Over the past few months we've seen a growing number of passengers choosing airBaltic for their long-awaited leisure getaways, quick city breaks, and essential business trips. As we now transition into autumn, we're excited to keep the summer spirit alive by offering destinations that allow you to extend the warmth and adventure of the season. This September, popular choices from Riga include Paris, Copenhagen, and Rome. Moreover, with our winter schedule just around the corner, stay connected with airBaltic for the latest updates on exciting new destinations and offers.

This growing demand is also reflected in our financial performance. The company's HI financial results for 2024 are out, and they confirm our continued strong business, financial, and operational performance. We've achieved record-breaking Hl revenue of EUR 339 million, a 16% increase from 2023, along with a 39% rise in adjusted EBITDAR to EUR 77 million. Flight numbers increased by nearly 12%, and other key metrics, such as Available Seat Kilometres and load factor, also reached new peak heights. ROOFTOP ESCAPES

September is one of the most beautiful months in Riga, as the late summer light bathes the historical architecture and picturesque parks in a warm, golden glow. The weather remains pleasantly mild and perfect for lazy afternoons spent on outdoor terraces and at rooftop bars.

One of the city's hottest new rooftop escapes is *Avantgarden*, which opened this year above the *Galleria Riga* shopping centre. This vibrant oasis is a lush park full of trees and greenery that exudes life and vitality. *Avantgarden's* highlight is its 360-degree panoramic view of Riga, offering an awe-inspiring perspective of the city's skyline. The culinary landscape is also exceptional, with a variety of street food cafés to suit every palate.

If you prefer elegant classics, the *Stage 22* rooftop restaurant and bar at the *Grand Hotel Kempinski Riga* offers culinary excellence with international dishes made using local ingredients. It's all complemented by breathtaking panoramic views of the Latvian National Opera house and a nearby park.

Modernist brilliance

Gundaris Pone (1932–1994) was one of the most fascinating modernist composers in Latvian music. While some composers achieve local significance, Pone had a global perspective. Venice held a special place in Pone's heart and life, inspiring several of his musical works, some of which are included on this album.

MIKELI DAY FAIR September 28

Miķeļi, or the autumn equinox, is one of the most important festivals in Latvia. Although it's no longer celebrated as widely today, it used to be a time of great celebration to honour nature and the harvest. A visit to the markets on this day is a real treat, with market squares overflowing with locally grown pumpkins, apples, pears, cranberries, and more. One highlight is the Miķeļi Day Fair in Cathedral Square in Riga, which this year takes place on a Saturday. FIM SPEEDWAY GRAND PRIX OF LATVIA

September 6-7

These motorcycles have only one gear and no brakes, providing the best high-speed thrills and 'fast and furious' excitement imaginable. 



airBaltic DISC THE COURSE **GOLF PARK**

You've most likely heard of golf and frisbee, but the younger sibling of these sports - disc golf has yet to gain wider recognition in Latvia. To promote this fun activity and make Riga an appealing destination for those passionate about an active lifestyle and outdoor activities, airBaltic has recently partnered with Ufogolf Disc Golf Park in Mežaparks, Riga's picturesque forest district. The disc golf park, which opened back in 2013, will continue to host numerous local and international tournaments.

The airBaltic Disc Golf Park offers two specialty courses: the Main Course with 19 baskets, and the Beginners' Course with ten baskets. It takes a few hours to complete each course, making disc golf a great way to spend time outdoors and explore the enchanting forest. The pine trees in Mežaparks create natural obstacles that add an extra layer of challenge and strategy to the game. In addition, a game can be accompanied by a refreshing stroll to nearby Ķīšezers Lake for magnificent views.

FREE ACCESS FOR airBaltic CLUB VIP AND **EXECUTIVE MEMBERS**

The park is open to the public for a fee. However, airBaltic provides unlimited free access to the park for VIP and Executive members of its loyalty programme as well as Planies NFT holders. All *airBaltic* Club members can play free of charge once a month. If you haven't joined the club, there's no time like the present!

THE RULES

Disc golf is an exciting familyfriendly activity that combines the mastery of both frisbee and golf. It requires no previous experience, and anyone can quickly learn the rules. Each player throws a specially designed disc similar to a frisbee towards a disc golf basket (called a 'hole'), trying to land the disc in the target in as few attempts as possible. Similarly to golf, the player with the lowest number of attempts wins, and a standard game course consists of 18 holes. Thanks to its active nature and no direct contact with the ground, unlike golf, this sport can be played throughout the year regardless of weather conditions.

IN THE WORLD

The first disc golf games were played in the 1960s, and there are currently around 255,000 registered players in the world. Even though it's unclear where the idea of disc golf first emerged, Finland, Sweden, and Estonia are among the countries with the highest density of disc golf courses. Every year, disc golf enthusiasts pay a visit to Tampere in Finland, where the European Open championship takes place.



airBaltic RIGA OPEN 2024

In mid-August, the first airBaltic Riga Open took place at the airBaltic Disc Golf Park. Over three days, one hundred disc golf players from six countries shone brightly, setting new personal and course records. No one was left indifferent as the organisers created an unforgettable atmosphere for every participant and fan.

During the competition, participants competed in six separate groups for the opportunity to win cash prizes and various gifts from the tournament sponsors as well as the main prize round trip flight tickets to a destination of their choice, provided by airBaltic. There were intense battles for first place in all of the groups, as one wrong decision could decide the fate of the game. In the end, Mathias Villota (EST), Elizabete Pēkšena (LAT), Raimo Kimmel (EST), Nils Rudiņš (LAT), Madis Tučs (LAT), and Jere N. Tiemi (LAT) became the first airBaltic Riga Open champions. The first always remain first!

The tournament was a great success and has all the potential to become an international A-level competition in three years' time, which would be the first such competition in Latvia. Next year, the *airBaltic* Riga Open 2025 will take place from July 25 to 27. when, between the world's biggest tournaments, the stars will shine right here in Riga at the airBaltic Disc Golf Park.

HIGHLIGHTS IN LATVIA THIS MONTH / September

Where do the artsy locals go?

As the air turns cooler and the nights grow longer, most Rigans seek solace in the vibrant local contemporary art scene.

Artistic September in Riga kicks off with the 19th edition of the annual Baltā Nakts (White Night, from the French *Nuit Blanche*) festival on September 7, when numerous art installations scattered throughout the streets and museums of the city transform the Latvian capital and bring it to life after dark. Then, as one event concludes, another begins: the 15th annual Survival Kit contemporary art festival unfolds from September 6 to October 6. This year's theme, 'Measures', is curated by the innovative Finnish curator Jussi Koitela, who has also curated the Pavilion of Finland at the 60th Venice Biennale this year. Survival Kit showcases more than 30 local and international artists, exploring material, social, and cultural norms in Riga's urban life. As always, the exhibition features installations in lesser-known venues across the city, continuing its tradition of uncovering hidden gems.

For theatre lovers, the Homo Novus International Festival of Contemporary Theatre is happening from August 29 to September 8. The festival's main attractions take place in the charming setting of Riga's Bergs Bazaar passage. This year's theme explores the power of distorted reflections, deformations, and carnivalesque exaggerations, offering audiences a diverse range of Latvian and international performances and installations. Highlights include a performance by Venice Biennale Silver Lion winner Dana Michel; a unique interpretation of 'Ode to Joy' by Amanda Coogan, Lianne Quigley, and the Latvian Association of

the Deaf; and a collaboration between the Danish collective MØR and acclaimed Latvian artist Katrīna Neiburga. With many other captivating performances on offer, this festival promises to delight theatre fans.

uses the largest private art collection in Latvia.

Riga is not only a festival site; it's also a year-round art destination. The Kim? Contemporary Art Centre, a cornerstone of Latvian contemporary art, remains a favourite among connoisseurs and this summer moved into the premises of a former yeast factory. Meanwhile, the Zuzeum Art Centre, home to Latvia's largest private art collection, boasts a minimalist interior that beautifully showcases its distinctive

Riga has also long been known for its vibrant smaller galleries that captivate passersby with their unique charm and displays of art. Even today, small contemporary art spaces are sprouting up across the city like mushrooms after a summer rain, attracting locals as well as visitors eager to explore Riga's rich artistic offer. Be sure to visit the new Asni art gallery, which opened this spring; the distinctive ISSP photography centre; and Māksla XO, which is one of Riga's most influential galleries. These are just a few of the must-see destinations to experience the true spirit of Latvian contemporary art. After all, there's no better way to prepare for the gloomy autumn weather than by indulging in your artistic passions!

The votes have been counted

To honour the 55th anniversary of the Baltic Way last month, *airBaltic* launched a campaign inviting the residents of the Baltic states to vote for their favourite city or town to have an airplane named in its honour.

This August marks the 35th anniversary of the Baltic Way, the peaceful demonstration that united all three Baltic nations, with more than two million people joining hands to form a human chain stretching more than 690 kilometres from Tallinn to Vilnius. Thus, brave and patriotic people united in a common force against the occupation of their countries by the Soviet Union and in their desire for freedom.

Thirty-five years ago, the three Baltic countries (Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania) were still occupied by the Soviet Union, but their yearning for freedom was growing stronger and stronger, as it was in other occupied countries, too. On August 23, 1989, a peaceful protest in the form of a human chain through all three countries was organised to attract the world's attention and express the people's dream of independence. The choice of date was no coincidence – it marked exactly 50 years since the signing on August 23, 1939, of the so-called Molotov-Ribbentrop Pact between the Soviet Union and Nazi Germany, which led to the Soviet Union's annexation of the independent Baltic states and the ruin of millions of lives.

The Baltic Way remains a very memorable event for the people of the Baltic nations. Those who took part in it still remember where they stood







during the demonstration, how they made their way to those positions, and the people they stood next to. Although the demonstration was peaceful, no one knew what the consequences would be. Therefore, the excitement and desire for freedom was mixed with a fear of Soviet repressions and what might be in store for them in the future. Led by the leaders of each nation's national front, the human chain included adults, senior citizens, and even children who wanted to speak up for their future and be part of this human phenomenon that gradually led to the three countries declaring independence later in 1991.

The momentum and success of the Baltic Way has since inspired other occupied and oppressed nations, and it has become a symbol of unity, peace, and freedom.





Sixteen cities and towns from each country – Latvia, Lithuania, and Estonia – were chosen in an online vote. Voting took place from August 5 to 22, and people from all around the globe were able to participate in the aircraft-naming process. With one vote per person per day, more than a million votes were collected, and each *airBaltic* aircraft now bears the name of a Baltic city or town.

This is not the first time *airBaltic* has organised such an airplane-naming initiative. In 2018, to celebrate Latvia's 100th anniversary, the airline named 14 airplanes after cities and towns in Latvia that were also chosen by a round of online voting. Now these airplanes have been renamed to bring the Baltic nations even closer together, to honour Baltic unity, and to give each aircraft a new personality. The names on the planes

will also add a new level of excitement: locals will have the unmatched thrill of boarding the plane that bears the name of their hometown, thus bringing them one step closer to home wherever they may be. Others may be inspired to find out more about previously unfamiliar cities and towns.

According to *airBaltic* president Martin Gauss, honouring Baltic cities and towns by naming aircraft after them is an important step in uniting the nations: 'The 35th anniversary of the Baltic Way is a significant moment that celebrates our unity and common history. It's a great privilege that our aircraft can carry the names of Baltic cities and towns up in the air!' Thirty-five years ago, not many would have dared to imagine that the Baltic nations would some day soon be able to proudly display their identity.

The ultimate highlight of Split's Old Town, which served as a backdrop for the *Game of* Thrones television series, are the scenic ruins of Diocletian's Palace. The stone remains are very atmospheric, yet how about paying a visit to Diocletian himself via the **Diocletian's Dream** virtual reality experience (Zagrebačka ulica 1; diocletiansdream.com)? Located near the palace walls overlooking the Golden Gate entrance, this adventure brings the city's history to life and transports visitors back to 305 CE, letting them experience the UNESCO Heritage Site in its full splendour, as it was more than 1700 years ago. The 15-minute-long animation shown in the VR headset is narrated by Diocletian's slave Severin, who takes visitors on a tour through the royal chambers and shares plenty of intriguing facts about the emperor's life, rule, and personality. The experience is suitable for everyone, including children, and is available in several languages.

