts pay a visit to Tampere in Finland, where the European Open championship takes place.



More than 30 years of the Latvian Grand Music Award

March is the most significant month for classical music enthusiasts in Latvia. That's because ever since 1995, a professional jury has been awarding the prestigious Grand Music Award to Latvian classical music artists for their achievements.

Given the scale of this meaningful event, it takes place in the picturesque Latvian National Opera House, where the whole industry will gather this year on March 12. The prominent Grand Music Award has existed almost since Latvia regained its independence in 1991. Established by the then Minister of Culture and beloved Latvian composer Raimonds Pauls, the award celebrates the rich Latvian classical music scene. The silver statuette itself symbolises the importance of classical music in Latvian culture generally, while the monetary prize for the award winners serves as encouragement to keep carrying Latvia's name out into the world and nurturing the timeless beauty of classical music.

A few months before the grand event, the seven jury members select nominees who have proven their talent and delivered exceptional performances or compositions throughout the year. Similarly to other music awards, the Grand Music Award recognises the achievements of Latvian artists in



eight different categories. The recipients of the Award for Lifetime Achievement are always known in advance, while the winners of the other seven categories are announced from the list of nominees on the celebratory night at the opera house. In addition to composer Vilnis Šmīdbergs and pianist Arnis Zandmanis, who will receive the Award for Lifetime Achievement this year, awards will also be presented to the best new musician, new composition, ensemble, interpretation, chamber music performance, and concert of the year, as well as for outstanding performance throughout the past year.

Even though Latvia is a small country, its classical music landscape features numerous outstanding artists who are also known beyond the country's borders. Past Grand Music Award winners include such recognisable names as the Grammy Award-winning Sinfonietta Rīga chamber orchestra and Latvian Radio Choir, world-renowned opera singer Elīna Garanča, and accordion virtuoso Ksenija Sidorova. Winning this reputable award has not only etched the artists' names in Latvian music history but has also served as an invaluable foundation for future growth on a global scale.

Going on a musical journey together with Latvia's marvellous classical music artists is a must when visiting Riga. Sinfonietta Rīga often performs at the Great Guild Hall in Riga, while the Latvian Radio Choir can be heard at intimate concerts in Riga's churches. The Great Guild Hall also houses the Latvian National Symphony Orchestra, which is currently led by the 23-year-old Finnish conducting virtuoso Tarmo Peltokoski. If you wish to experience the magic of opera, the Latvian National Opera presents numerous performances every week to delight music lovers. muzikasbalva.lv

The Harriet Backer exhibition at

the Nationalmuseum is dedicated to a pioneer of Norwegian art (until August 18; Södra Blasieholmshamnen 2; nationalmuseum.se). Considered one of the most influential female artists of the late 19th and early 20th centuries, Backer (1845-1932) was a skilled portraitist and, even more so, an influential colourist. Over the course of her international career, which spanned from Norway to Munich and Paris, she created around 180 works, about half of which can be seen at the current exhibition. While inspired by impressionism and Claude Monet's oeuvre, she also carried on the tradition of realism and naturalism. The interplay of the indoors and outdoors in her work, as well as the contrasts of the seasons and times of day - from winter to summer, from morning to late evening resonate with exceptional visual poetry.

The trendy *Esteriör* Scandinavian design showroom recently opened its own cosy café, named **Cafériör**, which blends a memorable interior experience with simple yet mouthwatering culinary delights (Åsögatan 144; esterior.se). Exuding the vibes of Parisian and American cafés, *Cafériör* has a white-tiled bar counter and a transparent glass-block wall, small colourful stools, and cute round tables. Some of the furniture items are available for sale in the shop. The menu focuses on bagels and a selection of cookies to enjoy with *fika* – the traditional Swedish coffee-and-cake ritual. The coffee is delicious, and there's also a selection of teas and alcohol-free cocktails to enjoy.

Connect with Nordic nature at Hellasgården, a favourite recreational area among locals that lies just a 20-minute bus ride south of Stockholm in the Nacka Nature Reserve (Ältavägen 101; hellasgarden.se). The picturesque lakeside is surrounded by cosy cottages for an overnight stay as well as several cafés and restaurants. Hellasgården attracts visitors with a range of activities year-round, such as hiking or bicycling along its numerous paths. One must-do experience here is booking the traditional sauna, with an invigorating dip in the ice holes on Lake Källtorp after each session in the steam. As to the other activities, cross-country skiing is a favourite in winter. In summer, the lake entices swimmers with its sandy beach, volleyball and tennis courts, and canoeing.

Opened in 2022, Kunsthalle Praha is the newest edition to Prague's creative museum scene. One of the current exhibitions at this centre for contemporary and modern art is Read by Elmgreen & Dragset (until April 22; Klárov 5; kunsthallepraha.org). Inspired by the Czech capital's literary heritage and culture of libraries, the Berlinbased artist duo has transformed the Kunsthalle space into a minimalist version of a public library and brought in works by sixty other international artists. The showcase questions our relationship with books as physical objects in the digital era. In Gallery I, for example, massive rows of bookshelves appear together with meticulously integrated works of art. On Wednesdays and weekends, the Prague Diaries performance features five men seated at a long table and writing in their diaries. Visitors are free to approach them, lean over their shoulders, and read their notes.

Prague has gained a new 'sculpture in the city' the **Štvanice Footbridge**. Featuring slim, minimalist lines, the 300-metre-long bridge is made of ultra high-performance fibre-reinforced concrete that resembles white marble, which is why it's often likened to a sculpture. Its sleek appearance contrasts with the abundance of greenery in the area and statuesquely reflects in the waters of the Vltava River. This new landmark by *Atelier Bridge Structures* and Blank Architekti connects the residential area of Karlin with the cosy Holešovice neighbourhood. Another branch of the bridge takes pedestrians and cyclists to Štvanice Island, where a sports area is located. Look at the ends of the handrails for memorable bronze accents in the shape of various animal heads. These small sculptures were created by artist Aleš Hvízdal.

Easter markets rule in the Czech capital during March and April. Ornate wooden huts scattered across Old Town Square and Peace Square offer traditional handicrafts, embroidery, hand-painted Easter eggs, and a wide range of traditional local sweet and savoury delicacies, as well as the best Czech beers to wash them down (March 16 - April 7). The Náplavka embankment (Rašínovo nábřeží) hosts farmers' markets every Saturday from 8 am to 2 pm, offering fresh, seasonal farm produce, flowers, local drinks, and natural cosmetics. The massive open-air Dyzajn Spring Market in the Prague 7 district showcases original design, artwork, and crafts. The event also includes workshops and music performances. It brings together nearly 180 designers selling jewellery, accessories, home decor, clothing, and toys (March 16-17; dyzajnmarket.com).



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After an extensive three-year-long reconstruction, the Kunstpalast welcomes all to rediscover one of the leading museums in Germany (Ehrenhof 4-5; kunstpalast.de). Approximately 800 new works from its total collection of about 130,000 items are displayed in a chronological route through ll centuries. Regardless of a visitor's age or prior knowledge of art history, the new Kunstpalast app helps them explore the new collection as they walk through it, constantly revealing unusual perspectives on the art. The special 'Rhino Palast' rooms designed by illustrator Christoph Niemann playfully acquaint children with the museum and the limits of visual perception. Even Dusseldorf's legendary underground club Creamcheese has been brought back to life and is now part of the museum. Its bar area has been reconstructed and invites visitors to stav late on Fridays and Saturdays for drinks and music from the 1960s and 70s.

A hidden gem for car enthusiasts, Classic Remise is a free-of-charge hall displaying unique historical vehicles (Harffstraße 110A; remise.de). The circular building was once a roundhouse for locomotives. Now restored, it houses a vast collection of dream cars, from elegant pre-war classics to iconic midcentury models, legendary sports cars, vintage and high-performance vehicles, luxurious sedans, American muscle cars, rare automobiles, limited editions, and timeless classics of Italian and German design – around 300 vehicles in total. Some of the four-wheel beauties are even available for sale. The cars are exhibited in two levels of individual 'garages' as well as in the main central hall, where a beer garden-type bistro is located. Classic Remise also hosts car and motorcycle workshops, sells clothing and souvenirs, and even has a few hyperrealistic racing simulators to try out.

Dusseldorf is home to Europe's largest Japanese community, which is more than 8400 people strong. The buzzing area between the central railway station and the city centre is known as Little Tokyo (japantag-duesseldorf-nrw.de), and visitors strolling along Immermanstrasse and Klosterstrasse are fully immersed in Japanese culture. The windows of snack joints blink with distinctive signboards. The supermarkets are overflowing with quirky goods, delicacies, and accessories from Japan. Bakeries, restaurants, traditional izakaya bars, and authentic sushi, ramen, and noodle soup stalls serve authentic Japanese cuisine. There are even themed hotels and bookstores for manga fans. In other words, it's a real magnet for Japanophiles and curious travellers. Also, don't miss the Japanese Garden in Nordpark, which delights visitors with a meditative atmosphere and blooming cherry trees in spring (Kaiserswerther Straße 380).

Colours on the water

Port Saplaya – the 'Little Venice' of Valencia – is a peculiar Mediterranean gem to discover.

A long strip of sandy beach, romantic boats, and colourful houses reflecting in calm waters – this picture-perfect trio makes Port Saplaya one of the most intriguing spots in greater Valencia. With only some 2000 inhabitants, this small seaside neighbourhood sits less than eight kilometres north of central Valencia in the Alboraya municipality, which is known for its fields of tiger nuts that serve as the main ingredient in horchata, a traditional sweet, milky (and very refreshing) drink.

Port Saplaya's buildings painted in many shades of ochre, yellow, green, and pastel blue bring to mind the Venetian island of Burano and similar multicoloured coastal villages. But here the story isn't about fishermen painting their houses to better recognise them when they're far out at sea. Historically, coastal Port Saplaya was never a fishing village. Instead, it was built in the 1970s as a residential area with summer housing.

The area's layout, which faces the Mediterranean coastline, is rather unusual and therefore so photogenic. A couple of lines of houses surround the port, which is the focal point of the landscape. The mouth of the port intersects a promenade along the edge of the water. A main square with shopping facilities and restaurants is located at each end of the promenade.

Boats park at docks near the doors to homes, like in Venice. Port Saplaya is fully pedestrian, while its urban planning slightly resembles an enclosed medieval city with narrow, irregular streets and tiny piazzas with shade trees. This arrangement was also inspired by the urban landscapes of the Côte d'Azur in France and the Italian Riviera, where small harbours with docks are embraced by dense lines of buildings.

There's also a wide beach with a well-equipped recreational area and beachfront dining facilities. Parades take place between the Patacona and Port Saplaya beaches during the famous Fallas week of celebration in March, and spectacular bonfires and fireworks feature on the Night of San Juan on June 23. In July, the province hosts festivities dedicated to the Virgen del Carmen, the patron saint of sailors, crowned by a vivid procession around the Plaza de la Señoría.

Port Saplaya is easily reached by car or taxi, while the bus from central Valencia takes around 45 minutes. However, to experience the beauty of the Valencian coastline in its full glory, consider renting a bicycle. The port lies only about four kilometres from Valencia's main beach, the Playa de la Malvarrosa, where you can plan a pit stop for lunch at one of the seaside paella restaurants.



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Boa Nova Tea House

Designed by Pritzker Prize winner Álvaro Siza, Boa Nova Tea House is a two-in-one destination, a gastronomic as well as architectural gem. Built in 1963, it underwent a painstaking renovation in 2014 that preserved its original design, which merges with the rocky landscape. Situated on the seafront, it's a place of pilgrimage for architects from all around the world. Foodies, in turn, are attracted by the two Michelin stars that its chef, Rui Paula, has racked up. Titan

Not far from the *Tea House*. the Titan stands majestically in the Port of Leixões. This red giant is a century-old iron crane; in fact, it's the largest steam-powered crane in the world. It can lift 50 tonnes of stone and helped in the construction of what is currently one of the largest ports on the Iberian Peninsula and the largest artificial port in Portugal. The Titan was restored in 2020-21 and is an essential part of the history and identity of the Port of Leixões, the city of Matosinhos, and Portugal's industrial heritage in general.

Hall of Biodiversity

Located in the stunning 19th-century Casa Andresen mansion in the heart of the city's Botanical Garden, the Hall of Biodiversity is a great project of the University of Porto. Here visitors are greeted by a suspended skeleton of a whale and other marvels. The mansion itself was the childhood home of the famous Portuguese writer Sophia de Mello Breyner Andresen. The site is a perfect blend of science, art, and romance.

Batalha Cinema Centre

Located in the city centre, the historic Batalha Cinema Centre is one of the most outstanding examples of the Art Deco style in Portugal. Designed in 1947 by the architect Artur Andrade, it opened again in 2022 after years of renovation. Today it's one of the prime cultural hubs in Porto and a great example of heritage-building restoration. Praça da Batalha 47; batalhacentrodecinema.pt

Albania – from solitude to brilliance

A writer once said that 'Albania is solitude'. For a long time, the country has indeed been something of a *terra incognita* in the minds of many Europeans.