The new **Krug** restaurant on the West Coast promenade overlooks Split's lively waterfront and offers guests a seasonal, organic menu featuring fresh fish from the Adriatic Sea, vegetables from organic farms, and local meats (Trumbićeva obala 17; krugrestaurantsplit.com). It accommodates only 12 people around the open kitchen, where the meal is prepared in front of diners' eyes. Guests receive personalised service, and the nine-course tasting menu changes daily depending on the available ingredients. Everything from the bread to the pickled foods and non-alcoholic beverages is produced in-house.

SUP stands up for 'stand-up paddleboarding', a popular on-water activity anyone can master. Split's coast boasts crystal-clear waters and thus offers an idyllic setting for this activity, while the calm waters make it accessible for beginners. The activity is more popular during the day, yet a colourful **Glow Tour Split** night ride makes it really unique (Prilaz Braće Kaliterna l; adriatic-sup.com). The paddleboards are equipped with special LED lights on the bottom, making them look like a moving disco fleet. The experience begins no earlier than 7 p.m., or at sunset. The tour usually combines a ride on the river into the sea, providing a totally different perspective to the city.

Labour: When the Foundations Were Laid, an exhibition at the Bulgarian National Gallery, explores the key subject of the Socialist paradigm, namely, work and labour (until November 24; pl. 'Knyaz Aleksandar I' l; nationalgallery.bg). During the communist era in Bulgaria, art and culture performed the functions of propaganda. New visual codes and myths, such as the 'leader' and 'hero', were created to highlight the idea of the bright future, and the image of the worker, who physically built this new world, was assigned a central place. This pathos dominated in art from the late 1940s to the late 1950s. In this show, works by prominent Bulgarian artists including Iliya Petrov, Dechko Uzunov, and Nikola Tanev represent the essence of the Socialist Realism style in paintings, sculptures, and graphics, and the depicted scenes often serve as a visual documentation of Bulgaria's past. For example, Tanev's images reflect the construction of the Lovech-Troyan Railway and the Kutsian mine, while works by Pavel Valkov show the erection of the

The new **DOT Sofia** boutique hotel blends the concepts of art, design, and architecture (ul. Bratya Miladinovi 46; dotsofia.com; from EUR 150). Here, authentic hospitality meets cosmopolitan spirit, creating a trademark urban experience. The hotel is nestled in the heart of Sofia, close to the Banya Bashi Mosque and the famous Women's Market. Designed by I/O Architects, the building contextualises the history of the neighbourhood and houses ten boutique apartments. The interior is minimalist yet cosy and furnished with locally crafted design elements as well as classics. DOT also hosts regular exhibitions and cultural events; the hotel's art collection comprises over 200 works by established and emerging contemporary Bulgarian artists, including many key works from the late 1980s to the present day. Its restaurant, Komat, serves modern interpretations of Bulgarian culinary gems.

Georgi Dimitrov Mausoleum in Sofia.

A hike on Vitosha Mountain makes for an unforgettable escape from the city out into nature. Sofia is one of the few capitals in the world with a majestic mountain forming the backdrop to its urban panorama. The foothills of Vitosha, which are the starting point for a day-hike, can be easily reached by car or public transport. Late summer and early autumn is a perfect time to enjoy the wooded slopes and breathtaking views of the city, while in winter the area is covered with snow and welcomes skiers. One of the hiking routes makes a loop from the Aleko mountain hut, winding through the forest and shrubby landscape up to the Cherni Vrah peak. There's also a local tavern with hearty homemade cuisine to enjoy. The steeper and more challenging Boyana Waterfall Trail with untamed landscapes offers another adventure.

The Karpo Godina: Film Imaginary exhibition at the Slovenian Cinematheque is a great opportunity to explore the bold visual world of Slovenian cinema and one of its most prominent figures (until December 22; Miklošičeva cesta 28; kinoteka.si). While still a student in the 1960s, Godina (b. 1943) stood out with a series of experimental films. He went on to become a professional in the genre of short films, a director of photography, and one of the key figures of the so-called Yugoslav Black Wave. As director and screenwriter, he has worked on almost 100 films and memorable commercials. Godina is also the only Slovenian who has had a film retrospective at MoMA in New York City. The key feature of his oeuvre is his phenomenal ability to grasp the banalities of everyday life and carefully frame them through the camera lens, often with the help of a static shot. His imagery is an ode to humanity and curious admiration of the surrounding world, its inhabitants, and sublime beauty.

Open Kitchen, which unites foodies from all over the country, is one of the most acclaimed culinary projects in Slovenia (September 6, 13, 20, 27; Pogačarjev trg 1; odprtakuhna.si). The gourmet venue is set in the city centre on Pogačarjev Square and operates every Friday from March until November. First launched in 2013, this food festival is highlighted by the regular visits of star chefs, while popular DJs and street artists take care of the entertainment. The menu varies from traditional Slovenian recipes to modern culinary experiments and dishes from all over the world. Take a seat overlooking the beautiful market colonnade and enjoy the food together with tailored drinks.

The April 1550 boutique hotel blends history, style, and the celebration of the simple pleasures in life (Rožna ulica 3; aprill550.com; from EUR 259). The interior features artisan details and a calm palette of colours and textures. The building was constructed in the mid-16th century as a residence for craftsmen and their families. In a nod to this history, everything here is sourced from the local community: bespoke furniture from local craftsmen, handmade tableware, and other details. Meticulously restored, many original features, including the historical wooden ceilings and exposed bricks, have been preserved. The secret garden is perfect for reading books and enjoying refreshments, while the flexible communal space serves as the hotel's living room, inviting guests for a meal or to use it as a workshop space. Breakfast is served around the large communal table, in the garden, or in your room.

Fortuny's Venice

An inspiring journey through art, design, and legacy.

Walking along Venice's historic
Fondamenta delle Zattere waterfront and looking across the wide canal towards
Giudecca Island, the first thing that
catches your eye is a striking industrial
brick building with the name Fortuny
prominently displayed on its façade.
This name has an important place in
Venetian and global cultural heritage.
Behind it stands the legendary Mariano
Fortuny y Madrazo (1871–1949), who was
a pioneer of industrial design, an artist,
textile manufacturer, fashion designer, set
designer, inventor, and experimenter.

Born into an artistic family in Granada, Spain, Fortuny was immersed in a world of beauty from an early age. His early years were steeped in art and culture, first in Rome and then in the cosmopolitan atmosphere of Paris, where he studied painting before moving to Venice in 1895. This happened to be the first year of the Venice Biennale, and the lagoon city was buzzing with artistic energy.


Soon after, Fortuny acquired the 15th-century Palazzo Pesaro degli Orfei on the Grand Canal, whose magnificent Venetian Gothic façade overlooks Campo San Beneto. This iconic building became Fortuny's creative studio, and in the 1950s his family generously donated it to the city of Venice for use in artistic projects. It now houses the recently renovated Museo Fortuny, or Fortuny Museum.

The museum's rich, multi-storey exhibition, which retains the original layout of the rooms, showcases the breadth of Fortuny's diverse and ambitious projects. From photography, sculpture, and painting to his famous lamp designs, artistic fabrics, costumes, and stage sets (including the patented Fortuny Cupola lighting system), the collection offers a comprehensive insight into the innovative genius of one of Venice's most celebrated artists.

Fortuny gained international recognition for his innovative textile art and design. At the palazzo, he launched his first collection of upholstery fabrics, created together with his muse and partner Henriette Negrin and featuring prints made from natural plant and insect extracts. The atelier's standout creation was the Delphos gown, a revolutionary plissé silk dress renowned for its elegant, figure-hugging shape. While Henriette ran the business, Mariano expanded their presence to cities such as Berlin, Madrid, Milan, and New York City.

Their factory on the island of Giudecca opened in 1922 and is still in operation; it continues to use the original techniques and preserve the secrets of the Fortuny craft. Recently, architect Alberto Torsello revitalised the factory's showroom to celebrate Fortuny's heritage and talent.

Kaivopuisto & Eiran Ranta

Located just a 15-minute walk from the city centre, the Eiran Ranta and Kaivopuisto beach and pathways offer some of the most beautiful views in Helsinki. The coastal walking route with views of the Baltic Sea is stunning in summer as well as winter, making it my favourite place for running, reading on a bench, or meeting up for casual hangouts with friends and family. The beach can even get a bit crowded in warmer weather, as it's the most popular seaside spot for Helsinki residents.

Café Succès

This café is located in the trendy and artistic Ullanlinna neighbourhood, on a street filled with cute boutique shops, art galleries, and restaurants. The locals' go-to order is a cinnamon bun (they're legendary in this town). I have so many memories of sitting at Café Succès with friends, drinking hot chocolate and eating cinnamon buns on cold but sunny winter days. After finishing the bun, head for a stroll through the nearby shops and galleries.

Fancy a more vibrant autumn pastime? Head to Victory Avenue (Calea Victoriei), which is the beating heart of Bucharest. Here vou'll find a kaleidoscope of trendy restaurants, quirky bars, and cutting-edge coffee shops. Then proceed to the Old Town, where spectacular Romanian Renaissance-style Orthodox churches stand next to imposing Neoclassical palaces and the picturesque historical streets are lined with terraces. And don't miss the Pasajul Macca-Vilacrosse, a 19th-century arcaded street reminiscent of the shopping passages of Paris and Milan.

Spread over six floors, it features bookcases, staircases, iron railings, and a vast array of books. Defined by a love of literature, art, and culture, it's surely a space in which to indulge in these passions. The store also includes a café that's perfect for an inspiring tea break.

Stroll through aristocratic parks


Located in the heart of Bucharest, Cişmigiu is an oasis of trees, flowers, and lakes. Its narrow allées evoke the beauty and elegance of the city's past. It's also known for its distinctive architectural features. With wooden panelling, stained glass windows, and a charming courtyard, Caru' cu Bere is one of Bucharest's most iconic establishments. Just a few steps away, Scovergăria Micăi offers a wide variety of delicious pastries.

WHERE TO STAY Clarion Hotel Draken Spa

The 33-storey Clarion Hotel Draken, which opened in October 2023, is currently Gothenburg's tallest hotel. It boasts 474 rooms, a cinema, several restaurants, and a sky bar with a roof terrace offering unrivalled views. In 2024, the hotel unveiled its new spa area, which promises an extra touch of luxury. ...STARGAZING IN GRAN CANARIA







While Gran Canaria might be famous first and foremost for its stunning beaches, enviable microclimates, lush forests, and mountainous interior, it's also one of the best destinations in Europe for something else: stargazing. With clear skies, minimal light pollution, and plenty of lofty vantage points, it's an ideal mission for a group trip.

Gran Canaria's geographical position and abundance of clear skies make it an ideal spot for stargazing. The island boasts a unique cloud phenomenon known as the Donkey's Belly, in which clouds gather no higher than 500 metres above sea level, creating a protective screen from the city lights below. This, combined with the island's varied terrain and lofty mountain peaks, makes it one of the best destinations for stargazing in Europe.

One of the most obvious spots for gazing at the stars in Gran Canaria is the Temisas Observatory. As one of the highest points on the island, it's perfect for spotting constellations and meteor showers.

Presa de Las Niñas, a scenic water reservoir, has flat spots that are ideal for stargazing. With ample parking and a free campsite equipped with toilets, grills, and running water, it's a convenient spot for a night under the stars. Standing under the Milky Way is unforgettable, especially with friends!

A bold new wing

A new extension has recently been added to one of Portugal's mostvisited museums of contemporary art.

Based in Porto, the Serralves Museum is Portugal's leading institution for contemporary art and culture. It hosts monographic and thematic exhibitions by established as well as emerging artists, which are complemented by a rich programme of film screenings, dance, music, and performance arts. Inaugurated in 1999, the museum's main building was designed by renowned Pritzker Prize-winning architect Álvaro Siza, a master of socalled 'poetic modernism'. Now in his 90s, Siza also designed the museum's new wing, which opened to the public earlier this year.

Nestled among the trees and organically integrated into the park's landscape, the new three-storey angular structure is defined by its bold geometric form. Its reinforced concrete walls are covered in white plaster, creating a pleasing contrast with the surrounding greenery. The Álvaro Siza wing is connected to the main building by an elevated gallery.

Like the exterior, the interior of the new wing is defined by angular forms. Geometric panels on the ceilings diffuse artificial light, while the lines of

the plasterboard walls add dynamism to the exhibition space. One floor of the 4000-square-metre extension is dedicated to the Serralves archives and permanent collection, while the other two floors display contemporary art and works related to architecture. The inaugural exhibition, C.A.S.A. or Coleção Álvaro Siza, Arquivo, focuses on Siza's oeuvre and explores the concept of the 'house' as the genesis of all architecture.

The Serralves Museum is set in Serralves Park, which covers 18 hectares of lush gardens, woods, and a traditional farm and has nearly 200 species of plants. Designed in the 1930s by the architect Jacques Gréber, the park is considered one of the finest examples of Portuguese landscape design. Sculptures from the Serralves Collection are on permanent display throughout the park. The highlight of the park is the peach-coloured Serralves Villa, an Art Deco masterpiece built in 1930. Siza also designed the pure-white Manoel de Oliveira Cinema House (2019) and the nearby Gardener's House (2021). R. Dom João de Castro 210; serralves.pt



airBaltic and Riga Airport take off on a renewable energy journey

As the national airline of Latvia, airBaltic is the largest carrier at Riga Airport (RIX). airBaltic has firmly established Riga as its main operational hub, offering connections to over 70 destinations in Europe and beyond.

Amid the aviation industry's push towards decarbonisation, airlines are tackling their carbon footprint from all angles, not just in the skies but on the ground as well. Although most of *airBaltic's* emissions arise from flight operations, almost one thousand tonnes of CO₂ were released from electricity and heating in 2023. Therefore, the availability of renewable energy at Riga Airport plays a significant role in *airBaltic's* decarbonisation efforts.

Riga Airport has begun producing renewable energy from its newly established solar panel park. From February to July of this year, solar panels on the roof of the terminal building generated 407.5 MWh of electricity. During the summer months, they are estimated to contribute an average of 35–45% to total electricity consumption at the airport's North Pier.

Renewable energy projects are part of the airport's medium-term sustainability strategy until 2030. With solar panels installed on the terminal building (700 kW), the northern part of the airport (2 MW), and engineering-technical areas, including technical service buildings and waste hangars (345 kW), Riga

Airport intends to increase its solar energy production to 14% of its total energy consumption by 2026, when as a result, carbon emissions will be reduced by 300 tonnes.

In 2024, the airport also began incorporating purchased electricity from renewable sources into its portfolio and plans to increase that volume by 10% yearly. Santa Auguste-Šole, Head of Sustainability and Environmental Management at Riga Airport, elaborates on this initiative: 'Transitioning to renewable energy is a vital part of our sustainability strategy and zero-emissions roadmap. With each new project and initiative, we move closer to our goal of becoming a fully CO_2 -neutral airport by 2035.'

Looking ahead, Riga Airport is not only focusing on solar energy but is also exploring other renewable energy sources, such as green hydrogen. This includes the potential introduction of hydrogen-powered infrastructure and winter maintenance equipment.

Coordinated efforts can propel the aviation industry towards a reduced carbon emission future. 'We see this as a good example of industry cooperation, as our energy emission reduction is linked with the airport's decarbonisation plans,' says Zita Baranova, Head of Sustainability at *airBaltic*. 'It's encouraging to know that we're moving in the same direction with joint efforts.'





THE ISLAND of POSTCARD-PERFECT VIEWS

With warm weather throughout the year and locals just as welcoming, Madeira is a true paradise in the Atlantic.

How many people do you know who have ventured to Portugal in the past year? Probably quite a few, because the country is a trending destination. And who could blame them? The weather is glorious, the cliff-hugged beaches are breathtaking, the azulejo-covered buildings are picture-perfect, and the local people are still welcoming and not yet weary of visitors. And don't even get me started on the dining scene, which is overflowing with fresh seafood and local wines. In short, Portugal is a full package.

Yet, most travellers stick to the mainland. Their loss. Because let me tell you, Madeira, the second largest of Portugal's islands, is a true gem. So much so that the selfish thought of keeping it a secret briefly crosses my mind.

DUBBED THE ISLAND OF ETERNAL SPRING DUE TO ITS NEVER-ENDING BALMY WEATHER,


Madeira is nestled in the North Atlantic Ocean, about 600 kilometres off the coast of Morocco. Its subtropical climate is perfect for outdoor adventures, of which the island has no shortage. The diverse landscape boasts rugged cliffs, lush forests, and stunning coastlines, filling the island's market stalls with exotic fruits, fresh seafood, and wine.

Even if football isn't your thing, you'd have to be living under a rock to not have heard of Madeira's most famous son, Cristiano Ronaldo. In 2017, even the island's airport was named after him. And if you're behind on the latest football gossip, the local taxi drivers are more than happy to fill you in.

The road from the airport to Funchal, the capital of Madeira, is short but spectacular, giving just enough time for your taxi driver to share his theories on how the referee at the UEFA European Football Championship was probably bribed and thus Portugal lost against Georgia. Funchal was founded in 1424 by the Portuguese navigator João Gonçalves Zarco, who named the city after the wild fennel (funcho in Portuguese) he found growing in abundance here. Thanks to its strategic location, Funchal flourished as a crucial stopover for ships travelling between Europe, Africa, and the Americas, boosting its economic and cultural importance. The 18th and 19th centuries brought prosperity through the wine trade, attracting wealthy Europeans who built grand estates with lush gardens, known as quintas. Today, fennel fields have given way to quintessentially Portuguese buildings lining cobbled, hilly streets like pastel crayons in a box and mingling with magnificent Baroque and Gothic manors and churches.

To really take in the city's tapestry, I head to Almirante Reis Park, where a *teleférico* (cable car) ascends to the Monte parish above. This area once

served as a retreat for the *nouveau riche* escaping the summer heat, including Emperor Charles I of Austria, the last of the Habsburg rulers. Fifteen minutes later and 560 metres higher, I bid farewell to the five other passengers and quickly realise I should have brought a sweater. But the walk up to the stately white Igreja de Nossa Senhora do Monte church soon warms me up. The views are spectacular, but it's the journey to and from Monte that makes this part of town special. In the late 19th century, locals invented a clever way to zoom between Monte and Funchal, namely, the carros de cesto, literally meaning 'basket cars'. These wicker toboggans are operated by two men in white uniforms and straw hats who often pause to give a flirty wink to onlookers. The iconic toboggans glide down on wooden skis, transporting passengers two kilometres downhill to Livramento.

To warm up some more, I head southwest to Ponta do Sol, the sunniest spot on the island. Moving across Madeira's parishes is easy, taking only about twenty minutes by car to reach most of the main parishes. I stretch out on one of the sun loungers on Ponta do Sol Beach, which is on a cove embraced by cliffs and has a pebbled shore known for excellent swimming. It's peak season, but the beach isn't crowded. Even the lifeguards seem fairly relaxed. After a while, I wander to Duke of Luxembourg Pier, which is perched atop a cliff and is reputed to offer the best view of the sunset on the island. If I were to rank my top sunsets, this would be a strong contender for gold.

PORTO MONIZ IN THE NORTH OF THE ISLAND IS FAMED FOR ITS NATURAL SWIMMING POOLS. This is where I head to start my next day, and what

a swim it is! These pools, formed over millennia by cooling lava, are constantly refreshed by ocean water that pours in with each crashing wave, thus maintaining superb water quality. Sitting on the wide concrete steps and soaking in the waters, it's hard to motivate myself to move on.

Seixal Beach is known for its unique black sand and is therefore often called Europe's Hawaii. Naturally, it's also a surfing hotspot. Here I meet João Febrer, the owner of Surf Clube da Madeira, one of the first surf clubs on the island. He has just finished a lesson with a group of smiling surfers high on post-surfing endorphins. We sit on the black sand, surrounded by lush green mountains. Like many locals, João can't imagine living anywhere else. 'This is paradise on Earth,' he says, especially for outdoor enthusiasts like himself.

João has been swimming, snorkelling, and hiking for as long as he can remember. Now 31, he attended his first surf camp at age 11. In fact, it was at Surf Clube da Madeira, the same club he now owns. Needless to say, the young boy instantly fell in love with the laid-back and cheery surfing community. 'We have good surf conditions all year round; it's rare to have a day without waves,' he says.

Madeira's advantage is that, within a single day, you can quickly and easily travel between prime surf spots that match your level of skill. 'You can have five-metre swells in the north and, at the same time, barely halfmetre waves in the south,' says João. Beginners should come between June and September, when the waves are smaller and more accessible, while October to May is better for seasoned surfers. The waves reach their peak grandeur in the last months of the year, drawing

big-name surfers to tackle eight-metre giants at Jardim do Mar. It's a true man-versus-Titan spectacle.


As a fail-safe spot for surfers of all levels, João suggests the reef break at Fajã da Areia in the north of the island. The best part? The water temperature doesn't drop below 20°C until January. 'The local surf community is strong. Everyone's welcome at any surf spot, so don't hesitate to approach us; we love to help,' he says, exuding the same warmth, care, and welcoming spirit as the other locals I've met. 'I could talk about surfing in Madeira for hours. And anyone who comes here to surf finds it hard to leave!' he warns.

Seixal isn't just for surfing; it's also a gateway to the trails of the verdant Laurissilva Forest. This 20-million-year-old subtropical rainforest, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is a hiker's paradise offering trails for seasoned adventurers as well as novices. Madeira's hiking paths fall into two categories: levadas and veredas. Levadas are former irrigation channels that provide generally flat, easy paths and are perfect for those who prefer a leisurely stroll while soaking in the stunning scenery, catching up with friends, and filling their phone's gallery with beautiful landscapes. Veredas, on the other hand, are traditional footpaths connecting mountain peaks that locals once used to traverse rugged terrain. These hikes are more challenging and feature steep ascents, caves, and other obstacles, requiring some physical strength and experience. 'When the locals created these, they never imagined someone would one day use them for recreation,' my guide Darya tells me somewhere between Pico do Areeiro and Pico Ruivo during our hike.

The trail from Pico do Areeiro to Pico Ruivo features Madeira's three highest peaks – these two plus Pico das Torres, which lies midway between them – and is touted as one of Madeira's most challenging hikes. While I haven't tackled proper mountains since middle school and have since somehow developed a fear of heights, I feel I'm in good hands with Darya. At just 24, she's been guiding for Madeira Adventure Kingdom for three years. T've got the hiking bug,' she says. 'It's this condition where even on holiday, you still go hiking.' Yesterday, she did some canyoning, which involves descending into canyons using techniques including hiking, rappelling, and swimming. During our six-hour hike, Darya throws out facts about the local fauna and flora, such as how Madeira has no snakes or spiders, just rabbits. She also has an encyclopaedic knowledge of all the plants we encounter... which I find interesting enough to keep my mind off my fear of heights.

As our group of ten, which hails from all corners of the world and various walks of life, follows Darya, we try to capture the stunning scenery with our phones. The diversity of the pathways keeps this ten-kilometre route engaging: from steps to short caves, to narrow and wide paths, and seas of violet

Echium candicans, also called Pride of Madeira. The trail's reputation as the island's most arduous is well-earned, but the short section of steep steps is manageable. At Pico Ruivo, Madeira's highest point (1861 metres), we have 40 minutes to marvel at the surrounding beauty and snap some mandatory photos. The trail's description as 'challenging yet immensely rewarding' couldn't be more accurate.

During my trip, I've been asking locals about their favourite hikes, and the responses vary. Alongside my mountain hike, another crowd-pleaser is PR 6 (also known as Levada das 25 Fontes), a scenic walk with 25 springs and numerous waterfalls that winds through the Laurisilva Forest. For a taste of hiking without committing to a full day in the mountains, Caminho Real do Paul do Mar is a good option. It starts at the Lombo da Rocha viewpoint and then descends to the parishes of Jardim do Mar and Paul do Mar, offers stunning views of the ocean, and takes just under an hour and a half to complete.