Today it's difficult to speak of the 'solitude' of Albania, because it's a country where hundreds of thousands of Europeans are increasingly willing to spend their summer vacations. And indeed, Albania has plenty to offer: beautiful mountains, magnificent crystalline lakes, well-preserved Ottoman architecture, ancient ruins, and above all, beautiful beaches. After all, the country has exceptional access to both the Adriatic Sea in the north and the Ionian Sea in the south. The Ionian littoral, especially the so-called Riviera of the Flowers stretching from Vlora to Saranda, the most famous Albanian seaside resort, offers magnificent views from the Llogara Pass (1027 metres).

The Albanian mountains are a great place for both alpinism and hiking. But if you must choose only a couple of places, Mount Korab (at 2751 metres, the country's highest peak, located on the border with North Macedonia) and the mountains in Theth National Park in the north of the country, close to the frontier with Kosovo and Montenegro, should be high on your list. Here you can't miss Syri i Cikllopit, or the Eye of the Cyclops. This wonderful heart-shaped lake named after the mythic one-eyed giants is quite unique and has served as a source of inspiration for local legends and folklore.

Begin making your acquaintance with Albania in the capital city, which is where, so far, the only international airport in the country is located. Founded in 1614, as recently as the early 20th century, Tirana still had a population of only about 12,000 people and was a sleepy settlement with a provincial character. The Kulla e Sahatit clock tower and the Et'hem Bey Mosque in the city centre remain as witnesses of those days.

Today an extremely lively and pulsating megapolis in true Mediterranean style, Tirana has many interesting sights, but if you've got a little more time, it's worth taking a trip outside the capital, because Albania offers many other attractions as well.



OUTSIDE TIRANA

Durrës

Once known as the ancient city of Dyrrachium, and the capital of the country until 1920, today Durrës is a busy port city and Albania's second-largest city. Located just 38 kilometres west of Tirana, the rhythm of coastal life pulsates here. Pay a visit to the Roman amphitheatre built during the reign of Emperor Traian in the 2nd century CF Later, in the Ottoman era, the ruins were covered and rediscovered only in 1966 during an archaeological excavation. While the arena once hosted battles between gladiators, today in Durrës you're much more likely to have to fight for a free seat in the street cafés or a deck chair on the nearby beaches. Great seafood restaurants, clubs, cafés, and the long beaches north of the city will make you want to stay a while durres.gov.al

Shkodër

This city about 100 kilometres north of Tirana is located between the mountains and Lake Shkodër near Albania's border with Montenegro. It's a mix of Ottoman, Venetian, and Albanian cultures, where the streets are alive with music and there are plenty of vivid sites, souvenir shops, cosy cafés, and family-owned restaurants Visit Rozafa Castle, which has a special legend behind it and offers some amazing views. Then enjoy the calm shores of Lake Shkodër, or explore the Marubi National Museum of Photography to learn about Pietro Marubi, a 19th-century Italian painter and pioneer of photography in Albania, and see his well-known photos. The city's multicultural character is evidenced by the historic Ebu Beker Mosque and St. Stephen's Catholic Cathedral. visitshkoder.org

Elbasan and Berat

Both towns are good for a day trip from Tirana and show Albania's diverse historical influences Elbasan's old castle and mosques are witnesses to Ottoman influence many years ago, while Berat is called the 'City of a Thousand Windows' due to its old houses spilling down the hill. In Berat, the quaint streets and buildings of the Old Town, which is included on the UNESCO list of cultural heritage sites, take visitors back in time. The Gorica Bridge serves as the perfect spot for a photo with the river and the picturesque houses on the hillside as a backdrop.





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

SR 222 Chiantigiana. This name is sure to make wine lovers tremble. Connecting Florence with Siena, this *strada regionale* (regional road) is among the most scenic in Europe. This is the Italy of postcards.

Think a windows-down, one-armoutside kind of drive through a land of rolling hills, old olive groves, castlesturned-wineries, and traditional villages. The purple-skinned Sangiovese grape reigns supreme here. On the Chiantigiana, you're getting into the very heart of central Tuscany's wine country.

The most popular local product here is Chianti Classico. This wine takes ten months to age, sports a ruby red colour, and features herbal and fruity notes. The best way to taste it is by visiting one of the many wineries along the SR 222. For example, Castello di Verrazzano set in a gorgeous 15th-century hilltop castle surrounded by vineyards. Or the boutique Fattoria Le Fonti winery in the perfect countryside just outside the village of Panzano. There's also the family-run Poggio Amorelli farm with a spectacular terrace overlooking the rolling hills of Chianti.

But the Chiantigiana is not only about wine. It's about experiencing the effortless beauty of central Tuscany. The panoramas here are exactly like the dreamy Italian landscapes depicted in old paintings as well as modern tourist brochures. Taking SR 222 is an easy and highly inspiring slow-travel journey that only requires that you relax and surrender to the pleasant kaleidoscope of the Tuscan idyll outside the window.

Uber-picturesque towns such as Greve in Chianti have graceful pastel-coloured arcaded town squares and Romanesque churches. Make an espresso stop in medieval Castellina in Chianti, which has a dramatic fortified hilltop core and photogenic narrow stone-paved passages. Indulge in the local cuisine on the airy garden terrace of *Ristorante Oltre Il Giardino* in Panzano, where you can try Tuscan dishes such as wild boar ragù with pappardelle, ricotta-filled ravioli, and the glorious Florentine steak. Of course, with Chianti Classico on the side.

The evergreen island

The Opera Park in the heart of Copenhagen is a new year-round oasis that harmoniously blends nature and the urban environment.

Green recreational spaces have always been a priority for Copenhagen, which stands proudly among the most sustainable cities in the world. The Opera Park, which neighbours the Royal Danish Opera House and is set along Copenhagen's inner harbour, is a new magnet for urban relaxation and leisure in this bustling city.

Back in the 19th century, this area welcomed ships carrying precious cargo from all around the world. At that time, most gardens in Denmark were inspired by the romantic and 'informal' structure of English gardens. With its year-round blooming gallery of trees and flowers, Opera Park is a modernised version of a classical garden that invites visitors to participate in the dynamic dialogue between city, nature, and architecture.

Opera Park's design is the brainchild of Cobe, a Copenhagen-based firm whose architects have played a significant role in the transformation of the Danish capital into an exciting city tailor-made for comfortable living. The two-hectare space consists of six garden areas harmoniously linked by winding paths, niches, and multi-level terraces with viewpoints. Here, various botanical environments are brought together in one place: North American Forest, Danish Oak Forest, Nordic Forest, Oriental Garden, and English Garden.

The glass greenhouse at the centre of the park has a flower-shaped layout and a hovering roof. Inside, it houses the Subtropical Garden and a café. It's also connected to the parking garage underneath the park. Visitors can reach the Royal Danish Opera House via a curved, covered walkway over a landscaped bridge. The green roofs of the park's structures capture and delay the release of rainwater while also serving as a food source for birds. The park is also full of curiosities, such as a reflecting pool onto which drops of water fall in a gentle, meditative rhythm.

The different heights and compositions of the park's trees resemble the opera stage with its proscenium, centre stage, and backdrop. They are also planted in such a way as to shield visitors from the winds that blow off the harbour, while the elevated terrain protects the land from potential flooding. The park boasts more than 600 trees, 80,000 herbaceous perennials and bushes, and 40,000 bulb plants representing 223 exotic and local species. It is also dressed in different colours throughout the year. Spring brings a full kaleidoscope of flowers, summer features various shades of green, autumn arrives with fiery reds and yellows, and winter is marked by the hegemony of pines and frozen ponds. 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

airBaltic's Sustainability and Annual Report 2023

The report was signed at the end of last month and is now available on airBaltic's website. Last year was indeed a milestone, with airBaltic carrying approximately 4.5 million passengers, which is 36% more than in 2022. The airline also performed more than 44,000 flights, or 18% more than a year before. But this is only the tip of the iceberg. airBaltic did a huge amount of work behind the scenes to fulfil its sustainability commitments by using more sustainable aviation fuel (SAF) and reducing the amount of carbon emissions released per passenger kilometre flown. The latter fact indicates the advantage of having a single-type fleet operation consisting of the more fuel-efficient Airbus A220-300 aircraft.

Although in 2023 airBaltic continued to increase its growth by operating 18% more flights than in 2022, it simultaneously achieved a 5.6% reduction in CO₂ emissions (0.089 kg vs 0.094 kg) per passenger kilometre. This was achieved by applying several initiatives, including decreasing aerodynamic drag by executing reduced-flap take-off and landing procedures, reducing the distance flown per sector through initiatives such as takeoff in the direction of flight, and adhering to a single-engine taxi-in policy at large airports with extended taxi times, which involves shutting down one engine shortly after landing and taxiing to the parking stand using only one engine.

Another step forward made last year was to offer *airBaltic* passengers the option of reducing their impact on the environment by voluntarily ordering sustainable aviation fuel for their flights (approximately one kilogram for Economy class and one and a half kilograms for Business class). Each kilogram of SAF produces up to 80% fewer CO₂ emissions than a kilogram of fossil fuel. The SAF price per person per flight starts at EUR 2.99, depending on the ticket type.

airBaltic also made its mark in the industry by co-hosting the Sustainability

Forum in Tampere, which was set up to join industry forces. Representatives of airBaltic, KLM Royal Dutch Airlines, Business Tampere, Neste, Finavia, and Stephen Wright, a commercial aviation expert and a professor at Tampere University, discussed how to make aviation more sustainable and overcome the critical challenges the industry faces. Meanwhile, during the IATA World Sustainability Symposium in Madrid, airBaltic signed an agreement to become a data contributor to the IATA CO2 Connect emissions calculator, thereby improving the quality and accuracy of the tool. Expanding this data pool is essential to providing greater transparency and coherence to passengers and stakeholders alike. With continuously expanding data sources, the quality of IATA CO2 Connect's calculations will improve far beyond what any theory-based or model-based tools could achieve.

Last year, airBaltic received several important awards locally and abroad. For the second year in a row, with an average fleet age of 3.8 years, airBaltic was recognised by web-based intelligence platform *ch-aviation* as Europe's Second-Youngest Aircraft Fleet. airBaltic also received the APEX Passenger Choice Award for Best Cabin Service in Europe, an acknowledgement of the airline's excellent onboard service and hospitality efforts. This is one of the most prestigious awards an airline can receive in recognition of its adoption of best-in-world advancements in cabin service, seat comfort, entertainment. and more. Skytrax named airBaltic the Best Airline in Eastern Europe in 2023. And, following a nationwide survey carried out by the CV-Online Latvia recruitment agency, airBaltic was recognised as the best employer in the transport and logistics sector for the twelfth year in a row. airBaltic also received third place in the Best Employer in Latvia category for 2022.

Where the sound setup is a main dish rather than an afterthought



Sound is an unquestionable part of the dining experience, and a new wave of bars in Europe is really embracing it. These establishments are defined by the perfect trio of a painstakingly curated drinks menu, an excellent snack list, and music emanating from a vinyl record player. Mimicking a cosy living room or snug recording studio, these intimate spaces are decked out with impressive sound systems playing well-thought-out sets that, instead of forcing guests to surrender to the music, invite them to enjoy the ambience, company, and drinks without so many other distractions.

These venues draw inspiration from the iconic Japanese *jazz kissa* phenomenon. Rooted in the post-war years, when vinyl records were a luxury, these cafés provided a way for cash-strapped jazz enthusiasts to hear the latest albums on communal sound systems. This gently lit art venue is a reason why Amsterdam's audiophiles flock to Amsterdam Noord every weekend. *Murmur* hosts a diverse programme of music-focused events, including experimental DJ sets, movie screenings, and intimate concerts. Besides a good list of natural wines and great snacks (think focaccia, olives, and sardines), it also hosts occasional kitchen takeovers by creative young chefs.

Bambino Paris in Paris

Hidden behind an unassuming beige façade in the llth arrondissement, this wine bar has become the latest hotspot for fashionable foodies, who come for the superb dishes dreamed up by chef Kenta Tomoda but stay for the groovy vibes featuring funk, disco, and boogie music from owner Fabien Lombardi's own personal collection. The sophisticated menu, much of it cooked in the wood-fired oven, changes regularly, but there are always a few pizzettes baking and bespoke cocktails to enjoy. Vago in Lisbon

Nestled under the streets of the Santos district, Vago distinguishes itself with its high-fidelity sound system and contemporary design. The vaulted brick ceilings and terracotta-red seating paired with wooden tables create an ambience that harks back to the 1970s. The menu satisfies cravings with delectable light bites infused with Mediterranean and Brazilian flavours, accompanied by expertly crafted cocktails. Owned by DJs, Vago frequently hosts music-centred events, and it's not uncommon for a night to conclude with dancing into the early hours. Rua das Gaivotas 11A; IG/vago.lisbo



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

ALICANTE ALWAYS CELEBRATING

Long strips of silky sand and the clear azure waters of the Costa Blanca, imposing mountainous landscapes and history-packed city walks, mouth-watering delicacies and lively social life multiplied by the strong presence of local traditions... And that's not even mentioning Alicante's 549 hours of sun per month and its title of 'sunniest city in Europe'. What more do you need for a perfect Mediterranean vacation?