THERE'S NO BETTER WAY TO RECHARGE AFTER A HIKE THAN WITH A BIG PLATE OF PROTEIN-PACKED SEAFOOD. So, I head down to *Vila do Peixe* in Câmara de Lobos near Funchal. This spot was the island's first settlement and the site of the initial landing point of Zarco, the explorer credited with discovering Madeira.

When I mention the address of *Vila do Peixe* to the taxi driver, he nods approvingly: 'Good choice.' The restaurant is perched above the historical town centre. I step into the simple, open-space dining room crowded with tables and floor-to-ceiling windows offering sweeping views over the bay.

Motivated by my post-hike hunger and northern European dinner time, I'm early, so the place is still relatively quiet. But I'm immediately greeted by a poised waiter who encourages me to pick any table I fancy. While the restaurant has a small patio, I decide on a window seat indoors.

A large display flaunting the fresh catch of the day graces the back of the room - guests can choose what they want, have it weighed, and then watch as it's grilled to perfection. Aside from asking locals about their favourite hikes, I've also been inquiring about must-try dishes on the island, and the responses have been split between two camps: espetada lovers and espada enthusiasts. Both dishes are quintessentially Madeiran. Espetada consists of chunks of beef marinated with garlic, salt, and bay leaves and then grilled on skewers over an open flame; it's traditionally served with *milho frito*, or fried cornmeal cubes. But, being a pescatarian, I opt for the espada, or black scabbardfish, which is typically served fried or grilled and served with fried banana and passion fruit sauce. Yet I don't find espada listed on the menu.

'That's a tourist thing. We don't actually eat espada with the banana,' says the waiter, brushing the excitement off my face. 'But we do have fresh espada that we can grill for you,' he offers, even agreeing to customise it a bit by adding the crispy milho frito cubes so I can have a taste of both classic dishes. Satisfied with this twist, I glance out the window at the bay for a while, spotting the colourful boats known as *xavelhas*, which are distinctive to Câmara de Lobos. My dish arrives – a stunning white fillet garnished with a dramatic stalk of parsley – and there's nothing black about it. The name, I learn,

comes from its rather intimidating appearance: sleek, black, and lined with jagged teeth. The fish lives in the deep waters off Madeira and around Japan, at depths of about 1700 metres. As it's brought to the surface, the pressure kills the fish, making it possible to catch. The espada's flesh is moist, slightly sweet, and falls apart into perfect chunks at the touch of a fork. Absolute perfection, if you ask me.

Later, I catch chef José Diogo Costa before the dinner shift at William Restaurant in the Belmond Reid's Palace hotel. The restaurant, lit by large windows facing the ocean, has arguably one of the best views in Funchal. The teal-coloured dining room, which is dotted with round tables dressed in white tablecloths, is a *Michelin*-starred affair. For Costa, it's the sopa de trigo, or wheat soup, that excites him most of the native culinary heritage. Fond memories of learning to cook this hearty concoction of veggies and salted pork from his grandmother are what inspired his return to his native Madeira. With more than 40 countries under his belt and having honed his skills in kitchens from Oslo to the Azores, Bangkok, and Chile, he admits that all the places where he's lived made him realise how lucky Madeirans are to have such great weather and such a variety of ingredients.

With a cooking credo of 'simple is more', Costa draws inspiration from the island's elderly population and what they've cooked and eaten throughout the decades. He pairs this with close collaborations with Madeira's farmers and fishermen. Trout from Seixal, fennel, dragon fruit, watermelon – the menu reads like a farmer's market. Asked about the ingredients that most inspire his culinary creativity, he names corn and *pitanga*. 'It's my favourite fruit – it tastes like a mix of tomato, passion fruit, and mango,' he says. The result is three tasting menus at *William* that celebrate the island's culinary culture and are executed with modern interpretations and a blend of flavours as diverse as Madeira's terrain.

TO ROUND OFF A DINNER IN MADEIRA, A LOCAL MADEIRA WINE IS A MUST. This


fortified wine originated from sea voyages, when sailors discovered that wine stored in barrels actually improved in flavour from the warm conditions. This heating process is what sets Madeira wine apart from other fortified wines, like port. Fortified with brandy during fermentation, then aged in barrels, the wine develops a strong, complex character with an alcohol content of around 18% to 20%.

To dive deeper into this iconic drink, I continue my epicurean exploration at the Agricultural Cooperative of Funchal on the city's outskirts, where *Madeira Vintners* is based. 'You're visiting us at a special moment,' says Lisandra Gonçalves, a young browneyed enologist, as we walk among gigantic steel tanks filled with Madeira wine. 'We just celebrated our first batch of ten-year vintage – Tinta Negra 2021.' This is the 12th variety in the *Madeira Vintners* collection.

Established in 2012 under the auspices of the Agricultural Cooperative of Funchal, *Madeira Vintners* stands out in the crowded field of Madeira wine producers by being run by a young generation of winemakers and boasting an allfemale team, from the engineers to the marketing department. 'It wasn't on purpose,' Gonçalves confesses as we enter a hall with a wall of stacked wooden barrels. 'These are second-hand barrels from France that were used to store cognac and whiskey, which add flavourful depth to our wine.'

As we sit down for a tasting, I ask Gonçalves how she ended up in an industry typically dominated by older men. It turns out that her grandfather used to make wine at home. So, after high school, she decided to take the family hobby to a professional level and became an enologist. Gonçalves admits that introducing innovations in such a tradition-rooted field isn't easy. 'It's the small things, like labels,' she says. *Madeira Vintners* bottles have sleek, modern labels, which are quite unconventional for Madeira wine. Another aspect of innovation is that some *Madeira Vintners* wines are lighter, at 17% alcohol rather than the usual 19%, in an attempt to attract younger generations who still view the drink as old-fashioned.

Another challenge is sourcing grapes. *Madeira Vintners* relies on a nurtured network of viticulturists from all terrains of the island, including nearby Porto Santo Island. Harvest time is typically late August to early October, but with climate change, it's happening ever earlier. Sudden warm waves in the winter months have decreased grape production levels. Moreover, the network

Luxury Charter Madeira offers; longer trips sail to the Desertas Islands, a trio of rugged, uninhabited islets, and to Porto Santo, which is famous for its golden sandy beaches. 'I'll take you to the most beautiful spot on the island,' Pedro announces. A Madeira native, he was the first on the island to offer whale- and dolphin-watching tours. Now that many have followed suit, he's shifted to yacht tours. Like surfing, yachting can be enjoyed yearround, 'We had stunning weather in February,' says Pedro's first mate, André, a dark-haired, tanned twentysomething windsurfer, as he lowers the ladder for my swim at the promised spot. Pedro wasn't exaggerating - the bay, which is embraced by rugged cliffs and features a breathtaking arch carved out of the rock, is easily the most stunning place I've ever swum in.

'I've travelled a lot, but Madeira is Madeira a paradise,' Pedro tells me when I ask if he has always lived in Madeira. André, who's journeyed the world for windsurfing championships and has studied in the United Kingdom, agrees – nothing beats home. It's refreshing to meet residents who are so content with where they live, especially in the south, where you often hear complaints about things not working or being hampered by lots of bureaucracy. But not in Madeira. The people here are living proof of what sunlight can do to a person, namely, bring them a deep sense of contentment with life.

is shrinking, as grape harvests happen only once a year, while bananas, which thrive in Madeira's subtropical climate, can be harvested year-round, making them a more lucrative crop.

Not usually a fan of strong drinks, I'm surprised by how gentle and complex Madeira wine tastes. The older the varietal, the more chocolatey and toasted the flavour becomes. 'Many people enjoy it after work, like an aperitif, while the older vintages are perfect as a digestif with cheese or dessert. Some even like to drink it on the rocks.' Goncalves says with a smile.

When we travel alone, it often feels like certain luxuries might be out of reach, such as a private boat tour. 'But we go whether it's one person or ten, it doesn't matter,' assures Pedro, a tanned man in cool sunglasses, as I sheepishly ask, 'Is this all for me?' while boarding the chic yacht that's part of Pedro's Luxury Charter Madeira fleet. It offers the opportunity to explore Madeira's waters at your own pace, in your own company, tailored to your own whims. 'Snorkelling, paddling. But maybe you like fishing? We can do it all!' Pedro playfully smiles as we set off toward Madeira's east coast.

Lush green mountains frame the stunning turquoise waters. This is one of the three itineraries

Nobody knows Madeira's wine landscape better than sommelier Leonel Nunes. A native of the island, he possesses an unparalleled knowledge of Portuguese wines, with a deep focus on the unique wines from Madeira. As the sommelier at Il Gallo d'Oro in Funchal, a restaurant boasting two *Michelin* stars as well as a Green star, his ability to pair the restaurant's dishes with the perfect wines to elevate the culinary experience crafted by chef Benoît Sinthon has earned him the Michelin Sommelier Award 2024 from NX Wines & Spirits. With an exclusively Portuguese wine list, Nunes' dedication shines through and is reflected in his commitment to personally visit all the main wine producers on the island, ensuring he intimately understands their products.

What are some hidden gems to discover in Madeira that aren't the typical tourist spots? One of my favourite hidden treasures is the Vereda dos Balcões trail in the mountainous region of Ribeiro Frio in the northeastern part of the island. I like to call it a teaser of what a true levada walk in Madeira can offer. This 1.5-kilometre stroll lets you soak in the beauty of our lush Laurisilva Forest and

What would you recommend for a day trip outside the capital?

heart of the island.

Start with lunch in Caniçal, where you'll taste some of the best seafood on the island. Then make a brief stop at Ponta de São Lourenco, a dramatic windswept peninsula at the easternmost point of the island with stunning cliffs, unique rock formations, and breathtaking coastal views. Afterwards, explore the traditional houses in Santana. These are iconic triangular-shaped structures known as *palheiros*. Then head up to Ribeiro Frio – don't miss the Vereda dos Balcões hike there. And you'll still have time to catch the sunset at Pico do Areeiro and end the day with a delightful dinner at Abrigo do Pastor, one of the most authentic dining spots in Madeira. It's housed in a mountain hut in the Camacha region.

Describe for us your perfect day in Madeira. In summer, I'd kick off the day with a visit to the beach, and Seixal's charming blacksand beach is my top pick. Afterward, I'd head to Paul do Mar for a couple of drinks while waiting for the sunset. Paul do Mar is a laid-back coastal village on the island's southwestern coast that's popular for surfing and its seaside bars and cafés. To wrap up the day, I'd enjoy dinner at one of the many delightful restaurants in Funchal's Zona Velha, the historical part of the capital.

How would you characterise the locals? Madeirans are incredibly welcoming. We take pride in showcasing our beautiful island and try hard to ensure visitors feel at home. Our gatherings are lively, with plenty of food, drinks, and vibrant celebration that makes everyone feel like family.

Which restaurants and bars do you recommend for local flavours?

For a taste of Madeira, head to *Taberna* da Poncha in Ribeira Brava to sample poncha, our iconic local cocktail. It's made with aguardente de cana (sugarcane rum), honey, sugar, and freshly squeezed citrus juice, typically lemon or orange. If you're craving espetada (meat skewer), family-run Parada dos Eucaliptos on the way to Curral das Freiras is a must. For seafood lovers, Tasquinha do Pescador in Canical is the place to be - don't leave without trying the limpets and garlic shrimp.

How would you describe Madeira's wine scene, and what sets Madeira wine apart from others?

Madeira is renowned for its fortified wine, a tradition that's over two centuries old. What makes our fortified wines unique is the volcanic soil, which gives them a sharp acidity that balances the sweetness and keeps the wines lively. The aging process in warm oak barrels adds caramel and nutty notes. But recently, our still wines - whether white, red, rosé, or sparkling – have also reached impressive quality. We also produce excellent rum and, more recently, apple cider has entered the scene.

Where's the best place to enjoy Madeira's wines?