It's a warm evening, and I slowly descend the steep steps of the Barrio Santa Cruz, a vibrant residential neighbourhood of Alicante, to the bustling soundtrack of laughter and late-night chats. A string of lights illuminates the sky and colourful flags wave in the breeze. As I reach the Plaza del Carmen viewpoint, the sound of drums and an orchestra become louder. Leaning over the railing together with the local kids, I see her – the Madonna.

It's the religious procession known as the Canonical Coronation of Our Lady of Mercy heading uphill from the Cathedral of San Nicolás to the small chapel of the Santa Cruz Hermitage. The leading figure in this sacred spectacle, a majestic wooden statue of the Virgin Mary adorned with flowers and candles, is carried on a pedestal. Clergymen, girls in traditional dresses, gentleman in their best suits, women wearing black lace mantillas, and old señoras in their best dresses and high heels all accompany the procession.

If I reached out my arm, I could almost touch the pedestal, which is carefully and rhythmically carried by young boys and girls. At this time of year, I may be the only visitor in the crowd, but I feel like I belong. There's suspense in the air as the pedestal must be rotated and carried up the stairs. A poster stretches across the narrow street between two buildings. Fingers crossed... But the skilled pedestal bearers squat as a team, and the Madonna's crown successfully passes this barrier without touching it. We all give a sigh of relief.

ALICANTE LIES ON THE SOUTHEASTERN COAST OF THE IBERIAN PENINSULA, facing the gentle waters of the Mediterranean Sea. With more than 3000 hours of sunshine per year, mild winters, and hot summers with little rain, the perfect vacation season here lasts from the beginning of May until late autumn. The imposing Santa Bárbara Castle stands atop 166-metre-high Mount Benacantil, and it's this postcard-like view that's most often associated with the city.

However, this being Spain and the Mediterranean, I begin my tour by exploring the Mercado Central, Alicante's main market. It was designed in 1915 by Francisco Fajardo Guardiola and completed by Juan Vidal Ramos in 1922. I meet my guide, Carlos, at the entrance, where he directs my attention to a portrait of Ramos and points out his prominent nose. Ramos was his grandfather and one of the most prominent architects of Alicante. I don't know whether to believe Carlos, or to consider it just a joke and his way of breaking the ice.

The Eclectic-style market houses more than 300 stalls spread out over an area of ll,l00 square metres. Said to be the largest market in Spain, the Mercado Central has so far managed to escape the European fad for food-court-style design and is still beloved by locals. Alongside the fresh local produce, meats, fish, and cheeses, it's so pleasant to watch vendors of all generations working together here, from teenagers to grey-haired seniors, all charismatic and devoted to their craft.

I try the Iberian ham, *chorizo* sausage, *Manchego* cheese, and delicious Alicante tomatoes (the best I've had) with olive oil and salt. '*Mell'* is how locals express deep satisfaction. The word means 'honey' in the Valencian dialect widely spoken in Alicante. I also try *mojama de atun*, an exclusive snack that consists of the salty dried loin of a tuna. Dried fish are important in this area and a food known since Roman times. In fact,

the ruins of Roman fishpond structures carved out of the rock can still be seen near Albufereta Beach outside of town.

The kaleidoscope of fish varieties in the market is worth a whole photo book – dozens of types of shrimp, octopuses, <code>gallina</code> fish, and even sharks. A woman with pink lipstick and a matching sweatshirt, a blue apron, and a charismatic face with sharp features rules the world behind the <code>Leticia</code> fish counter. She turns the music louder and gracefully moves along with the rhythm, transferring fish from one box to another, washing the trays, packing shrimp for an old lady, and singing along to the songs. This mise-en-scène straight out of a Pedro Almodóvar movie makes my day.

After our tour, Carlos and I walk to the Old Town, chatting along the way about how Alicante differs from its neighbour Valencia: 'Alicante is smaller, and here you can reach everything on foot,' he says. 'We're friendly, but we've got lots of competitive spirit, especially when it comes to football and food. Valencia has paella, while in Alicante we have *arroz*. The main difference between these dishes is the cooking method and the small round *nyora* pepper we use to give the dish a strong, smoky flavour.' There are some 300 types of arroz, from the famous *arroz senyoret* with peeled seafood to black rice with squid ink and arroz with artichokes and octopus. Sounds like a decent reason to move to Alicante and spend the rest of my life trying them all!

Always sceptical about restaurants passionately advertising 'paella and sangria' to tourists, I ask Carlos where I can find an authentic *arroz alicantino*. 'Very easy!' he says. 'If you see the name "paella", avoid it. Locals hate paella. The real arroz is always by the beach, close to the sea. We love eating this dish on special occasions, and we head to the sea, which is more relaxing. *Ponte Rosa* at San Juan Beach is a great local place. In Alicante, try *Santi* by the harbour.'





This being said, I have to mention Carlos' sister, Elena. She's a well-known lifestyle blogger from Alicante who once made a video that went viral, reaching almost two million views. In it, she walked through the city with a huge poster stating 'Don't ask for paella, ask for arroz'. The city's tourist board has also launched an initiative calling Alicante the *Ciudad del Arroz*, or City of Rice, that highlights the importance of local ingredients and traditional cooking methods, sees to the quality of Alicante's signature dish, and awards the best restaurants with special certification.

THE CITYSCAPE OF ALICANTE IS MARKED BY ANOTHER TALL STRUCTURE, THE 97-METRE-HIGH Hotel Gran

Sol. This one, however, is much younger than the castle. The 31-floor skyscraper was built in 1971 and rises from the historical area overlooking the port. *Gran Sol's* façade is adorned with colourful murals by Alicantino artist Gastón Castelló depicting the sun, sea, fishermen, and ships. I stay at the *Gran Sol* because of the spectacular panorama from the *Convistas* restaurant on its top floor. I first step out onto its open-air terrace at the blue hour, when the sun has just set, letting the deep mist of evening take the lead. The rugged mountain on my left and the web of city streets below contrasts with the calm waters of the sea.

Formed by a mix of Jewish, Muslim, and Christian cultural influences, Alicante's history is just as winding as its steep streets. Even the name of the city blends Latin, Greek, and Arabic roots. But life in Alicante changed drastically in 1858, with the arrival of the first train line from Madrid. The economy flourished, as did resort life and tourism.

The Explanada de España, probably the most photographed promenade in Spain thanks to its famous marble tiles set in

a wave pattern, stretches out beneath my feet. Sure, waves of black-and-white tiles also adorn the pavements of Lisbon and the Copacabana seafront in Brazil, but Alicante stands out with its photogenic combination of three colours: ivory, black, and Alicante red. The 6.5 million or so small square tiles were laid along the 1.5-kilometre-long promenade in 1955. Needless to say, flaneuring and people-watching on the Explanada is a favourite activity here, especially in the evenings, when people fill the adjacent cafés and restaurants, and the promenade is full of souvenir vendors, mime artists, and painters.


The shell-shaped Concha stage along the Explanada hosts free musical performances throughout the year. Quite a few intriguing buildings form a backdrop to the promenade as well. The *Real Liceo Casino*, for example, was built in 1867 and served as a social club for jetsetters back in the day. The brown brick building stands out with ceramic decorations representing various maritime civilisations. But the Casa Carbonell, a residential Beaux Arts–inspired mansion built in 1925, surpasses them all.

Enrique Carbonell was a textile businessman from the mountainous town of Alcoy. His daughter had health problems, and it was suggested she come to Alicante for its healing water and sun. One time, on his way to Alicante, Carbonell had an accident with his car and arrived at the local hotel covered in dirt. But because of his shabby appearance, he was not let in. Still resentful, he later built a mansion that cast its shadow over that small hotel, which eventually went broke. Casa Carbonell had 365 windows – one window for each day of the year, so that his daughter could enjoy a variety of views when unable to go outside. Significantly, there are also 365 palm trees along the promenade that begins in front of the mansion.

The Puerta del Mar plaza, which connects the Explanada with the city's main beach, Playa Postiguet, is crowned by a life-size racing yacht. Since 2008, Alicante has been the starting point of the famous Ocean Race around the world. The Ocean Race Museum, set a bit further down the pier, is a must for marine sport enthusiasts. But observing the boats, yachts, and catamarans moored in the marina can be a meditative pastime for anybody. Postiguet Beach lies right at the foot of Mount Benacantil and delights vacationers with a 900-metre-long strip of sand and calm waters. People relax on the benches along the promenade, restless joggers and fitness addicts pass by, beautiful dogs and their owners strut proudly along the runway – these are the charming scenes of coastal life.

I REACH PLAZA DE GABRIEL MIRÓ, ALSO KNOWN AS PLAZA DE CORREOS, and am fascinated by the concept of small oasis-like squares in this busy city. Century-old ficus trees cast their shadows over their massive roots, with some of the tree trunks reaching 1.3 metres in diameter. The round fountain in the middle of the square absorbs the noise from the surrounding streets and features a sculpture by local artist Vicente Bañuls of a woman pouring water from an amphora. Susana Llaneras Rico served as the model, and legend has it that she never showed anyone pictures of herself from her youth; instead, she took them to the fountain so that they could admire the beauty of the sculpture, made when she was 17 years old.



Among the vivid and eclectic streets in central Alicante, Calle de Las Setas – or Mushroom Street – is certainly a curiosity. Situated near the port, the street was once associated with crime and prostitution. To change its image and help local vendors, the authorities announced a make-over competition. As a result, the brick street was painted yellow and green and decorated with giant mushroom sculptures that serve as a playground for children. The controversial project eventually gained popularity and is now a busy street with numerous attractive shops and street-food joints.

Calle Castaños, a nearby restaurant street, has a more noble appearance and boasts several stately 19th-century houses, for example, nos. 14, 16, and 18. Alicante's historical centre also has many unique modernist buildings with bold Arab influences, colourful tiles and windows, and ornate wooden cornices. One of them (with a marvellous rooftop bar) stands on Calle Monjas opposite the 17th-century Convent de las Monjas de la Sangre.

When wandering through the city, an attentive visitor will notice the peculiar little sculptures that sit on the old drainpipes on many buildings. There are hundreds of these 'water faces' across the Old Town. Once you notice one, the rest of your stroll might turn into an adventurous photo hunt for the tiny curiosities. Installed in the 19th century, these faces of devils, angels, and mythological creatures served as talismans to protect the residents and their homes from the spirits of the dead, misfortunes, illnesses, and even rats.

One of Alicante's oldest neighbourhoods, Barrio de la Santa Cruz, lies at the foot of Santa Bárbara Castle. I come prepared to climb countless stairs, and on my way I pass local residents passionately discussing at an outdoor café near a gigantic poster of the Madonna. Santa Cruz feels more like an untouched village and is apparently preparing for a religious celebration. But when



I ask about the coming event, people seem confused – after all, there are festivities, gatherings, and processions almost every week throughout the year in Alicante.

Easter Week, which this year falls on March 24–31, is the most important celebration in Catholic Spain. A variety of themed processions with participants wearing special garments and carrying *pasos*, or floats, topped with images and statues of the Virgin Mary, Jesus, and other Biblical figures and scenes will then fill the streets. Some of these floats take a whole year



to prepare, as they are richly adorned with flowers, lace, and jewels. In Santa Cruz, Holy Wednesday is celebrated with a physically demanding procession that departs from the chapel at sunset, carefully descends the steep steps while bearing the floats, and returns back uphill at dawn.

The nearby neighbourhood of San Roque borders the picturesque La Ereta garden. With its blooming terraces and viewpoints, the garden sits on the slope of Mount Benacantil and offers a pleasant repose before the big climb to the top.

Cicadas chirp and cats lie in the shade while a lonesome gardener collects dry branches under the pomegranate trees. In a glass pavilion at the back of the garden, the lavish $La\ Ereta$ restaurant – which serves traditional local dishes with a modern twist – seems to float over the city.

I'm not normally a fan of medieval fortresses, but Santa Bárbara Castle exceeds all my expectations. As I reach the top via a winding footpath, its scale and aura truly impresses. But don't worry; there's also a lift that takes visitors up to the castle from down by the beach. One of the largest medieval fortresses in Spain, Santa Bárbara was built by the Moors in the 9th century. Alfonso of Castile reconquered the city on December 4, 1248, which happens to be the feast day of Saint Barbara. The castle now hosts concerts, dramatised historical tours, and even culinary experiences. I see the remains of the old church, the hospital, dungeons, tunnels, and walls several metres thick. My journey back in time ends at La Torreta, the upper enclosure, where I greet the sunset, which is casting a warm misty glow on these walls that have seen it all.