I always suggest visiting Blandy's Wine Lodge in Funchal. It's like a theme park for Madeira wine, offering an immersive experience where you can learn about its rich history and witness the entire production process. Plus, the tasting room lets you savour some of the finest bottles the island has to offer.

On a Monday afternoon, I walk through a park in central Riga. The most powerful storm registered in Latvia in the past 60 years has just ripped through the city the night before. The park has suffered significant damage and feels as if it has witnessed a small apocalypse. I've been listening to Richard Wagner's works recently, and I catch myself smiling and thinking that perhaps it was Wagner, and not a storm, that tore through the park. Wagner is one of Tarmo Peltokoski's favourite composers. I'm on my way to meet him for a conversation, and now that the storm is over and splashes of sun are bathing the park again, motifs from the prelude to *Tristan und Isolde* are running through my head.

The funny thing is, Wagner really may have walked in this same park during his time in Riga. From 1837 to 1839, the German composer served as the Kapellmeister at the Riga City Theatre at what is now Riharda Vāgnera iela 4 in the Old Town, and he lived in a wooden building on the corner of present-day Brīvības iela and Dzirnavu iela, just a block from the park. Therefore, his path to the theatre could very likely have led through Vērmane Garden, as this park is known.

Wagner was invited to Riga by the theatre's director, Karl Eduard von Holtei, and the Riga City Theatre went on to become an important venue in European cultural life, hosting concerts by Franz Liszt, Anton Rubinstein, Clara Schumann, Hector Berlioz, and other prominent musicians of the time. In 1863, the theatre moved to the site of the present-day Latvian National Opera and Ballet. The building, designed by Ludwig Bohnstedt in a Hellenised Classical style, burned down in 1882 and reopened in its present form in 1887.

While in Riga, Wagner composed the first act of his opera *Rienzi* (premiered in 1842 in Dresden), but at the Riga City Theatre he mainly conducted operas by Gluck, Mozart, Cherubini, and Spontini. To improve his financial situation, he also organised concerts of symphonic music at the House of the Blackheads, but he was not satisfied with the income nor the audiences in Riga.

Having been pursued by creditors, he soon fled Riga with his wife Minna and his Newfoundland dog named Robber. Heinrich Dorn, the next chief conductor at the Riga City Theatre, is said to have commented: 'There were no serious objections to Wagner as Kapellmeister, but his distinctly artistic character did not know how to conform to civic relationships once they were limited by credit and debit.'

It is believed that Wagner drew inspiration for the construction of his theatre in Bayreuth, Germany, from the layout of the Riga City Theatre: the darkened auditorium, the orchestra pit, and the amphitheatre-like elevation. A tradition of regular concert performances of Wagner's operas became established in Riga as well, and this later proved to have a huge cultural impact, with the Riga Wagner Society (headed by Carl Friedrich Glasenapp) playing an important role. Currently under renovation, the Riga City Theatre building will reopen to the public in 2026. It will be known as the Wagner House and will house a concert hall and a museum dedicated to Wagner. It will also serve as the home for two of Latvia's most prominent ensembles, the Kremerata Baltica chamber orchestra and the State Choir 'Latvija'.

Just a few minutes' walk from the Wagner House in Riga's Old Town is the Great Guild, which is the home of the Latvian National Symphony Orchestra and the heart of classical music concert life in Riga. Originally built at the beginning of the 13th century, the structure was last reconstructed in the early 20th century. After a fire in 1963, it was adapted to the needs of a concert hall, but this summer, it was again closed for renovation.

Peltokoski, a young Finnish musical genius, has served as the music and artistic director of the LNSO for the past two seasons. We don't know exactly what Riga audiences thought about Wagner during his time in Riga, but almost 200 years later, this Finnish conductor is adored by audiences in the Latvian capital, which seem ready to smash chairs after his every performance, as if after a rock concert. Including me. The mania has even reached the point where it doesn't matter what the orchestra is performing; one just has to be there. It's a must.

Since the arrival of Peltokoski, the LNSO has become less fettered and is in great shape. And Peltokoski, who is only 24, is flying high. He's the music director designate of the Orchestre National du Capitole de Toulouse, the principal guest conductor of the Rotterdam Philharmonic Orchestra, and the first-ever principal guest conductor of



the Deutsche Kammerphilharmonie Bremen. His first album was released this May, for which, together with the Bremen orchestra, he recorded three Mozart symphonies – Nos. 35, 36, and 40 – as well as three strikingly imaginative and individual solo piano improvisations. He became the youngest conductor on *Deutsche Grammophon's* roster when he signed an exclusive contract with the label last year. And I'm not even going into the reviews he's received from the international press. Although the one I love the most is very simple: 'Watch out – here comes the genius!'

Mozart and Wagner are Peltokoski's favourite composers. As a matter of fact, it was the end of <code>Siegfried</code>'s third act and the duet between Brünnhilde and Siegfried, which he saw on <code>YouTube</code>, that made him fall in love with Wagner's music. He was ll. Now, at 24, he's conducting in the same city where Wagner did, and I see a curious coincidence – Riga is the place where both of these men established themselves as conductors. We're lucky here that Peltokoski has agreed to stay with the LNSO for one more season. That season opens on September 2l with a concert in Rēzekne in eastern Latvia.

Peltokoski began studying conducting at the age of l4 under the legendary Finnish conductor Jorma Panula, but first he learned to play piano and became a pianist. His grandmother was a vocal teacher and had a piano at home, and that's where he spent a good deal of his time as a kid. He used to place Donald Duck comics in front of him on the piano and composed music for the drawings. He doesn't do that anymore.

However, the walk in the park to meet Peltokoski is not actually 'a walk in the park' for me. I physically have to overcome the obstacles in my way and the conversation with Peltokoski that afternoon is also not effortless. We meet at the restaurant in the *Neiburgs Hotel* in the Old Town. He later apologises for not being an easy interviewee: 'I feel very tired.'

A couple of days after our conversation, I have a chance of observing a rehearsal for a concert performance of *Götterdämmerung* (the last of the operas in Wagner's *Ring des Nibelungen* cycle), which takes place in the Cēsis Concert Hall in early August. I spend about an hour listening

to how Peltokoski patiently goes over the same measures again and again. This type of rehearsal is called a revision. There are 78 musicians on stage, all of whom are reverently following his hand movements. He hums along. He jokes: 'This episode actually began 15 hours ago, and now we've arrived at its solution, finally.' He turns around and asks a hipsterish guy sitting in the middle of the auditorium what it sounds like to him. Mikael Loponen, who is Peltokoski's assistant for this concert performance, sits at a little table with a small, dim lamp and is following every line in the *Götterdämmerung* score. He responds that the second and third trombones should play a bit louder ('add one more forte'), but the first trombone should remain as is. I'm in awe... and I feel I'm in the middle of something very special.

When were you approached with the offer to conduct the LNSO, and what tempted you to come to Riga? It was about three years ago, when I was originally invited to come. I was at the very beginning of my career then and didn't conduct many concerts, so of course, I was instantly excited to come and work here. The actual offer to become chief conductor was made immediately after my first concert with the LNSO, in January 2022, and it was made public in May 2022. I began as artistic director in November.

By now, Riga feels like home, I love it here. Honestly, it's more beautiful here than in Finland. I mean, the very historical centre of Riga is more interesting than in Helsinki, and the architecture is prettier than in the centre of Helsinki. But it's very close – the flight is just an hour long – and the people are very similar.

The conductor's job is to guide the orchestra in one direction, because otherwise...

You mean in terms of mentality? Yeah, we don't speak very much.

Since you've been here, the concerts at the Great Guild Hall have been sold out.

Well... let's not forget that the hall is very small. So I don't think it's surprising that it's sold out. It's just that there aren't that many seats.

I was instead driving at the fact that, with your energy and passion, you've changed the crowd and proved that classical music is not out of fashion and not only for the older generations.

Hmm... I don't know about that, really. For example, in Asia, and specifically in Hong Kong, which I know now very well, the audiences are very young. Maybe it's a cultural thing? At the same time, South Korean pop music is seen as being cool, which I completely disagree with, by the way. But maybe only because I don't know anything about it.

For me the most important thing is that the hall is full; then I'm happy. Even if it's only full of people who have grey hair. After all, people have more time when they retire, more time to do what they want and to pursue their interests; that's always been the case

How do you feel the audience? Do you sense it at all while you're conducting?

It depends. Of course, when a phone goes off, I hear that, but generally speaking, I'm only focusing on the music and musicians, and I can't really think about the audience. I only do my thing and hope that someone likes it. Of course, when the audience is completely silent, that's the best.

You work with several orchestras, each quite different from the rest.

Yes, they're always different. It's not that I can plan or deliberately decide what to do with them – the best approach to each mostly comes intuitively. I get to know orchestras slowly, and hopefully I also learn what works and what doesn't.

You decided to become a conductor at a very young age but fell for Wagner's music even earlier. What drew you to his music back then?

In that moment? I still don't know... People have been wondering about this for over 150 years. There have been hundreds of books written about it, and I've read quite a few of them (*laughs*), but it's still not easy to put it in words.

You were a trained pianist but chose the path of a conductor. Where was the magic for you?

It's the orchestra, the orchestral sound and orchestral repertoire, especially operatic repertoire. But it's highly important that I played piano first, and I still do. Because otherwise it wouldn't be possible or wise to be trained as a conductor; you simply have to be a musician. Otherwise you can't really conduct. It's very important that I still keep playing piano, that I actually make sound myself, which I don't do as a conductor. People think that that's the way, but it's not. I don't think there's magic really; I think the job is mystified a little too much.

But listen... after that concert in which the LNSO performed the overture from *Tristan und Isolde* and Mahler's Symphony No. 2, I couldn't get out of that mode for days! Well, I'm very happy to hear that, but it's the music, not the conducting.

It's interesting, though, because you're supposed to be the one who drives the orchestra through the music and sets the tone and speed.

Practically, yes, but of course, it's the composer who wrote it. My job then is to bring it together, because the orchestra is a large group of individuals, they're people, very different people with different opinions and in different moods. The conductor's job is to guide them in one direction, because otherwise... A hundred people can do anything, and it can go in every direction.

Do you remember your first concert, your debut?

I don't know which one officially counts, there have been many,

but there was one three years ago in Bremen with the Deutsche Kammerphilharmonie Bremen. It was my first concert with that particular orchestra, and I'll never forget it. I had conducted professionally a few times before, but then I was still studying and wanting to get there; but with the Bremen orchestra it felt very different. I felt something special. This orchestra is still very special for me. We've recorded my first album together - three Mozart symphonies.

Not only Wagner, but Mozart is also your favourite composer. Two completely different composers. Yes, but what they have in common is that their main works are operas. Of course, I recorded symphonies by Mozart, but I think – and it's not only me – that his most important works are his operas. Wagner wrote nothing else. And I think Mozart should always be approached as an operatic composer.

I understand that you're looking to conduct operas. Yes, absolutely.

I find it quite fascinating that you sing your operas, too.

Yes, that's how I study them. Everyone should do it! I mean, everyone who wants to be a conductor (laughs).

So, this week I'm doing Götterdämmerung in Cēsis, which is a 4.5-hour-long opera. I'm sure someone has counted the words, but it's a lot of words (*laughs*), and you can't learn them by reading them. OK, I'm sure someone can, but that would take infinitely longer. What I've done with Götterdämmerung is that over the years I've played it on the piano and have sung every role. By doing that over and over again, I've just learned it. For me, that's really the right way to learn a piece that's that huge... To feel it with my fingertips.

You mentioned the recording of Mozart's symphonies. I was very pleasantly surprised, and I did enjoy you improvising on Symphony No. 40. But in general, there's not much improvising in classical music.

Of course there is! I even make the orchestra improvise! Although in a very small capacity. For example, when Mozart wants you to repeat a phrase. We know what that means in classical music - that the second time around you should do something different. We've already heard it once, and why would we want to hear it once again in the same exact way? Isn't that a little bit boring? Change something, make it more interesting! Fresh and inspiring! I always encourage musicians to just add something themselves. There's a lot of that on the CD.

This was your first CD. How did you enjoy the process?

Well, it was terrible... It was very stressful. We were in the studio for a week, and that's a long time, but it still feels that it wasn't enough. Production was terrible, and then I had to listen to what I'd done and then I hated everything I heard. No, it was not enjovable at all.

Would you say you're self-critical?

Of course! If we're not self-critical, then what are we? How can one learn otherwise?

What for you is a great concert? Or do you always feel that something more could have been done?

I'm rarely happy. Sometimes I'm not happy at all but the audience is very excited. Sometimes it's the other way around. It's weird... I feel one thing, but others feel something completely different.

Any other ideas about future albums?

There's nothing official yet, but I've always been fascinated by the great British composer Ralph Vaughan Williams; it's great music. I'll be recording some of his music, but I have no idea when those records might come out. There are some plans, but they're happening slowly.

What are the things you enjoy outside of classical music? There are quite many... I'm always looking forward to going



home and not having to get on an airplane, not being in a hotel room. But instead to see friends, to see actual people. Old friends. People whom I've known for years and who knew me before all this.

I love to watch films. I used to be quite specialised in cinema, it's just that nowadays it's quite difficult to find time for them, because films are so long and you can't skip some parts of them. When travelling to different cities, it's nice, of course, to go to museums. I don't do that enough. But little by little... I'm fascinated by great cities such as Rome, where you can see literally everything on the streets. I'm generally fascinated by history, especially British history, for some reason.

I'd love to read more and to discuss films and books with friends. I love to write. Just, you know... to educate myself. Things like that...

Simple things.

Yeah... I don't need more than that. Things that are sort of a little bit more normal than flying and staying in hotel rooms.

What keeps you getting on those planes?

By now I just have to. Because I can't not go due to binding contracts. And, of course, because of the music itself.

I probably seem a little slow today, but that's normal, because with this sort of lifestyle you're always tired. It's not a very nice feeling, so I hope to fix that.

But I know you also feel fortunate that you're doing what you've always wanted to do.

Yes... Many people want to do this; I certainly always wanted to. But there are things nothing is taught about, and those you really have to find out for yourself. You don't get warned about certain things before you actually get into them. Like, that sometimes too much is too much. Or, how tired one might be. Or, with this lifestyle how easily one gets lonely, and when one's lonely for long enough, one gets sad. That's not good for music. I hope I'm young enough to be able to fix things before they go really badly. Or very sadly.

There has to be happiness in life outside of that one-and-a-half hours on stage

But then where do you find the contentment, the satisfaction? If you're in a location for a week, and there are only two concerts, or just one, that's still a very short time compared to the rest of the week. So, there has to be happiness in life outside of that one-and-a-half hours when you're on stage. Otherwise life would be really terrible. So, I'm trying to find that.

What's on for the coming season with the LNSO? The orchestra will be performing in various other venues due to the Great Guild Hall being under reconstruction.

The season opening concert we'll do in Rēzekne on September 21. We'll do Vaughan Williams' Symphony No. 7, which is called the 'Sinfonia Antartica' – officially the coldest piece of music in the world, a very interesting piece. He initially wrote music for a film called *Scott of the Antarctic*. It's about an expedition to the South Pole that went horribly wrong, and everyone died. He wrote the music for the film, and then he reworked it into a symphony. Plus, we're doing *The Planets*, the very famous piece by his best friend, Gustav Holst. Which John Williams later stole from him for *Star Wars*.

Later, I'll be playing a chamber recital with violinist Vineta Sareika – two violin sonatas, and I'll be accompanying her. If I practise enough. Then I must advertise a fascinating concert that will take place in Riga in October. My teacher Jorma Panula, who is 94 years old, will be conducting Sibelius. That will be very interesting. Then I'll do a concert in November with the music of Richard Strauss, Claude Debussy, and Olivier Messiaen. In December, we'll do Shostakovich's 'Leningrad', which is a very loud piece of music.

Your life is scheduled years in advance. It is. Which is both easy and terrifying.





The former imperial city of Marrakesh has gracefully evolved into a vibrant centre of creativity and modernity. Back in Marrakesh, the new Izza luxury design hotel has quickly made a name for itself, earning a spot on Condé Nast Traveler's Best Hotels in Marrakesh 2024 list. Set in seven interconnected riads in the historic medina, *Izza* draws inspiration from creative icons of the 1950s, 60s, and 70s, including Jack Kerouac, Jimi Hendrix, and Grace Jones, as well as renowned Marrakesh architect Bill Willis. The hotel also boasts an impressive art collection worth five million British pounds.

Also of note is the recently opened Farasha Farmhouse, which is a fresh take on the classic guesthouse. Just a 30-minute drive from Marrakesh's historical centre, this former artist's residence has been transformed into a peaceful retreat surrounded by an ancient olive grove at the foot of the Jbel Toubkal mountains. Farasha Farmhouse offers a tranquil escape where guests can reconnect with nature, relax in serene surroundings, and explore local crafts.

For a unique piece of Marrakesh to take home, look no further than Lalla's effortlessly chic bags. Handmade by local artisans in Marrakesh's ateliers, these stylish designs capture the essence of Moroccan craftsmanship and elegance.

NICE. FRANCE A contemporary era of luxury




a wine cellar, and beautifully cultivated terrace gardens.

Athens is a city deeply rooted in ancient history while at the same time embracing a vibrant future. A new wave of Czech designers is redefining the country's rich heritage of furniture, glass, and porcelain craftsmanship. *Deelive* design stores,







including the latest in Brno-město, celebrate local talent with a diverse selection of home accessories, tableware, jewellery, and fashion. Meanwhile, *Modernista*, with four showrooms in Prague, offers authorised reproductions of early 20th-century works of art alongside contemporary pieces in glass and porcelain as well as jewellery.

For a taste of traditional Czech cuisine with a modern twist, head to $V\acute{y}\check{c}ep$, a Michelin-recommended restaurant that embodies a 'from nature to the plate' philosophy. Chef Vojtěch Petržela and his team source ingredients from trusted local farmers to create homemade breads, cheeses, salami, sauerkraut, and compotes using time-honoured methods. Complement your meal with a selection of exceptional Czech beers, including the renowned $Dale\check{s}ick\acute{e}$ pivo. **bo**







Long influenced by the Ottomans and situated on a Silk Road trading route, Upper Adjara remains a rugged and remote destination. With sweeping vistas, medieval landmarks, steep hillside vineyards, and pastoral scenes, it's an explorer's paradise and a stark contrast to the glitzy allure of Batumi.





In truth, many microwineries here have adopted artisanal practices, making this winemaking scene one to watch. For those wondering where to find wines from these micro-wineries, dedicated shops and bars in Tbilisi, such as Saamuri Wines in the venerable Fabrika and Craft Wine on Egnate Ninoshvili Street, offer delightful tasting experiences you might never have imagined.
- Alazani Valley offer plenty of opportunities to relax and reset your priorities. Nothing is more invigorating than a poolside glass of the local pétillant naturel while gazing at the breathtaking slopes of the Caucasus Mountains.

 Visiting during the grape harvest, or Rtveli, at the end of September is an excellent time to experience the region and even offers the opportunity to do some hands-on harvesting.




- \blacktriangleright Tbilisi's Gardenia Shevardnadze embodies the Georgian love of the home as a garden. This stunning venue combines aesthetics with a plant nursery, providing a spectacular setting for social events and weddings. Inspired by the heritage of Guria, Georgia's smallest region (but one that is incredibly rich in culture and natural wonders), Gardenia Shevardnadze captures the essence of this area's lush flora, mysterious and decaying silk factories, and incredible mountain roads that literally take you above the clouds.
- ▼ Mountain trekking, skiing, and horseback riding are the main attractions for the adventurous in Georgia. From the highlands of the north to the south, there are endless opportunities for thrillseekers to satisfy their adrenaline cravings all year round. For













- ▲ Frescoes are an enduring feature of almost all chapels, churches, and monastic cave cities in Georgia. This small chapel near Mukuzani vividly demonstrates the meticulous detail with which each biblical scene is depicted. Whatever your religious beliefs, these unique paintings reflect the deep connection locals have with their Orthodox faith, one of the oldest in Christendom.
- ▲► Market visits in Georgia reveal a vibrant tableau of local culinary delights. From fresh and exotic fruit and vegetables to bundles of mysterious herbs, jars of tkemali (plum sauce), adjika, an array of spices, and even loose tobacco, Georgian markets offer a feast for the senses. And the watermelons are so delicious that even this jaded writer finds great pleasure in them.
- A visit to the house of the artist Niko Pirosmani in the tranquil village of Mirzaani, nestled on the slopes of the Gombori Range, offers more than a glimpse of history. Situated between the walled town of Signaghi and the rugged outpost of Dedoplistskaro, the house, which is now a museum, also rewards visitors with stunning views. bo







With an international airport in the capital, Moldova is a convenient destination. The airport mediates flights between western Europe, eastern Europe, and the Middle East with an average flight time of a couple of hours. In addition, the city centre is located a mere 25-minute car ride away from the airport, so it's easy to get to the city without spending too much time in traffic.

The charm of Chisinau

The Moldovan capital of Chisinau features a unique combination of green scenery, culture, and authenticity, all mixed with a dose of novelty. The city has a rich history dating back to the 15th century and has undergone Ottoman, Russian, and Soviet influence. The city is constantly evolving, and in recent years it has founded a new art centre, built modern residential quarters, and upgraded several remains from the past.

Chisinau is also full of intriguing museums. For example, the National Museum of the History of Moldova tells the country's story from ancient times to the present day, while the National Art Museum of Moldova is a must to explore the local art scene.

When the weather is nice, locals here enjoy the sun outside. Numerous parks are scattered throughout the city, with the most prominent being Ştefan cel Mare Park, which is named after Stephen the Great, the prince of Moldova in the l5th century and one of the founding fathers of the nation. On most weekends, locals gather there for a dance evening.

Undeniable hospitality

It's impossible to meet an unfriendly Moldovan – they'll invite you to their home, treat you with delicious treats from the cellar, and even give you an additional portion to bring home to your loved ones. Welcoming guests is a sacred duty for people here, and this is especially evident in rural areas. If you visit a guest house, there's a high chance that you'll become best friends with the owner, taste their homemade wine, and meet half of their family.

Ease of communication

While generosity and smiling are universal languages and Moldovans are fluent in them, Moldova is a convenient destination thanks to the very minimal language barrier for travellers from most European countries. The official language of Moldova is Romanian, but many locals also speak English, French, and/or Russian. Moldova's population also includes speakers of Gagauz, Bulgarian, and Ukrainian, and this language mix ensures a unique blend of cultures.

Heartwarming food

Moldovan food is hearty, homegrown, and every hostess' greatest pride. Fans of pastries will love the delicious *plăcintă*, which can be savoury or sweet, with fillings such as cheese and potatoes, apples, cherries, and pumpkin. Because Moldova is famous for its wine and a great variety of grapes, it should come as no surprise that *sarmale*, or grape leaves stuffed with meat, rice, and spices, are a beloved Moldovan snack. Every family also has its own recipe for















zeama, a delicious chicken noodle soup made completely from scratch, with the methods for preparing the broth, the noodles, and even cutting the chicken being unique to each family.

The world of wine

Wine is one of Moldova's main export products, and almost every town has a winery to visit and explore. Therefore, a visit to Moldova must be accompanied by a wine tasting. As wine is one of the main pillars of the Moldovan lifestyle, every October the capital of Chisinau turns into a wine festival. Wine tastings, tours, cultural performances, cheerful people – the city has it all. This year the festival will take place on October 5 and 6. Find out more at wineofmoldova.com.

Cherished traditions

The people of Moldova actively cultivate their traditions and are more than happy to share their joy of them with guests. Moldovans nurture their folklore and craftsmanship. For example, the richly embroidered traditional blouse known as the *ie* is a significant symbol of Moldovan and Romanian cultural heritage and is a statement piece in every Moldovan's wardrobe as well as a unique souvenir.