As I sit on a bench in front of the Basilica of Santa María, I finish my nougat ice cream and notice a sudden gust of wind blow over a bouquet of flowers at the entrance. I go over to place it upright and pick up a fragrant twig of eucalyptus as a keepsake. The fresh aroma of the white flowers lingers in



the air, but when I enter the church, the scent of wax candles and incense surrounds me. Not only that – it seems I've happened upon a wedding! Beautifully dressed guests, a couple on their knees in front of the altar, listening to the priest, and a few kids running around in the back, where I watch and smile quietly.

The Basilica of Santa María is the oldest active church in Alicante. Built in the $14^{\rm th}$ century on the site of a former mosque, its impressive façade unites Gothic elements with an ornate $18^{\rm th}$ -century Baroque portal. Above the entrance stands a sculptural group of Mary and two angels. And as you move directly towards the central door, a magical 3D effect takes place, and the angels seem to be putting the crown on Mary's head.

Speaking of old public structures, the Asegurada building on the other side of the square from the church was erected in 1685. Originally a grain warehouse, it has also functioned as a prison, artillery storehouse, and school, until it was reimagined as the MACA Museum of Contemporary Art in 2011. Entrance is free of charge, and the collection includes works by Miró, Picasso, Dalí, Alicante native Juana Francés, and kinetic sculptures by Eusebio Sempere.

THERE ARE PLENTY OF OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES TO ENGAGE IN BEYOND ALICANTE. I particularly look forward to a cliff-jumping kayak and snorkel tour, but the strong wind forces a change in plans, so I hop on a tram for the hour-long ride north to Villajoyosa. The name means 'joyful town', and it's the most colourful town on the Costa Blanca.

My ride begins at Serra Grossa, a low limestone mountain and beloved hiking spot behind the Santa Bárbara Castle. I snag a window seat and gaze at San Juan Beach and the small



coastal village landscapes along the way. Villajoyosa greets me with silence; I barely see any people as I walk past the famous 'hanging houses' along the old city wall that rise above the almost dry Amadorio River. But once I weave my way through the narrow streets and reach the beachside promenade, the sound of the waves mixes with the clatter of dishes and the lunchtime conversations of other vacationers.

Back when Villajoyosa was an ordinary coastal village, the fishermen painted their beachfront houses in different colours so it would be easier to find their way back home. The sandy central beach stretches almost 1.5 kilometres long and is more than 30 metres wide, with several palm groves for a paradise-like repose. Other picturesque beaches nearby include the cliffembraced Playa del Bol Nou and the cove at Playa El Paraíso.

After returning to Alicante, I realise there's another hidden gem waiting to be discovered – Tabarca, Spain's smallest inhabited island. Despite the big waves, the catamaran takes me there easily from the port of Alicante. Tabarca was once a Berber pirate settlement and a fishermen's refuge. Less than two kilometres long and only 400 metres wide, the windswept eastern half of the island has a small lighthouse reached via a hiking trail across a scrubby, dry landscape. Connected by a strip of land with a pebble-sand beach, the western half of the island consists of the old town with its narrow streets, restaurants, and souvenir shops. The islet is so small that no map or navigation is needed.

First thing's first – lunch. *Restaurante La Almadraba* overlooks the small pier, and here I try Tabarca's signature dish, *caldero tabarquino*. The main difficulty for a solo traveller in





Spain is that rice dishes are mostly intended for two people. With the few Spanish phrases I know, I manage to convince the hostess to serve me a portion for one. Here, the rice is prepared in an iron pot, just as the local fishermen used to cook it while on their boats, and the fish stew is savoury and delicious.

In the off season, Tabarca is calm and secluded, but no less impressive. The 18th-century Church of San Pedro and San Pablo, one of the most captivating buildings here, faces the mainland. The effect from the powerful architecture and nature is even stronger because, apart from the white cats resting under the massive palms, I'm here all alone, exploring the site. Tabarca is officially a Mediterranean Marine Reserve due to the excellent quality and rich biodiversity of its waters. In summer, it's a paradise for divers and snorkellers, especially the numerous coves and caves with shallow, crystal-clear waters. As I wait for the evening catamaran back to Alicante, I relax on the rugged beach that's open to the winds and waves. The sea salt is drying on my feet, and I imagine how Tabarca Beach will look in a few months, with beach chairs, umbrellas, pedal boats, SUPs, and kavaks.

I spend my last hours in Alicante in the Plaza del Ayuntamiento. A flea market under the porticos offers plenty of curiosities, from vintage postcards and magazines to jewellery. I also watch an event taking place on a stage set up in front of the opulent Baroque-style Town Hall. Girls and women are dressed in richly decorated 18th-century costumes with cupola-like embroidered skirts, aprons, headdresses, fans, and other accessories. These are the *Novia Alicantina*, which were historically worn as bridal dresses.

The event I see is related to the parade of the Beauties. Each year, a Beauty of the Fire is selected for the Bonfires of San Juan, Alicante's main summer solstice festivity in June. She and the other Beauties play a key role in the celebration, which includes fireworks competitions and the burning of large artisan-made figures. It's remarkable how such a popular coastal tourist hotspot is still carrying on its old traditions. These lovely women and girls in resplendent costumes made of the finest fabrics look as if they have just stepped out of a painting by an old Spanish master, and they represent Alicante to me: lively, bright, attractive, with a complex history, and always with a bright smile.

WHERE TO STAY Hospes Amerigo

This five-star hotel housed in a former Salesian convent has been upgraded with elegant Mediterranean aesthetics. Set in the historical centre just a few steps from all the famous landmarks and the beach, Amerigo features a rooftop terrace with impressive views of the Santa Bárbara Castle. The onsite Bodyna Spa takes its name from 'body' and 'nature' and treats guests to revitalising wellness procedures and top-rated cosmetic products.

Hotel Les Monges

This charming boutique hotel is located in a signature modernist building from 1912 in Alicante's Old Town. Beautiful historical details, including tiles, ceramics, wooden elements, stone masonry, and ornate balconies, were preserved during the restoration of the building. The period styling contrasts with modern accents in the colour palette and furniture of the comfortable rooms. A visit to the rooftop terrace and bar with gorgeous views of Alicante is a must. Hotel Boutique Alicante S. XVII

This adults-only boutique hotel offers a tranquil refuge behind its thick 17th-century palace walls. Dimmed lighting in the lobby and only 17 rooms ensure a deeply personal ambience and home-like experience.

The spacious rooms feature rough stone



The unbeatable location and wide range of services makes the Kalev Spa 4-star spa hotel the ideal place for families, couples and business travellers alike!

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The hotel is in the immediate vicinity of the sights of the Old Town as well as shopping and business centres, with great transport links to the rest of the city.

Raised with a passion and love for her land, as well as a deep interest in the history and traditions of Alicante, Vidal is convinced that it's important to know as much as possible about your homeland and your roots in order to be able to enjoy them even more.

What's unique about Alicante?

One thing I really value about this city is the light. It's a light that embraces our coves and beaches with beautiful sunrises and illuminates our Old Town and streets. Also, the quality of services and the lifestyle we enjoy here is very high. Alicante is known for having 300 days of sunshine per year, and this makes the small city of just over 300,000 inhabitants the perfect place to enjoy the Mediterranean atmosphere all year round.

What does a perfect day in Alicante look like to you?

Take a walk around the port area, then have brunch in the sun at a café with sea views, such as Noray or Samoa. Take a tour of the Old Town, the Gravina Museum of Fine Arts (MUBAG), or the Alicante Museum of Contemporary Art (MACA). Then sip an aperitif on the terrace of Barrita Santa María right across from the majestic Basilica of Santa María. Definitely try their delightful croquettes or the *pepito* montadito, a mini sandwich with beef and foie gras. Say goodbye to the day on a rooftop, such as La Milagrosa or Terraza Mira Miralta. Watching the sunrise or sunset over the small fishing boats and yachts is also great.

What are the top restaurants for a real arroz alicantino?

The gastronomic offer in Alicante is very rich, and rice is the most typical dish throughout the whole province. But we eat rice for lunch, not dinner, due to the heaviness of the dish. My favourite places for this local meal are Rincón del Varadero in the port and Racó del Pla. Or Azul Restaurante, Casa Domingo, and Daksa on San Juan Beach.

What are some other local dishes one should try in Alicante?

You cannot leave without trying coca de mollitas or coca amb tonyina. The first one is a dough made of flour, olive

oil, and salt. The second one is a flour dough that's filled with tuna, onion, and pine nuts that people enjoy eating during the city festivals in June. Also try fideuà – a dish that's similar to arroz alicantino with seafood, but with thin noodles instead of rice.

And the top bars to hang out at?

Any terrace with views. Rooftops are now very fashionable. Watching the sunset with a cocktail in hand is a favourite local thing to do. I suggest the terraces at Mira Miralta, La Milagrosa, or Highbar.

What event in Alicante is not to be missed?

The Bonfires of San Juan, from June 20 to 24, is our quintessential celebration. During these days, the city is filled with various monuments and figures representing typical Alicante scenes, current affairs, or social issues. On the last day of the celebration, they're all burnt in the well-known event called the cremă.

What are your favourite beaches for relaxation?

The beaches of San Juan have kilometres of white sand and the best water for swimming. They also have many leisure activities and restaurants. But don't forget about the El Cabo coves, which are less crowded and very picturesque.

Can you suggest a day trip from Alicante?

In the province of Alicante, we have the sea as well as mountain landscapes. For the spring-summer season, I recommend one of our most recognised jewels, the beautiful coastal town of Altea. For autumn-winter, maybe visit some of the local wineries, such as Casa Sicilia in Novelda, which offers wine-tasting tours and has a restaurant specialising in traditional dishes from the region.



GUIDED BY THE LIGHT

A few years ago, light artist Christopher Bauder's exhibition *Dark Matter* was the number-one searched exhibition worldwide on *Google Maps*. Now he has surprised the world with another grand story in Berlin. In this conversation with *Baltic Outlook*, the celebrated artist reveals not only how he creates his work but also where to find the most beautiful light in the world.

An infinite universe from which brilliant stars rain down, where waves sway and water whispers, an arc that makes you want to spin, laugh, dance, be a child, dream, travel, meditate – that's <code>Vektor</code>, the new audiovisual installation by world-renowned light artist Christopher Bauder. <code>Vektor: Memories in Light & Sound</code> at Kraftwerk Berlin is not just a musical-visual extravaganza; it's an event where people come to experience emotions, to feel, and of course to enjoy the monumental aura. The industrial venue becomes a part of Bauder's performance, serving as a grand set and adding magical dimensions to this symphony of sound and light.

Bauder is often referred to as the Maestro of Light. Light is his love, his passion, his stage, his laboratory. An artist, designer, engineer, and composer all in one, he's now undoubtedly the most famous master of his genre in Germany and is recognised and respected worldwide for his large-scale installations and performances. Bauder's artistic tools – light, sound, space, objects – are quite unusual and complex, while his technical tools include a computer, software, winches, and motors. He understands these things thoroughly, conducts them expertly, and translates them into art, beauty, and a chemistry of wonderful sensations.

Bauder is an artist on a global scale. His first permanent exhibition, *Dark Matter*, opened in Berlin in 2021 in a specially equipped former factory building. It highlights seven of his best light installations from the past twenty years. The exhibition attracted more than 120,000 visitors in its first few months and in 2022 became the most-searched exhibition in the world on *Google Maps*. Late last year, Bauder enchanted audiences with a breathtaking light installation connecting the spires of skyscrapers in Riyadh, the capital of Saudi Arabia. It's no surprise that his shelves are lined with awards, from the German Lighting Design Award and the Design Award of the Federal Republic of Germany to Cannes Lions and the Red Dot Design Award.

I met Bauder shortly before the premiere of *Vektor*. His homey office fascinated with an endless view of the grey-blue waters of the Spree River and the boats dozing by the quay. The grey daylight entered the space unhindered through the large expanses of glass. The black-and-white surroundings suited this multifaceted artist very well. Although I felt a sense of 'premiere fever' in the air, there was no hint of hurry in our conversation. Bauder radiated an unexpected openness, depth, and sensitivity to every nuance.


This autumn will mark 35 years since the fall of the Berlin Wall. Ten years ago, you created the *Lichtgrenze* (Border of Lights) light-art installation to commemorate the 25th anniversary of that event. The 8000 white balloons that stretched for more than 15 kilometres along the former route of the wall became an important symbol in Berlin and served as a magnet attracting visitors to city. Of course, they also made you very recognisable. What was the idea behind the project?

Well, the idea was to create something big, something very big... The actual wall that divided the city was a heavy, bulky construction 42 kilometres long. I wanted to contrast it with something light and airy, so I chose balloons. I'm fascinated by working with them – balloons form

a large volume, they have properties of a solid, but they're essentially made of air. So we built a long wall of balloons to give an idea of how the barrier had once divided the city. Three days later, we released the balloons into the air, and the wall was dissolved.

The second idea was of light as an attracting force. Whether it's insects or people, light always attracts - if there's a fire somewhere, they approach it, they look, they check. Our installation didn't specifically address the history of the Berlin Wall, it just marked the place where it had stood and invited people to come. And they did [around two million people, according to estimates by official sources in Berlin - L. J.]. People shared their stories; those who had witnessed the actual wall talked with those who had never seen and experienced it in person. The installation served as a kind of catalyst for communication between people, and it worked great. But for me personally, the project gave me confidence that I was able to take on large-scale work. It took me to a new level of thinking and acceptance.



When I need to calm my mind, I think of the green fields of my childhood

In your new installation, *Vektor*, you've incorporated personal memories, such as memories of your childhood and of music clubs. In art, how does one speak about one's emotions in a way that's also interesting for the viewer? I come from the countryside in southern Germany. When I need to calm my mind, I think of the green fields of my childhood, sunsets, the forest, being on the lake, the water lapping up against the boat, the waves... On the one hand, my memories of my childhood and that time are sweet and melancholic. But that time has passed, and therefore today it also contains the painful. When I return to that place today, I don't feel the same as I did back then. I'm a different person.

Through the very abstract sketches in my show made with laser lights, music, and movement, I try to recreate some of the memories I shelter in my mind. This certainly doesn't mean that audiences have to feel, understand, or see what I'm referring to. But by giving them these small impulses, I want to activate the 'processor' in viewers – the picture-and-memory machine in our brain – so that people can create their own illustrations, feelings, and emotions.

You've done something else new for this installation, a surprise – you composed the music for it yourself. Was that successful? You tell me [laughs heartily]! It's not just music; it's sound design, the illustration of visual texture. I've previously worked with composers: Robert Henke, who is also known as Monolake [a German electronic music project originally consisting of Gerhard Behles and Robert Henke – L. J.], Kangding Ray [a French-born, Berlin-based electronic music producer – L. J.], and others. These guys are famous, great music producers, but this time I wanted more control; I wanted to use audio patterns that were in tune with my own childhood. I also wanted to see if I could make my own music. I'm a techno kid who came of age in the techno clubs of 1990s Berlin. That's my music, so I tried to incorporate a little bit of that into the show.

You've also chosen a special place for the installation – the grandiose Kraftwerk Berlin, a former power station in the Mitte district. It looks like you've really fallen in love with it. I grew up in a very religious environment, attending church and ceremonies. I liked it a lot as a child. The visual impact of a church's interior, its monumental size and scale, has always inspired me. It doesn't matter if you believe or not, but a church always leaves an impression. When they enter a cathedral, people become quiet, serene.

Kraftwerk Berlin evokes this same feeling in me. For me, it's an industrial cathedral. It has the structure of a traditional church, with a central section and slightly lower side aisles separated from the 'nave' by columns. It's so big that one loses one's sense of proportion, and it's impossible to gauge how high the ceiling is -20, or maybe 40 metres. It's also completely dark inside, which is very necessary for my art, but at the same time it's not





a black box. I don't like traditional exhibition spaces, I don't like white or black boxes and cubes where the art itself is isolated from the surrounding environment. I love Kraftwerk because it has so much character in it. Here, if you switch on just one light bulb, it reflects throughout the whole space, creating fascinating shadows and illuminating the many layers and patterns.

I was surprised to discover that you and your company, *Kinetic Lights*, were recently involved in the production of the spectacular *ABBA Voyage* show.

The creators approached us because they had seen my large-scale art installation titled *Skalar*. For the ABBA show, we did the kinetic lighting – everything that moves. It involved a huge amount of technology; we made machines, motors, lights, and much more. Yes, I work not only as an artist, but I also develop technology for my art. You can't buy this stuff in a store, so we make it, and then later we might sell it or rent it out to other show creators.

So deep down, what are you – an artist or an engineer? I'm an artist, but I'm an artist in everything, starting from the work of art to the invention of the necessary machines. But I'm

also a manager. In my projects, 1% of my work is creative and the other 99% is management – sitting in front of the computer, managing people, organising something. I think every artist needs to be a manager. My art depends immensely on the team, and it's a huge team that makes all of this happen for us. In that sense, I'm more like a film director who holds all the strings of a project.

What's your greatest talent?

I usually say that I have only two talents: one is endless ideas, and the other is good taste. So I can determine what's good and what's not good in my work. I'm not the type of artist who immediately creates the perfect end result or the perfect story. I work intuitively – I create, I look, I analyse, I see what's there and what's not there, and then I improve.

How long does it take you to get a feel for what you want to change?

Well, for example, I listen to music again a week later and then I understand what I want to change. In the creative process, it's very important to zoom out and distance yourself a bit.

Your installations and performances have been shown in prominent art spaces and at festivals around the world. Is that why you call yourself a traveller on social media? I travel at least 100 days, sometimes up to 150 days a year – all over the world, and mostly for work. I don't like leisure travel. I like to travel and do work at the same time, to see how people live, how they work. Not only when I do shows, but also when I'm invited to give lectures or speak at conferences, the organisers always give me an insight into the country, the environment, the city, the people. I love experiencing the planet in this way; it's really exciting and interesting.

I've worked in more than 60 countries – from Greenland to Africa, the United States, and Asia – so yes, I do consider myself a traveller. I like to say that you can place me anywhere on the globe and I won't feel like a stranger. Even if I don't understand the language, the culture, or the signs, I'll still feel at home and can adapt very quickly.

Have you thought about your mission, or the message you bring to people?

I feel like a cultural messenger, because my art is for everyone. It can't be collected or bought as an object; it's more for people to experience it – for everybody. At best, I encourage people to open their minds and think differently, or to start travelling, or to get to know my country.

I live in a very free country and I can do whatever I like at any time, but there are many countries where that's not the case. When I go there and show my art, I can inspire people. I also feel like a traveller in the sense that it's important to me to be constantly travelling in my mind, learning new things, not getting stuck, always evolving and mastering new skills.

Where in the world have you found the most beautiful light? Everywhere [*smiles*]. I see it everywhere... Even in the dark you can see the most beautiful light. Even an ugly



city, for example, may have fantastic neon lights. All sunsets in the desert and in the mountains are beautiful! I also love the forest during a summer sunset, and in the winter when the sun reflects off the snow... I see wonderful variations of light everywhere, even in a city wrapped in smog or in a sun shrouded by a sandstorm.

It's also beautiful how people light their homes and how they use open fires. I remember a boat trip on the Brahmaputra River in India. The river was very heavily polluted, with impenetrable smog filling the air, but it made for one of the most beautiful sunsets I've ever seen. So yes, sometimes the two go hand in hand: one of the most beautiful sights in nature, together with environmental pollution and the harm done to nature. It makes you wonder why things are the way they are, and what it would be like if the sky were clear... Both artificial and natural light have many facets and variations, I love them all.

Is Berlin your city? What makes you feel at home here? Definitely. I think I've lived in Berlin for 27 years now, and it's definitely my city. I've lived in other places, too: for a while in Chicago, in Shanghai, on an island in Germany, and in the countryside. When I was younger, I wanted to move to a place like New York City, but not anymore, because Berlin is

the perfect place to be. It has everything: a wealth of culture, people from all over the world, all possible freedoms. Any day of the week, almost any hour of the day, you can go to parties, watch films, theatre, go dancing, learn something new. And all of this is surrounded by fantastic nature. I really appreciate Berlin as a home base from which to develop, from which to head out and explore the world and then return to afterwards.

When I arrived in Berlin, the city was growing, the wall had just been torn down, and there were endless empty spaces. Those spaces are still here. Without spending too much money, artists can find suitable spaces to show their work. Berlin's growth and development, including club culture and the constantly changing art scene, also contributed to my own development as an artist and person. Berlin is a good 'engine' to keep a person active. And it's a perfect city for living – it's got great summers and grey winters...like today. I really appreciate the change of seasons, and I like winter, because then I can sit in the studio and create.


What art projects can we expect from you in the future? I'm an artist who likes to change. I don't want to do the same thing all the time, so with the next installation I want to go further, I want to evolve, to change radically. *Vektor* is a kind of middle step in relation to all the installations I did before. I love making big installations, making things that I don't have full control over anymore, things on a superhuman scale

that look down on me from on high - like, see how that small,

insignificant man can make such big things!

I'd like to do a bigger show, but I don't know what could be bigger than an installation on the scale of a whole city, because I've already done that... [laughs] I'll definitely push the technology further, work on 3D shows, and keep making music. I've got a concept in place for the coming years, but I'm still not ready to reveal it. **bo**




WHAT'S NEW IN BERLIN?

Change without tearing down, change for a new function and meaningful continuation – this mantra has guided Berlin's development for more than 50 years and has allowed it to grow into an influential citadel of a certain lifestyle. This guide takes you through the amazing selection of modern attractions on offer for your holiday in Berlin.

Berlin is a city in a constant state of flux. The building sites that have become a permanent part of the urban landscape change the faces of its neighbourhoods, sometimes slowly, sometimes instantly. The areas are coloured by contemporary architectural projects, new shopping and living habits, the dynamic rhythm of the locals, and the spirit of an energetic, multicultural, and free city. Over the past few decades, Berlin has become a destination for young people, creative minds, brilliant artists, musicians, designers, photographers, and technology fans who come here to experiment, explore, create, and see how viable their career choice will be. We've rounded up some of the current hot spots to feel the new rhythm of this vibrant and colourful metropolis.









NEW CULTURAL STOPS

Prestigious museums, art galleries, concert halls – Berlin's vibrant cultural life takes place on a stage shaped by architectural grandeur. Take, for example, the Neue Nationalgalerie, one of Europe's greatest architectural icons. Designed in glass and steel by the great master Mies van der Rohe, this modernist jewel reopened to visitors in 2021 after a challenging renovation planned by awardwinning architect David Chipperfield. Even if you don't have time to see the magnificent exhibitions at this museum for modern art, it's worth a stroll around the building to admire the play of light reflecting in its masterly glass volumes. It's just as beautiful and atmospheric on a sun-drenched day as it is on a rainy one.

Could the new winds of change have passed by Berlin's historical heart? Of course not! The much-praised Museumsinsel Berlin has also recently been expanded by influential newcomers. The grandiose Humboldt Forum, now lighting up the Spree waterfront with its combination of historical Baroque style and white monolithic concrete, opened in 2021 after overcoming a series of controversies and construction delays. The vast cultural, artistic, and scientific project designed by Italian architect Franco Stella houses the Ethnological Museum, the Museum of Asian Art, large-scale art objects, and a variety of exhibition spaces with interactive expositions, while the vast roof terrace offers a magical panorama of the city.

Meanwhile, the majestic James-Simon-Galerie opened in 2019 and is dedicated to one of the city's greatest patrons of the arts. Simon bequeathed his valuable art collections to Berlin's State Museums

in the early 20th century. Also designed by David Chipperfield, the site, which includes modern cultural spaces, cafés, and shops, appeals to design aesthetes with its sweeping white flight of stairs and grand colonnade.

Nearby, the Pierre Boulez Saal, which opened a few years ago, offers a refined selection of music. It's located in the Barenboim-Said Akademie and is named in honour of the great French composer, conductor, and music theorist. The elliptical shape of the acoustic concert hall designed by starchitect Frank Gehry ensures a feeling of physical and emotional closeness between artists and listeners.

A huge number of older industrial edifices in Berlin have also undergone major renovations in recent years to be reborn as cultural centres. For example, the Art Deco-style former *Kindl* brewery has been transformed into the grand Kindl Centre for Contemporary Art. No longer producing beer, the 1600+ square metres of exhibition space now delight visitors with international exhibitions and installations, and *Café Babette* serves visitors coffee next to the antique fermenting vats.

Kraftwerk Berlin is another industrial gem one shouldn't pass up. The turbines of this former cogeneration plant in the heart of the Mitte district once powered almost half the city. Although they're no longer in operation, the building still hums with life; contemporary art shows alternate with music nights, opera performances, and many other exciting events. From February to April, Kraftwerk is hosting the world premiere of *Vektor*, a large-scale light installation by notable interdisciplinary artist Christopher Bauder.





CAPITAL OF PHOTOGRAPHY AND CINEMA

The Helmut Newton Foundation, the Museum of Photography, C/O Berlin, Camera Work Gallery, Photo Edition Berlin, Willy-Brandt-Haus, F³-Freiraum für Fotografie, Fotogalerie Friedrichshain... In Berlin, good art photography has always been held in high regard. This is also reflected in the recent opening of the fifth branch (along with Stockholm, New York City, Tallinn, and Shanghai) of the renowned Fotografiska photography museum in the former Kunsthaus Tacheles. The building is an important cultural site, saved from demolition in 1990

by an artists' initiative and known as an epicentre of counterculture. With its magical and very delicate – touch, the renowned *Herzog & de Meuron* architectural firm has now prepared the building for a new life and function.