This pride in local culture also extends to experiences and celebrations. On March l, people in Moldova celebrate the arrival of spring and give each other small red-and-white *mărţişor* in the form of flowers. When they see their first blooming tree, they tie the *mărţişor* around a branch on the tree to welcome the warm season.

Astonishing nature

Moldova provides a fairytale-like green landscape, with luscious meadows, accessible forests, beautiful rivers, and limestone cliffs. Moldovan ancestors treasured this stunning natural environment, so accordingly, certain hills and forests hide charming churches and monasteries, making every visit a sacred and breathtaking one.

Historical remains

The rural town of Orheiul Vechi is a calm wonder in the middle of Moldova that features a peaceful landscape of green hills, rivers, meadows, and even ruins from the Ottoman Empire and ancient bathhouses. The town is well-preserved in its historical state to reflect how people lived back in the day, including colourful wells, small family houses, and narrow streets that overlook the valleys. Nearby is a hilltop monastery to visit.

Rural tourism

To fully explore Moldova, one should head beyond the main cities and wander through the small villages. Agro-tourism is experiencing a renaissance here. Stay overnight at an eco-resort and learn about organic farming, go hiking, and enjoy a nature tour. Many resorts also offer traditional cooking classes, folk dance practices, and birdwatching. With a smile, gratitude, and heartfelt care for their guests, the local families invite visitors to their homes to share their favourite home-cooked food and even rituals.

Moreover, they love them so much we even consider them our personal fridge, one-stop-shop, and even hotel for when we need a good night's sleep in the fresh air.

In early spring you might see locals drilling small holes in birch trees to get the delicious birch juice, while later in June they go crazy collecting sweet wild strawberries, leafy branches for sauna rituals, and natural decorations for the Midsummer celebration. Late summer and early autumn are the best times to find locals in the forests with small mushroom knives, while in December they bring the whole family into the forest to seek out a special Christmas tree for their home – a must-do Latvian tradition.

When asked about his or her beloved mushroom spots, the usually calm and cool Latvian turns into a protective sentry. Those spots are sacred and shared only with one's closest family members! Even people who don't eat mushrooms are passionate about this Latvian form of geocaching. However, according to Kārlis Taukačs, a senior forest planner with Latvia's State Forests (LVM), there's really no such thing as good or bad mushroom spots it all depends on the type of forest. Latvia has three types of forests, and the locally beloved boletus grows best $\,$ among firs, or so-called Christmas trees. Mushrooms also thrive in pine forests, while various berries, including bilberries, lingonberries, and even raspberries, can be found in glades.

What's more, just locating a particular type of forest doesn't necessarily mean that it's full of these specific treats. A lot also depends on the health of the forest, the amount of light, the humidity, and other factors. 'For example, boletus mushrooms need forests that are approximately 20 to 40 years old,' says Taukačs. 'Therefore, a family's current favourite mushroom spot may no longer be as productive 20 years from now.' A forest changes rapidly, and the glade that brought mouthwatering wild strawberries one year may produce the sweetest raspberries the next year.

But before you grab a knife and head to the nearest forest to put this useful information to use, make sure you know your forest delicacies. Buying a book on mushroom ABCs is one way to go. Many Latvians, though, have learned about the local mushrooms and berries at their mother's (or other relative's) knee and know how to avoid any 'once in a lifetime' experiences.

Latvians have been linked to the forest for ages, but different generations put different meanings and importance on forests. Whenever a Latvian senses the aroma of *vaivariņš* or wild rosemary (*Rhododendron tomentosum*), for example, they're immediately mentally transported back to their childhood and their grandmother's apartment, where wild rosemary was used to protect against







moths. In the past, strolling through the forest as if through a local market was a necessity, and this beneficial relationship with forests is also deeply embedded in Latvian folklore.

'Interaction with forests has long been reflected in Latvian mythology, as we have goddesses for every forest phenomenon,' says Latvian folklore scientist Janīna Kursīte-Pakule. 'Mothers' of the wind, forest, berries, and mushrooms are just a few of the deities the ancient Latvians revered. There were also various beliefs and superstitions that people took into account before entering a forest. For example, when going mushroom-hunting, they kept their knives behind their backs, otherwise the mushrooms would get scared and hide. Forests were also closely linked with certain beliefs about fertility, health, and even magic and fortune-telling.

Even though most people today no longer believe the old superstitions and sayings, one popular expression still embodying Latvians' love for forests and the goods they produce is *ej bekot*, or literally 'go mushroom hunting'. It means 'leave me alone' or 'get lost' and is something a Latvian might tell someone who's invading their personal space to shoo them away. But deep down, Latvians are kind at heart. While our stares may seem cold, and even when we send someone far away, we still want them to have the best of luck in hunting for mushrooms.

In our ever-changing modern world, many people wonder how long this carefree culture of enjoying forest delicacies can continue to exist. Luckily, in Latvia, one should not be worried. 'Latvia has doubled the size of its forests in the past 100 years,' emphasises Pēters Putniņš, the CEO of LVM. 'That

makes us unique in Europe and showcases that even today's Latvians are keen on sustaining this historical link.'

The love for forests and everything one finds in them flows through the generations. It is also the case that almost all forests in Latvia today are managed. To protect forests, make them accessible for years to come, and ensure the necessary biodiversity, LVM annually renews around 1.2 % of the forest properties it owns. That way, there's always a grand variety of forest types and ages and exquisite delicacies provided by Mother Nature. Latvia is also one of the few countries where forests are fully accessible to the public. Berry picking, mushroom hunting, strolling in the fresh air, sleeping in a tent, building a campfire – all of this is allowed as long as you treat nature with respect and leave it untouched (except for your basketful of edible goodies).

Yes, Latvians are obsessed with forests and what they provide for the table and home. But that doesn't mean they live in the past. After all, even the Latvian fertility symbol called Jumis consists of two spikes of grain: one looking towards the future, the other reminiscing about the past. This attitude is visible throughout the land, with buzzing cities meeting natural forests, untouched bogs bordering well-maintained campsites, relaxation spots set up near wild beaches...

Life goes on, and Latvians find more advanced knives and orienteering equipment, but on weekends they still wind up in the forest to meet their true inner selves.

True to Estonia's reputation as a digital nation, there are no more paper or plastic cards; the city pass is now in a handy app.

The Tallinn Card is a smart, all-inone sightseeing pass that gives you access to free public transport and more than 50 of the best museums and attractions in the city.

Additionally, when your card is active, it also offers a number of discounts on tours and attractions as well as at restaurants and shops.

When you get your Tallinn Card in the mobile app, you can also enjoy personalised recommendations for sights and museums to visit based on your interests, likes, and favourites in the app. Add all your favourites to an itinerary to make sure you don't miss anything you'd want to visit. Stay up to date

with all the information about the museums and attractions that you plan to visit, including opening times, ticket prices, and a detailed description of what to expect.

There's also a convenient map feature that helps you find your way to all the points of interest so that you don't miss any hidden gems or great deals. Integrated with *Google Maps* and *Apple Maps*, the app makes navigating around the cobblestone streets of Tallinn that much easier. The app also works without an internet connection.

In 2023, the most-visited museum with the Tallinn Card was Seaplane Harbour, with its impressive display of maritime history artefacts, including a 1930s submarine. The museum offers lots of activities for children and is extremely popular with families. Another great place for exploring Tallinn's maritime history as well as an impressive view of the city is the Maritime Museum at Fat Margaret Tower.

At the Kiek in de Kök Fortifications Museum, explore four medieval city wall towers, underground bastion passages, and the Carved Stone Museum. The museum's permanent exhibition introduces the history of the formation of Tallinn and its fortifications. This is a place where history fans can really imagine the life of the soldiers and knights who once used these walls and towers to protect the city of Tallinn.

Make use of the free public transport that your Tallinn Card provides and explore a bit further from the city centre. For example, take to the heights at Tallinn TV Tower! The impressive 170-metre-high platform offers wonderful views of the city, the sea, and the green nature of Tallinn. On the other side of Tallinn you'll find the peaceful Rocca al Mare district, home to the Tallinn Zoo and the Estonian Open Air Museum.

Or hop on a historic tram in the city centre and in less than half an hour you'll find yourself in the 18th-century Kadriorg Park and Kadriorg Palace built by Tsar Peter I of Russia and named in honour of his wife, Catherine I. Today, the Baroque-era palace houses the Art Museum of Estonia's foreign collection. The collection of classical and contemporary Estonian art is held in the neighbouring KUMU Art Museum, which you can also access for free with your Tallinn Card.

You can rely on the Tallinn Card to keep you up to date with events in the city or scheduling changes in the opening times of museums. That way you'll always be on top of your itinerary. With the Tallinn Card app in your pocket, you're guaranteed a convenient, enjoyable, and affordable stay in Tallinn. 





A timeless European treasure







TURNING WOOL INTO ENVELOPES AND CALL BOOTHS

For years, Katrin Kabun, a doctoral student at the Estonian Academy of Arts (EKA), has been working to study the properties of wool and the ways in which it can be applied in interior design.

In an increasingly urbanised society, in which people spend their days in synthetic environments, plagued by ventilation issues and associated health problems, Kabun believes there are answers. The aim of her doctoral work is to examine the properties and potential uses of wool as a substitute for widely used synthetic textiles. Kabun has been undertaking her PhD at EKA since 2017, but her interest in wool – as well as sheep – goes back nearly two decades, when she stumbled upon the existence of native Estonian sheep, which over time have been intensely replaced by foreign breeds.

The small Estonian sheep had mostly disappeared during the Soviet era, but with help from the Estonian Native Sheep Association, Kabun found local farmers still raising them. Supported by UNESCO, she confirmed they were a unique breed through analyses made in Estonia and Finland.

In 2006, Kabun discovered that sheep farmers were discarding wool, treating it in essence as an industrial waste product. And because the sheep need to be sheared once or twice a year, there was an enormous amount of that discarded wool. 'But wool is a unique material. Unfortunately, this is not just an Estonian problem; the discarding of wool

happens all over the world,' she says. Seeing an opportunity, her designer's mind began to turn: 'I saw a problem and knew I had to solve it.'

Inspired, Kabun earned a master's degree in economics at the Tallinn University of Technology (TalTech) and later a degree in textile design at EKA in 2017. While textile design is her true passion, economics is crucial for her doctoral thesis. But there was an interesting challenge when she embarked on her study of the use of wool in textile design, namely, there was a lack of scientific literature. There were no articles,' she recalls. 'Now there are more that are focused more intensively on this issue, but I couldn't understand why people weren't publishing about it.'

Kabun's interest in wool was not solely linked to the agricultural waste issue that first piqued her interest. 'It has great properties,' she says, noting the material's softness, elasticity, moisture absorption, water repellence, and antibacterial properties. 'In fact, wool is a natural, hi-tech material,' she adds.

Kabun's doctoral thesis, entitled Rehabilitation of Wool: Implementing Archaic Fiber in a Modern Design Context, explores the potential to apply wool in fields outside of its traditional use. Kabun also



to find an answer.'

Kabun characterises her thesis as creative research, involving collaborations across disciplines with various specialists to find the best solutions. 'This is all very interesting on the one hand,' she notes, 'but on the other hand, a lot of time and energy is spent on side activities, searching and coordinating.'

Kabun is also the co-founder of Woola, a Tallinnbased company that uses wool collected from sheep farmers to produce packaging material. In addition, she sees potential use cases in interior design, emphasising that the air quality in modern apartments is often poor due to the use of materials that emit chemicals.

At Woola, almost all of the raw materials used are made from wool, but the company still uses natural binding materials for some products, such as envelopes. However, Woola is striving to go 100% wool as a source material, by also creating its binding agents from wool. 'One hundred percent wool means 100% biodegradable,' Kabun explains.

Another interesting use for wool was highlighted in a partnership with Silen, a furniture company based near Tallinn that manufactures call booths. Together, Kabun and Silen created two booths, one made of wool, the other made of a synthetic material. The two booths were installed at EKA, and their indoor climate quality was measured. Users of the booths were also asked to fill out surveys. 'In

general, people felt better in the wool environment. People don't think about it,' adds Kabun, 'but they can feel it.' The study with Silen is ongoing.