In the heart of Mitte, another cultural institution devoted to photography, the Chaussee 36 Photo Foundation, invites creative enthusiasts of photography for a visit. Here, they can enjoy shows by well-known photographers in an informal, typically Berlinlike atmosphere. The former Prussian officer's home restored according to the the principles of sustainability also hosts photography-related discussions, meetings, and photo shoots.

And beyond photography? How about a trip back to the heyday of movie theatres! The *Astor Film Lounge* on Kurfürstendamm still has the soul of a good old luxury cinema. Settling into its comfortable leather armchairs with ample legroom and enjoying the excellent sound and picture quality as well as a glass of wine, snacks, or a cup of coffee brought to your seat will only improve an already great film or live broadcast from the Royal Opera House.

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DESIGN AND SHOPPING

Berlin's past cannot be imagined without the Bauhaus school of architecture and design. And neither can the future. Bauhaus was born over 100 years ago as a progressive multidisciplinary movement, and today its design objects have become cult items. While the Bauhaus-Archiv / Museum für Gestaltung on Klingelhöferstraße is being built and renovated, do stop by the colourful temporary Bauhaus-Archiv shop on Knesebeckstraße for a look. There you can browse the archives of the extensive Bauhaus collection and purchase something stylish yet highly functional, from an eraser or birdhouse to a chair.

Berlin is a grand metropolis of shopping. It does not have a single central pedestrianised shopping area like other German cities, but instead a series of fashion and shopping streets and districts that vie for the honour of being the best on the local scene. To discover some



creative and innovative ideas, take a stroll to the Mitte district, which is dotted with unique, small fashion shops. Between the two most influential shopping boulevards, Kurfürstendamm and Friedrichstraße and their adjacent side streets, many today seem to lean in the direction of the former - that iconic, time-honoured, 3.5-kilometre-long West Berlin fashion promenade Berliners call Ku'damm. Home to the biggest global retail chains, here you'll also find almost every luxury brand in the world wrapped up in an ornate boutique, with Tiffany & Co. being this year's most vivid newcomer.

But checking out Ku'damm is really only just the beginning. Turn the corner and you're at Tauentzienstraße and Kaufhaus des Westens (KaDeWe), Europe's largest, most famous department store, which has only increased in its reputation as a symbol of luxury shopping since opening in 1907. KaDeWe has just undergone a major renovation under the direction of architect Rem Koolhaas and his OMA studio. Alongside the shopping fun, the striking composition of intersecting escalators clad in walnut wood has become the most photographed attraction of the renovated giant.







And of course, Berlin has its own modern beer! Recently, four young people set up the Brlo Brwhouse brewery at Gleisdreieck, which Graft Architects managed to house in 38 specially converted used shipping containers, while also opening a gastronomic beer garden next to it. Today, Brlo's beer and meals made of local produce can be enjoyed in the *KaDeWe* gastronomy zone, the spacious Brlo Charlottenburg restaurant with terrace on Meyerinckplatz, and elsewhere. A note for those curious about the brand's name: Brlo is supposedly the old Slavic name for Berlin.

If asked to choose the most appropriate dessert for Berlin's chilly weather, most people would probably vote for cheesecake. Princess Cheesecake offers beautiful meltin-your-mouth cakes made from natural, sustainably sourced, certified local ingredients at two cafés in the Mitte and Charlottenburg districts. For good reason, Berliners call it a cheesecake paradise.

And when you want to experience more than just a nice dinner and comfortable accommodation in the city, the boutique Hotel Oderberger Berlin in Prenzlauer Berg, which enjoys the status of being an architectural monument, is the place to go. Built in 1902, the historical baths and buildings opened to the public as a hotel complex in 2016 after an extensive renovation. Alongside cosy accommodation with a restaurant and fireplace bar, the iconic indoor swimming pool offers a unique experience. Here you can enjoy a relaxing dip in the water or even order an exclusive midnight swim under special atmospheric lights. **bo**

A TASTE OF BERLIN

It's often said that Berlin's gastronomic scene is comparable in diversity to the multicultural food scene of 1980s New York City. Today, it's in Berlin that one can delight in all the aromas and flavours of the world, with cuisines of all levels and kinds and trends. So it's actually no surprise that the vegan and vegetarian trend has won the heart of the iconic British architect David Chipperfield, who some time ago established the Chipperfield Kantine bistro in the cosy courtyard of his Mitte office. It specialises in new vegetable-based creations as well as great coffee.

The waiting list for a meal at the *Frea* restaurant, also in Mitte, is likewise not short. Many are eager to enjoy the seasonal menu and organic wines of this, the world's first vegan zero-waste restaurant. Owners David and Jasmin Suchy take pride in having earned a Michelin star, running their own bakery, and...using a composting machine to recycle food leftovers.

Jigi Poke, for its part, has found a niche for itself by serving original poke bowls and experimenting with the diversity of contemporary cuisine. At this restaurant, also pay attention to the interior design by Vaust Studio, which highlights the basic elements of nature and invites guests to discover the philosophy of balance and slow living.

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WHERE THE LOCALS GO INSIDER TIPS FOR A FAMILY HOLIDAY TO REMEMBER

We asked families in four of Europe's favourite family travel destinations to let us in on their secrets and share some locals-only knowledge so you can have your best holiday yet.

Some of the biggest travel trends for 2024 have centred around a desire to give back to local communities and to travel more sustainably. That goes for family travel, too. Finding ways to explore local culture and lifestyles can open up new experiences, food choices that you won't find in the buffet of an all-inclusive resort, and exciting places to play.

We got together with local parents in four of *airBaltic's* most popular family travel destinations to find out what they recommend. From local playgrounds to local food, great excursions and must-do attractions, we've asked them what's overrated, what's underrated, and what not to miss. Let's get beyond the brochures and find out what it's really like there!

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BILLUND, DENMARK: The Town That Lego Built

Billund is in the heart of Jutland, West Denmark, and it's hard to imagine a more family-friendly spot for a holiday. It's known worldwide as the home of *LEGO*, with a legacy you can explore all over *Legoland* Billund Resort. This group of family-focused attractions includes the original *Legoland* theme park, *LEGO* House (an interactive and beautifully-designed museum where you can play with *LEGO* all day), Givskud Zoo, the Lalandia water park, and Wow Park (a treetop playground ideal for fun in the fresh air). The town also has a wide range of family-friendly accommodation options, from chalets and summer houses to the magical *Legoland Hotel*.

But Billund isn't just for holiday makers and *LEGO* fans. The town prides itself on prioritising play in all forms, for its residents as well as its visitors. Billund Municipality has designated itself as the Capital of Children and seeks to become the best town in the world to be a child.







Billund

We caught up with Thomas Bruhn, who lives near Billund, to find out what he and his family love about living in the shadow of the world's most famous bricks.

What's your favourite of the big Legoland Billund Resort attractions, and why? Legoland, because of the diversity of the park. You can have fun on big and thrilling rides, you can go to Miniland to explore all the amazing things that can be built from LEGO bricks and pieces, and finally you can immerse yourself in all the building experiences inside the park.

Do you have any advice for parents travelling to Billund? Give yourselves enough time! There's so much to do in this area. You can also visit a farm, go to a climbing park, or walk on top of a bridge. To get the best out of it, you need at least four to six days.

Also, check the opening hours of the attractions, because the times can vary greatly, and some attractions are even closed outside peak season. Booking online will

save you some money at most of the attractions, compared to buying your tickets at the gate.

Can you share a great food recommendation for families in the area?

Mini Chef in LEGO House. It's a unique restaurant where you build your meal from a set of bricks and order it with the LEGO minifigures. They prepare the food in the kitchen, and then two big robots serve it. It's a truly unique and amazing experience that children will love!

Do you have a favourite park, beach, or playground?
Madsbyparken in Fredericia, about 50 minutes from Billund, is a hidden gem.
There's a lot to do there, including playgrounds, a lake, and a moon-car track, plus animals and a train to a miniature city.





We hooked up with local parent and family travel expert Bianca Caccamese, the founder and creative director of *Kids Trip* (kidstrip.it), to find out about how to make the best of a family holiday in the area. As an author of family travel guides to the region, she knows her stuff.

What's your favourite thing to do as a family in Catania? We love to take a walk from our home in the city centre to San Giovanni Li Cuti, a small neighbourhood near the sea. It has a small beach with black sand and rocks formed by lava. We also love to go trekking and have picnics on Mount Etna. There are lots of walking trails into the woods and stunning views of the volcano to enjoy.

In Catania, I suggest taking a walk along Via Etnea. Make your starting point Piazza del Duomo, where there's a fountain with an elephant statue (the symbol of the city), and continue to Villa Bellini, the city's largest garden. Can you share a great food recommendation for families?

Near Piazza del Duomo is an excellent ice cream shop, *Don Peppinu*, which is a must-try. You should also try the typical local *cannolo* and the king of Sicilian street food, the *arancino*, which is a small tasty snack made of rice and ragù.

Do you have a favourite park or playground? My sons love treetop adventure parks. You can find some of them on Mount Etna.



CATANIA, SICILY, ITALY: SUNSHINE, BEACHES, AND ARANCINI

On Sicily's eastern coast, the port city of Catania sits at the foot of Mount Etna and promises all the classic family travel experiences: ice creams on a sandy beach, sunshine, historical buildings, and wonderful food. When you need a break from lazy beach days, explore the narrow alleyways, marvel at the colours, sounds, and flavours of the city's famous fish market, and be charmed and delighted by ancient puppet workshops. For those with older children, a hike to one of the active craters on Mount Etna is a must: the volcano is not only a UNESCO World Heritage Site but also one of the most active volcanoes in the world.

Beyond the city, the hillsides and small towns a short drive from Catania are home to plenty of *agroturismo*, local farmhouses that offer eco-friendly holiday stays where you can enjoy life at a slower pace and introduce the kids to free-range chickens, donkeys, and more. Many farm stays also have pools and plenty of grounds to roam, which is useful for when the kids need to blow off steam and use up some energy.







THE SUNNY. CHILD-SIZED CITY

Malta's capital is renowned for its 300 days of sun a year, its diving scene, its historical centre, and its small size. With a population of just under 6500 people and an area of just 0.61 square kilometres, it's Europe's smallest capital city and is veritably child-sized. But that's not the only thing that's child-friendly about Valletta. It's also close to strings of fishing villages and a short drive from sandy beaches, with child-friendly diving options (for ages ten and up) and plenty of water-based fun on offer nearby, including boat trips to the famous Blue Grotto and a range of popular water parks and playgrounds.

All these things are great for younger kids – nothing beats days filled with ice cream, beaches, a warm sea to dip your toes in, and afternoon siestas – but they're also great for those of school age and above, not to mention their parents. Imagine sipping coffee at a pavement café without a care in the world as your older children explore the city on their own with a few euros in their pockets to spend on souvenirs and snacks. Because the city is largely pedestrianised, it's a safe place for teens and tweens flying solo. If you're the kind of parent who likes to add a little history and culture to your family trip, there's also plenty to sate your appetite and keep the kids entertained, from underground catacombs to fortresses and tunnels used for shelter during the Second World War.





We caught up with local mum Evie Macklin to find out what she and her young family love about living on the sunny island of Malta.

Where would we find you on a sunny day, and why? In the morning, you're likely to find my daughter and me at the beach in Marsaskala at the

southern end of Malta. There's a small sandy spot where we love spending our time.

For parents travelling to Malta with small children. I recommend booking a hotel close to a sandy beach, because most of the beaches in Malta are rocky and not very safe for little ones. And choose the time of the year you're travelling to Malta carefully: in July and August, temperatures can rise as high as 45°C, which makes it very difficult to be outside.

Can you share a great food recommendation for families?

Yes, a couple: Malta is great for Mediterranean food, and my little one loves calamari and gelato. There are a lot of great places to find them in Malta; our favourite is Rivareno Gelato. The quality is amazing, and the choice of flavours is great.

Do you have a favourite park or playground?

We like to play at Sant'Antnin Family Park, which is close to our house. It's suitable for all ages, very green, and even has a small zoo. My daughter



We asked local expert Alenka Klun, who lives with her family in the busy Šiška district, to share her favourite spaces and recommendations for a family stay in Ljubljana.

What's your favourite tourist attraction in the city?

Probably the castle and the hill surrounding it, because my kids are fascinated by knights and armour. It's especially fun to visit during the annual medieval themed days. A fun way of getting up to the castle is by funicular railway - before that, you can have a coffee at the popular *Čokl* café on Krekov trg (Krek Square) and watch the folk tale hero Martin Krpan appear from the wooden clock at the Puppet Theatre

each hour. Whatever you decide to do, my advice is to bring comfortable shoes and go with the flow - the entire city

centre is easily walkable! Boat tours are also a nice way to relax and enjoy the Ljubljana Riverside. You should also know that grocery shops are closed on Sundays, so be sure to stock up on diapers and snacks before then.

Do you have a favourite park or playground?

Definitely Tivoli. It has a large, recently renovated playground next to the greenhouse, the boathouse café, and the fish pond. While the kids are busy climbing and ziplining, parents can enjoy the Ljubljana skyline, with the castle hill and the Ravnikar towers on Republic Square. The view is especially Instagrammable during cherry-blossom season.

Where do you love to eat as a family?

We're big pizza lovers, and there are many nice pizza places around the city, such as Piccola on Gornji trg in the Old Town or *Trappa* in the Vič neighbourhood. Our children are also very much into ice cream, and vou can find many interesting flavours of Italian-style goodness at the Romantika gelato shops our favourite is located right across from the secondhand book shop called Cunjak on Stari trg.



Ljubljana is an easy place for a family-focused city break, and you certainly won't be bored. Stroll the cobbled pedestrianised centre of the Slovenian capital, visit the 900-year-old castle for views, spine-chilling dungeons, and a puppet museum, and explore the city from the water via a range of activities from boat tours to SUP trips.

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The Museum of Illusions offers interactive, hands-on visual displays, and there's also a trampoline park, water park, and plenty of other museums. Tivoli Park, Ljubljana's largest green space, is the jewel in the city's crown. It's a prime picnicking spot on sunny days and ideal for families, with playgrounds and parkland to enjoy at your leisure.






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WELCOME TO THE JAZZKAAR'S GRAND BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION!



While the history of jazz festivals in Estonia dates back to 1949, the events were banned by the Communist Party following the Tallinn-67 International Jazz Festival. It wasn't until 1990, or 23 years later, that Jazzkaar revived the tradition. Over the years since then, the festival has welcomed musicians from nearly 60 countries who represent jazz and other closely, as well as more distantly, related music styles. Jazzkaar in Tallinn has hosted numerous jazz luminaries, including Pat Metheny, Bobby McFerrin, Chick Corea, Gregory Porter, Angie Stone, and many others. This year's anniversary festival boasts a diverse programme featuring contemporary jazz, blues, world music, electronic sounds, and club rhythms. The vibrant springtime jazz celebration unfolds in Telliskivi Creative City in Tallinn, with performances also reaching Tartu, Pärnu, and Viljandi. We extend a warm welcome to all festival guests, whether local or from afar!



On the festival's opening day, Sunday, April 20, enjoy free concerts during the day, followed by the evening's opening concert at Jaik Hall, where Estonian and Finnish musicians will showcase *Moral Paradox*, a new composition by Bianca Rantala, a young composer and performer who won the hearts of the Estonian audience last year. As the title suggests, there is currently a sense of ethical unease in the world, which is also a concern shared by the musicians.

Gracing the stage at Alexela Concert Hall, the headliner of this year's anniversary festival is Snarky Puppy, the Grammy-winning American supergroup much adored by jazz aficionados. Representing the pinnacle of American jazz is legendary bassist, composer, and pillar of the jazz community Christian McBride with his dynamic new quintet, delivering music that is passionate, energetic, and infused with funk. Concert-goers can also revel in the mesmerising performances of trumpet virtuoso Theo Croker, who blends jazz, R&B, hip-hop, and electronica in his unique music, as well as enchanting Grammy-winning actress and singer Ledisi as she honours the legendary Nina Simone with a special musical programme.

Estonia is represented at the anniversary festival by musicians who have already made a name for themselves on European jazz stages. Singersongwriter Kadri Voorand, who leads the Estonian Voices vocal ensemble, is frequently seen performing both at home and abroad. Saxophonist and composer Maria Faust, for her part, frequently appears with larger international ensembles but also as a soloist; a recent documentary film offering insight into Faust's creative world has garnered international acclaim. Bassist Mingo Rajandi's innovative, genreblending compositions for theatre productions and her own ensembles promise endless discovery.

For 18 years now the Jazzkaar festival and Jazz Estonia have honoured the best musicians of the year, and all of the above-mentioned artists have won titles in multiple categories. Last year's Jazz Musician of the Year, bassist Janno Trump, presents brand-new music with his funk ensemble JT Conception and the outstanding Danish harmonica virtuoso Mathias Heise. Another talented bassist and multi-award winner, Peedu Kass, brings fresh compositions to the festival with his new line-up. Jazz enthusiasts can also look forward to programmes showcasing the latest trends in jazz by young musicians such as Bianca Rantala, Reti Niimann, M-Group, Project Pennar, and more.

The festival's diverse representation of European jazz deserves special attention. The Jazzkaar team frequently visits the North Sea Jazz Festival in Rotterdam, Europe's largest jazz festival, for fresh inspiration. For example, the excitement last summer surrounding French pianist and composer Eve Risser's Red Desert Orchestra (a blend of European and African music) has led to the ensemble now being invited to Estonia.

The Jazzkaar team discovered the sharp-witted French saxophone-clarinet duo NoSax NoClar at another prominent European jazz event, the Jazzahead! fair in Bremen, while at the cosy Willisau Music Festival they were enchanted by Swiss violinist Tobias Preisig, who seamlessly blends jazz, classical, and electronic music. Also fascinating is the Schaerer/Kalima/Mayer trio, which features members from three different countries and released its latest album, Evolution, under the ACT label. The success story of Dutch pianist Joep Beving is equally remarkable. After abandoning his piano studies due to a hand injury, he worked for various advertising agencies and composed music for films. Then, encouraged by friends, he recorded his first solo album at home, and today his imaginative soundscapes have been streamed hundreds of millions of times across various platforms.

Jazzkaar warmly welcomes young vocalists Maro from Portugal and Dora Morelenbaum from Brazil, who infuse a world-music vibe into a pop-inspired setting. Always eagerly awaited are Jazzkaar's late-night party sessions. This time, bassist-vocalist MonoNeon (a.k.a. Dywane Thomas Jr.) from the United States takes the stage with his band. He became known for his stint as the last bass guitarist in Prince's band. Jazzkaar is honouring its own roots by harking back to the early years of the festival, when blues held a prominent place at the








event. Bringing Saturday night to a perfect close, the festival programme features an uplifting Blues Parade led by vocalist Kaisa Ling.

WHY ARE NOMADS FALLING IN LOVE WITH ESTONIA?

Estonia, the Baltic gem in northern Europe that has four times more startups per capita than the European average, is fast becoming a hub for digital nomads.

With its innovative tech scene, thriving culture, and natural beauty, this small country offers a unique blend of work and lifestyle that's perfect for digital nomads. Sara Magnabosco, who is a digital nomad herself and COO of the *Hacker Paradise* global community, spent an entire month in Estonia at the Hektor Container Hotel, a novel hotel and coworking space. Along with 22 other digital nomads from nine countries, they divided their days between remote work, socialising, and getting to know Tallinn.

Located in the bohemian Telliskivi area near Tallinn's Old Town, the hotel offers all the amenities that nomads need. As Magnabosco mentions, fast Wi-Fi is one of the key aspects when digital nomads like herself choose their next destinations, but other factors are at play as well: a lively cultural scene, safety, and even perks like having a gym nearby. She believes Tallinn, and Hektor Container Hotel, have it all.

'Hektor really was the best possible location for us! I was blown away, because I'd never seen anything like it - it's super innovative and has this sustainable approach,' Magnabosco says. 'It's the best all-in-one solution, with housing and working space

Hektor Container Hotel was established in 2020 as the only container hotel in the Baltics offering exclusive accommodation for short and long stays in Tallinn. The hotel holds a solid sustainable and innovative aspect through the service you receive as a guest.

Hacker Paradise was created in 2014 by a coder and an entrepreneur who wanted to build cool tech with likeminded people while living somewhere extraordinary. From their first location in Costa Rica, they hosted beach hackathons, grew the business, and built a small community. These original trips gave birth to the world's very first remote work and travel community.

Estonia is one of the first countries in the world to create a digital nomad visa. The Estonian digital nomad visa allows people to come to Estonia and stay in the country as tourists while continuing to work for a foreign employer or as freelancers, independent of location. *Big 7 Travel* named Tallinn one of the best remote-work destinations in the world (2021).

in the same place, plus a great location in the city. We loved this co-working place that has super comfortable rooms and even yoga classes.'

It might be difficult to find other nomads and expats while abroad, especially if one is abroad for a shorter period of time. But staying at a place like *Hektor* or joining a coworking space helps one find like-minded people. Compared with more popular locations such as Bali and Thailand, Estonia doesn't have a big digital nomad community yet, but initiatives like Hacker Paradise are helping to change that and bring the small nation to more people's minds.

As one of the attractions, Magnabosco also highlights Estonia's forward-mindedness regarding all things digital. Estonia has a well-established e-residency programme that allows digital nomads to establish and manage a location-independent business online, which is especially useful for those who travel frequently and don't have a fixed base of operations. Magnabosco says that, during her stay at Hektor, she also learned about digital nomad visas, startup and scale-up visas, Visit Estonia, and several other initiatives and programmes that facilitate and support global talent and mobility. As a result, three Hacker Paradise participants enrolled to become e-residents.

In total, the Hacker Paradise community has more than 1400 members who regularly travel the world and enjoy the lifestyle of not being tied to one place. Such a lifestyle naturally comes with drawbacks, such as missing family events and milestones in friends' lives. But Magnabosco highlights that nowadays it's becoming more normal and popular to travel the world together with one's children, and that the Hacker Paradise community has members from every age group.

'Estonia is notably safe, making it an attractive destination compared to places like Cape Town, for example,' Magnabosco says. 'The country also offers everything you need - cafés, museums, good transport connections, and more - all in one spot. It's very safe, which not every country can offer along with reliable internet.'

Estonia might not be the first country to come to mind when one thinks of digital nomadism, but as the experiences of Magnabosco and her group of digital nomads show, it's an undiscovered gem that more and more people are starting to appreciate. Whether you're a lifelong nomad or just considering a new lifestyle, Estonia has something to offer you.







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ON CARRYING CASH AND GOODS ACROSS LATVIA'S **BORDERS**

Stay up to date with the latest regulations on transporting large amounts of cash across borders, and ask for legal advice if necessary.





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Latvia is a member state of the European Union and is therefore bound by EU legislation, including directives and regulations adopted in the area of combating and preventing money laundering. For example, in the fight against the movement of cash proceeds of crime, Regulation 2018/1672 of the European Parliament and Council of October 23, 2018, provides for a system of controls regarding cash entering or leaving the European Union.

As one of the mechanisms of the cash control system, Regulation 2018/1672 includes a requirement for the declaration of cash. More specifically, if a natural person crosses the external border of the European Union (whether entering or leaving the European Union) carrying cash in the value of EUR 10,000 or more (converted into any currency), the person must declare that cash.

It is important to note that, for the purposes of Regulation 2018/1672, 'cash' means not only currency but also goods used as a high-liquidity store of value (such as gold coins, bars, etc.), bearer negotiable instruments, and prepaid cards.

When travelling between EU countries, cash can be carried in and out without restrictions. However, it should be borne in mind that, even when transporting cash within the EU, situations may arise in which the origin of the cash needs to be substantiated. In particular, cash may be checked at an internal border of the European Union, and if an official asks for a declaration of cash, anyone carrying cash in an amount of EUR 10,000 or more is required to declare it.

At the same time, if, when carrying out cash checks at a border on people travelling within the ${\rm EU}$ and crossing its borders, the competent authorities and officials suspect that a person may be carrying out illegal activities, they are entitled to ask the person to also declare cash in amounts less than EUR 10,000.

In the event of non-compliance with the obligation to declare, or where there is a suspicion that the cash has been criminally obtained, customs officials have the right to seize

The law 'On the Declaration of Cash at the State Border' defines the competence of Latvia related to the control of cash entering or leaving the European Union at the state

border, as well as the competence of Latvia related to the control of cash at the internal state border.

In order to clarify issues related to the carrying of cash during a trip, a person has the right to turn to the State Revenue Service of Latvia, which is the competent Latvian customs authority. However, if a person is already in a situation in which the cash he or she is carrying has been seized at the border by customs officials, he or she may benefit from the advice of a solicitor.

If you purchase goods while travelling in a non-EU country and bring them back in your personal luggage by air into a member state of the European Union, including Latvia, you should note that in some cases the imported goods may be subject to taxation. Specifically, goods imported by a natural person (aged 16 or over) for his or her personal use or for gifts to his or her family are not taxable if the total value of the goods does not exceed EUR 430 per person. Similarly, goods imported by a child (up to the age of 15) for his or her own or his or her family's personal use or as gifts are not taxable if the total value of the goods does not exceed EUR 285 per person. To prove the value of the imported goods, it is necessary to keep any documents certifying the purchase of the goods abroad.




Āgenskalns has it all: authentic wooden houses, Māras Pond, the freshly renovated Āgenskalns Market, and convenient public transportation to the city centre.

ENERGY PARKS CREATED IN THE BALTICS BY EVECON AND WISO

Evecon, which is the leading developer of energy parks in the Baltic states, and WiSo Engineering, a renewable energy construction company, create competitively priced turnkey solutions for energy parks. Together, their various production technologies complement each other, permitting the meeting of climate goals and providing security of supply all year round.

> The Baltic countries are an attractive market for developing renewable energy projects due to their unique competitive advantage. The grids in Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania stem from electrify each whole country. As a result, power enough resources to connect to the power grid. Historically speaking, connecting to the grid in the Baltics is, by default, cheaper than in many other countries.

In addition to grid connection, the price of land in the Baltic countries is more competitive, and there is a skilled yet affordable labour force available. The Baltic states have the potential to become a hub for energy-intensive industries, as the region has abundant solar and wind resources. The planned development of energy parks should focus on balanced hybrid solutions with different technologies complementing each other. As a result of renewable projects already implemented, currently in operation, and planned, the Baltic countries will become much greener in the next few years. Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania are at the forefront of renewable energy in Europe.

Evecon's development team in Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania has shown promising results in developing its own energy parks and providing development services to other interested parties.

The company's activities vary by country, taking into account local characteristics, but in total, solar parks with a total capacity of 106 MW started operating in the Baltics last year. Various projects totalling 200 MW have been implemented in Latvia, of which *Evecon* successfully sold a 55 MW solar energy portfolio to the investment company Modus Asset Management. Last year, Evecon completed 44 MW of solar parks in Lithuania for prosumers operating in energy cooperatives. WiSo Engineering builds larger as well as smaller energy parks. Agricultural, commercial,

and manufacturing companies and owners of warehouse complexes should consider designing and building solar parks based on their consumption. The most optimal option is to consume one's own production, thereby earning money through savings. If a company is able to consume the maximum of its energy production, money is saved on network services.

Technological advancement has contributed to the reduction in the cost of solar panels. Improved manufacturing processes, economies of scale, and increased competition in the market have combined to drive down the overall cost of solar energy. Plus, solar panels can be recycled at the end of their lifespans.

Companies should consider which energy source they deem most reasonable in their field of activity over the next ten or twenty years. That said, there is hardly a better time to build than during the current economic downturn, as construction prices have decreased.

Evecon and Corsica Sole. France's leading energy storage company, are building a 400 MWh battery park complex in Estonia with a planned completion date in 2025. It will be the most powerful battery park complex in continental Europe and will help support the stability of the Baltics' power grid when the region is disconnected from Russia's grid early next year. The complex, which will be launched in the first quarter of 2025, will help regulate the frequency of the network. If the network frequency increases or decreases, the batteries will quickly help store or generate electricity to balance the effect of the change. Also, the technology can aid various regulation services in ensuring the network remains balanced.

Renewable energy production has grown rapidly. Energy storage has become a strategic challenge in all European Union countries who wish to ensure energy independence and help stabilise the power grid by balancing production and consumption.



The swordfish comes from the Atlantic Ocean and sometimes takes more than 20 hours to be delivered to the restaurant. *Olivia Restaurant* is the only restaurant in Latvia to have been granted an official catch quota for bluefin tuna, leading its restaurant team to create a unique concept for Riga – a tuna menu.

The *Olivia Restaurant* team has also kept meat lovers in mind. Most of its meats come from Ireland because in addition to having been quality meat producers for many generations, the Irish are also able to ensure that the meat delivered to the restaurant is organically grown, tender, juicy, and full of flavour.

The dessert menu at *Olivia Restaurant* is not large, but each of the dishes contains refined, nuanced flavours that might even recall childhood. One of the favourite desserts at the restaurant is the caramelised Brunost,

or cheese cream with cloudberries from the Arctic – guests call it an absolute masterpiece. Another highlight is the chocolate brownie with black garlic and lingonberry sauce, which once again confirms the chef's tendency to not shy away from experimenting with various flavours and manners of preparation. It is precisely for this reason that the menu at *Olivia Restaurant* often features fermented products made on site at the restaurant, including nuts, egg yolks, and kombucha, which features in several sauces.

Olivia Restaurant is located in a two-storey wooden building dating to the 19th century in the heart of Riga's Art Nouveau district. The restaurant has taken care not only with its gastronomic offer but also its visual image. Naturally, the exterior attracts attention, but so does the well-considered interior with its subtle colours, brick walls, velvet, copper, wood, and the romance of an attic space. Because Olivia Restaurant can accommodate up to 100 guests, the restaurant's unforced informal atmosphere is ideal for meetings with friends and romantic dinners as well as for business meetings and larger celebrations.

The Estonian women's national cricket team has 20 players, who come from various backgrounds – some work in IT, some are lawyers or new mothers, others are still in school. Liina is a pilot. It's not easy to combine her work with

cricket practices and games, but the team gives Liina training and tournament dates far ahead of time so she can request the days off or vacation time from work.

HOW IT ALL BEGAN

One evening Liina sat down with her mother to talk about her future, about potential studies and universities. They also discussed various professions, but none really appealed to Liina. 'Then my mom kind of made a joke saying that, well, then you should become a pilot! And that got me thinking about flying...,' Liina says. 'After a couple of months, I decided that this was something I really wanted to do. I only recently told my mom that it was her influence that made me think about becoming a pilot and make that decision.'

Liina graduated from the Estonian Aviation Academy in 2020. The studies took a bit longer for her and her classmates because of the pandemic, but in the end she got her diploma and started working in the operations control centre at an Estonian airline. Later, she flew Saab 2000 aircraft for another Estonian airline, but she admits that the idea of working at airBaltic always appealed to her: 'I think all the pilots from the Baltic states appreciate working so close to home, doing what they love with a very good company. It's a win-win situation for everybody. I also think that all of the Estonian Aviation Academy graduates look towards *airBaltic* and the opportunities it offers to young professionals.'

Liina currently lives in Tallinn and commutes to Riga for work, but because *airBaltic* has a hub at Tallinn Airport as well, she can quite often go to work from her home in Tallinn. Liina says that her next step is captaincy, but she worked as a safety officer at one of her previous airlines and found the work very interesting as well as challenging. So at some point, she might pursue that position at *airBaltic* as well.

BEHIND THE SCENES / March



What does it mean to be sustainable now?

That's the question on everybody's mind. Just last month, airBaltic signed its Sustainability Report for 2025, releasing audited data about how the company is fulfilling its sustainability commitments. In order to embrace transparent environmental communication and reach climate targets, sustainability has become a highly regulated area, and at airBaltic it's Zita Baranova's job to make sure that the work of her fellow employees working on ESG (environment, social, and governance) issues in various airBaltic departments is coordinated and takes place within the ESG framework.

Adherence to sustainability principles in nothing new for many companies, including *airBaltic*.

Indeed, sustainability has been alive and well at *airBaltic* for more than 25 years, since the company was founded, because there is no other way. Reducing fuel consumption was important already back then, because the issue of flight efficiency has always been vital from the environmental, safety, and operational

perspectives. The company implemented a range of initiatives, such as fuel-efficient standard operating procedures for pilots, the recycling of waste, energy efficiency, and others.

One of my tasks is to bring all of this into our ESG framework. But another task, which takes up most of my time at the moment, is to ensure compliance, because sustainability also has its own regulatory framework. These frameworks exist at different levels – national, international, and also that of the European Green Deal, within which a number of regulations have been adapted. The climate transition plan is a good example. It involves calculating the impact of different activities on emissions and drawing up a plan to reduce them by 2050.

So, there's a lot of planning and modelling and activity management. But we've also got all sorts of interesting internal projects, such as the operational improvements employees in various departments have been making and a few other new initiatives we're working on.

It seems that operational improvements would be most directly related to sustainability issues. I'd like to highlight our Flight Operations support team. They are working on how to reduce the weight of operating flights, how to reduce fuel consumption, and how to optimise all operations so that the flight is efficient not only from an environmental point of view, but also so that all the processes and operations are safe for our flight crews and passengers.

Last year, we launched various voluntary initiatives and will continue to do so this year. One of these, for example, is giving our customers the opportunity to buy one kilogram of SAF (sustainable aviation fuel) additive along with their flight. This year, we'll go further and increase that amount – in the booking system, people will be able to buy 50 or even 100 percent of their proportion of a flight's SAF.

One trend we're still seeing in the market is emissions offsets. But unfortunately, not all offsetting initiatives result in notable climate improvements. So it's no coincidence that our strategy focuses on continually increasing the use of SAF.

What is SAF?

SAF is sustainable aviation fuel, and it has the same chemical formula as conventional fuels, but the product is made from renewable rather than petroleum resources. Recycled waste, biomass, recycled cooking oils, or green hydrogen produced with wind or solar power – there's a whole range of raw materials from which chemists already know how to produce SAF. And they do.

The *Neste* plant in Rotterdam produces SAF from oil used to make fast-food burgers and fries. I think we'll be seeing more and more SAF plants popping up in the next ten years, also in Europe.

But the whole industry needs to work together to explain and increase the demand for sustainable fuels. The more people willing to vote with their euros and create demand for SAF, the sooner regional SAF plants will be established.

But there are still people who believe that the concept of sustainability cannot in any way include flying.

Yes, in the airline industry this is known as flight shaming. Sustainability is an all-encompassing topic, and without a holistic approach, no right or good decision can be made. Our economy and society is very broad, and we have to take into account where we live and what the social, economic, climatic, and geographical characteristics of our region are. To illustrate, consider forestry as an example. Across diverse ecosystems such as the Amazon rainforest or the Nordic boreal forest, the approach to social, environmental, and governance characteristics vary. It's important to adjust how we practise sustainable forestry to fit the specific needs of different environmental and social ecosystems.

Similarly, if people in the Baltics stopped flying, it would be difficult for them to maintain relationships with people elsewhere and for countries to develop economically. For example, it takes two days to reach Amsterdam by car from here. Poland, the closest major economic centre outside the Baltic states, is eight to ten hours by car from Riga. We've even calculated the emissions: if I drove to Amsterdam alone by car, I'd produce twice the emissions I would if I flew. So, that's my answer to flight shaming and harming the environment. However, in urban agglomerations, where the cities are very close to each other, the situation is completely different. There, it's probably better to use the train.

And the third argument is that the aviation industry has already saved fuel wherever possible simply due to the cost of that fuel. Aviation is a very visible sector, but it's responsible for only two to three percent of the world's total emissions. And that's why it's particularly important – and this is something I take a lot of pride in – that *airBaltic* flies the most efficient aircraft available in its class.

A draft directive is also being drawn up to prevent so-called greenwashing. Why is this important? Greenwashing means pretending to be more sustainable in one's communications than one actually is, and it's a very easy thing to fall into My household wouldn't be sustainable if I just wore 'green' clothes; I also need to look at what the materials in my apartment are made of, what my car is made of, where the food I buy is produced, and so on.

By 2027, companies will have to collect sustainability data from their supply chains. Many companies, including *airBaltic*, already have some of this information in place. We'll also be much more cautious in our communications, because we don't want to inadvertently mislead the public. We also have a number of in-depth studies planned on exactly how sustainable our products are. I think we'll find that many of our products are actually

more sustainable than we think, but also that there's room for improvement.

We can say that *airBaltic* is an airline that flies the most efficient aircraft in its class on the market today. We mainly use conventional aviation fuel and a little bit of SAF, which we are increasing every year, but there's no other way at the moment. That is, until there's a huge increase in SAF production to replace conventional fuel. SAF is currently two to four times more expensive than conventional aviation fuel, and its supply still cannot match demand. That's why it's not used to its full extent or by all airlines, because then flying would become an activity only for the elite.

In order to be able to stand up for something so powerfully, one needs to really believe in it. Where did you get this belief?

My background is in consultancy and business development. Having spent 12 years in this field, I've seen a wide variety of industries in Latvia. This

means that it's very difficult to persuade me that this or that industry is or is not doing something, because there's a big chance that I've already studied it myself (*laughs*).

But the projects I liked best were those related to renewable energy. I enjoyed, and was actually quite successful in, proving the business viability of green projects. Long before I joined the field of aviation, I had to demonstrate both the business and environmental sustainability of various projects. Sustainability cannot be green to the extreme. If it is, then you're living in the forest, not doing any business or building a country. For me, sustainability always goes hand in hand with economics and business.

I did, however, take a break from the business world for a while because I was very burnt out. But when I decided to enter the job market again, I thought about the directions I wanted to go in, and I defined three things for myself. First, I knew that I wanted to work for a big company, because if you change a big company by one or two degrees, the impact is incomparably greater than if you change a small company by 80 degrees. The wingspan is very different!

Second, because I'm good at development, I wanted to work with that instead of operations. When I received an offer to join *airBaltic* as its Head of Sustainability, it was a perfect match. So, be careful what you wish for!

And the third important thing: I want to do something good for the planet while I'm here.