Going forward, Kabun says that her research has raised more questions that will need to be addressed. One is related to material development and creating new sustainable solutions by modifying wool. Another line of research relates to the effects of wool on the psyche and body. 'The tests carried out provided interesting inputs that would need further detailed research,' she concludes. researchestonia.eu

The *Latvijas Finieris* group is a world leader in the research, development, and production of high added value birch plywood products with plants in Latvia, Lithuania, Estonia, and Finland. *Latvijas Finieris* products are sold to industrial customers in 56 countries around the world, where individual service is provided by twelve regional *Riga Wood* product development and sales companies.

'The company's growth is based on sustainably sourced wood resources from European Union member states in the Baltic Sea region and on generations of knowledge in the production of birch plywood,' says Mārtiņš Lācis, a member of the executive board at *Latvijas Finieris*.

Road transport, construction, water transport, air and rail transport – these are just some of the industries in which, due to its unique physical properties, *Latvijas Finieris* birch plywood is an essential industrial raw material. An example that best illustrates this is the use of birch plywood produced by *Latvijas Finieris* in the insulation panels of tanks on liquefied natural gas (LNG) carriers. Due to the ability of birch wood to withstand extremely low temperatures (it's -162°C inside an LNG tank), birch plywood is the only material certified for such use. In addition, there are only four companies in the world certified to service this sector, which is extremely demanding in terms of quality.

'The birch is a unique tree. Especially if it has grown in a northern climate,' says Lācis. 'Birch wood has a uniform texture, which is why it has long been used to produce a variety of high-quality products. The most technologically versatile of these is plywood, whose physical and mechanical properties, weight, and durability give it a number of advantages over hard materials as well as plywood made from other species.'

Most often, when we see a ship or a lorry driving by, walk across a parquet floor, enjoy the artificial tiles in a bathroom, or attend a large-scale event such as the Olympics or a rock concert, we do not see or realise that the structures are based on Latvian birch plywood. But in fact, this material is present at every turn in our day-to-day lives; it's just that it's mostly hidden from the eye. Birch plywood is an 'invisible' material that we can hardly live without. But those who use it know that Latvijas Finieris provides its customers with complex birch plywood product solutions tailored to their unique needs and adds value throughout the supply chain. The company's birch plywood is currently shipped to 56 destinations worldwide, the farthest of which is New Zealand. The value of this product is demonstrated by the fact that Latvijas Finieris sells on average a mere 6% of its birch plywood at home in Latvia.

'The challenge is to guess the future needs of very different customer industries. That's why we're looking in depth at various different sectors in which birch plywood is used or could potentially be used in the future. We're looking for solutions to make our products more relevant to the needs of our customers and in areas they are not yet aware of,' says Lācis, noting that last year, 31% of the company's products were registered as modifications or new products.

Investing in the development and transfer of knowledge is one of the prerequisites for successful product development and the growth of the whole company. That is why *Latvijas Finieris* has over the years established close cooperation

with scientific and educational institutions. Lācis continues: 'We're convinced that plywood products are and will continue to be one of the best and most economically viable uses of birch wood in industry. At the same time, other birch products will also play an increasing role in the development of the bioeconomy, which is why we have always looked for new applications for birch wood.' Especially because, in this complex production process, only about 2/5 of each log becomes plywood. The rest becomes a resource for various valuable by-products.

Lācis also points out that there is, and can be, no waste in the birch plywood production process each unit of wood is responsibly sent for further processing, both locally to Latvijas Finieris group subsidiaries and to partner mills and production units. In close cooperation with Latvian, Nordic, and European scientists, in recent years a number of significant practical steps have also been taken in the research and development of chemical wood processing products and technologies. One of the most visible of these is the Betulin Lab pilot plant for the extraction of birch bark extracts. The best known of these substances is biologically active, antibacterial betulin, which has potential in pharmaceuticals, cosmetics, and the food industry. Anyone interested in learning more is invited to visit the Pharmacy Museum in Riga and its exhibition devoted to betulin. Latvijas Finieris will continue to explore the unique value of the birch tree, giving it the opportunity to continue its life after the forest as diversely as possible.

A sustainable approach has for decades been an integral part of the business and culture at *Latvijas Finieris*: caring for the environment, nature, and society. This is manifested in its actions today and in thinking about the legacy it will leave to future generations.


For example, the wood used in plywood products comes from responsibly managed forests in the Baltic Sea region of the European Union. For many decades, Latvijas Finieris has produced much of the glue used in plywood at its own Chemical Production Unit. In close cooperation with industrial partners in various European countries, Latvijas Finieris is developing new methods to replace fossil raw materials in the production of adhesives with lignin, a natural component of wood. The Viobond consortium project has also received support from the Horizon 2020 European research and innovation programme, which means that these common goals are highly valued. 'We're aiming to develop an adhesive formula that's as free as possible from fossil-based ingredients,' says Lācis, embodying the hopeful outlook in which bio-based solutions will play an increasingly important role in our everyday lives.

Sustainability issues are relevant to producers across Europe from various different perspectives, and one of the most important of these is the availability of wood resources over the coming 15 to 20 years, their use in the long term,

and the use of wood products in energy, pulp production, and chemical processing. This is particularly important in countries where forests and related industries dominate the economy and are important for the general well-being of society. In implementing the European Green Deal, decision-makers have a responsibility to design effective land-use policies that balance the interests of the environment, society, national development, and businesses.

Of course, birch is not the only species of tree from which plywood is produced. The European market both imports and exports large volumes of various plywood products, and producers across Europe are feeling the effects of geopolitical events as well as economic stagnation. Even before the outbreak of the war in Ukraine, European producers were suffering from the dumping (trade at unreasonably low prices, a form of predatory pricing) of Russian-produced birch plywood. In recent years, *Latvijas Finieris* and other European producers had been forced to reduce production, close production facilities, and halt investments in development.

'To protect European Union producers against unfair trade practices, anti-dumping duties were imposed on Russian birch plywood products in 2021,' Lācis explains. 'In 2022, when Russia invaded Ukraine, the European Commission imposed tough sanctions on the aggressor, barring all wood products produced in Russia and Belarus



from entering Europe. This had a significant impact on their wood industries, as important European markets were lost. But the consequence is that Russian and Belarusian products are now sold outside Europe at inadequately low prices, while European producers in these countries are losing their competitiveness and are forced to reduce their sales or leave certain markets altogether.'

'However, the most worrying fact is that birch plywood from Russia and Belarus is still entering the European market, including Latvia, but with the country of origin changed,' Lācis continues. 'In 2023, the volume of plywood of highly questionable origin on the European Union market amounted to almost 20% of the total volume.' In response, the European Commission carried out further investigations and this year imposed additional antidumping duties on birch plywood imported from Turkey and Kazakhstan.

'In its everyday operations, *Latvijas Finieris* actively advocates for fair competition and European values, which is why we have severed all direct and indirect trade ties with aggressor countries. Yes, immediately after the outbreak of the war, this posed a major challenge in the case of certain chemical raw materials. But at this point in time, our group feels secure,' Lācis emphasises. 'Of course, we're cautious, but we're also confident about the future. Our development and growth strategy in market diversification, product development, and longterm customer relationships allows us to continue

to produce products in the current environment, provide jobs for our employees, and invest in development.'

Latvijas Finieris builds long-term relationships based on respect, professionalism, and mutual trust with its approximately 2300 employees worldwide as well as its business partners around the world. 'We're trusted and believed in – both by our employees and our business partners, and this is our company's greatest brand value,' says Lācis.

The group's parent company, AS Latvijas Finieris, is a joint stock company owned by 579 non-controlling shareholders, the majority of whom are current or former employees of the company. This largely ensures the growth of the company and professional, long-term decisions for sustainable development that are based on diverse competencies, involving all employees of the group as much as possible.

'Geopolitical events and the economic situation highlight our responsibility not only for the well-being of our employees and their families, but also in relation to the growth of the economy and the security and peace of society,' concludes Lācis. 'We have supported Ukraine and its people from day one; we want peace and democracy to prevail in Europe. Looking to the future, we're confident that the professional team at *Latvijas Finieris* is capable of driving and sustaining the long-term growth of the company in a safe and democratic environment, and that is our task.'

For more than three years now, *Olivia Restaurant* has been welcoming Rigans and guests to the city with a combination of Mediterranean and Northern traditions and foods that are not available anywhere else in Latvia.

However, the team always pays the most attention to the ingredients they use – they must be not only seasonal but also clean and organically grown. Fresh produce and ingredients are the most

important thing. They must be not only correctly grown, obtained, and delivered but also be processed correctly in our kitchen,' says the chef. 'Therefore our task is to find produce and meats of excellent quality, prepare them with respect, and serve them in an agreeable setting. In addition, it's important for us to give thought to each ingredient, from the fish and meat all the way to the mushrooms and berries, which are, for example, gathered in the forests of northern Finland. If each of the ingredients in a dish is of the highest quality, then the meal is truly delicious and enjoyable.'

Olivia Restaurant is distinct not only for its high-quality produce and unique flavours and manner of preparation, but

also for its general philosophy. Each food on the menu has a story of its own. The main menu highlights fish and seafood: the Mediterranean turbot is from the French coast, where it is raised on an organic fish farm, while the North Sea cod is caught in the Barents Sea and the shrimp are supplied from Canada. The swordfish comes from the Atlantic Ocean and sometimes takes more than 20 hours to be delivered to the restaurant. *Olivia Restaurant* is the only restaurant in Latvia to have been granted an official catch quota for bluefin tuna, leading its restaurant team to create a unique concept for Riga – a tuna menu.

The *Olivia Restaurant* team has also kept meat lovers in mind. Most of its meats come from Ireland because in addition to having been quality meat producers for many generations, the Irish are also able to ensure that the meat delivered to the restaurant is organically grown, tender, juicy, and full of flavour.

The dessert menu at *Olivia Restaurant* is not large, but each of the dishes contains refined, nuanced flavours that might even recall childhood. One of the favourite desserts at the restaurant is the caramelised Brunost,

or cheese cream with cloudberries from the Arctic – guests call it an absolute masterpiece. Another highlight is the chocolate brownie with black garlic and lingonberry sauce, which once again confirms the chef's tendency to not shy away from experimenting with various flavours and manners of preparation. It is precisely for this reason that the menu at *Olivia Restaurant* often features fermented products made on site at the restaurant, including nuts, egg yolks, and kombucha, which features in several sauces.

Olivia Restaurant is located in a two-storey wooden building dating to the 19th century in the heart of Riga's Art Nouveau district. The restaurant has taken care not only with its gastronomic offer but also its visual image. Naturally, the exterior attracts attention, but so does the well-considered interior with its subtle colours, brick walls, velvet, copper, wood, and the romance of an attic space. Because Olivia Restaurant can accommodate up to 100 guests, the restaurant's unforced informal atmosphere is ideal for meetings with friends and romantic dinners as well as for business meetings and larger celebrations.



The winning game

In May, *airBaltic* received the very significant AI Innovator Award 2024 sponsored by *PROS*, a United States-based industry leader in providing marketing, pricing, and selling tools. Every day, more than 400 million prices and 1.7 billion forecasts are driven by *PROS* products across 30 industries around the world.

The award recognises companies that leverage AI to drive exceptional outcomes, optimise operations, and foster collaboration. *airBaltic* received the award in recognition of the *PROS* AI-powered Dynamic Ancillary Pricing (DAP) solution that it uses to automate and optimise the pricing for seat assignment on its website.

One of the people from *airBaltic's* team who worked for over six months to implement this solution was Iuliia Granja Velasco, a project manager in the airline's E-Commerce Department who made sure all of *airBaltic's* requirements were taken into account.

This award sure is a huge recognition for *airBaltic* and its innovative spirit. Can you tell us more about the DAP solution? Indeed, we're very pleased that all the work we invested has paid off so well and that *PROS*, our long-term partner, is also proud of what we've achieved together.

For two years now, I've been in charge of managing the ancillaries pages at *airbaltic.com* as well as implementing the new pricing engine together with *PROS*. The idea about DAP, to implement an AI engine to improve our seat pricing strategy, came about with the aim to cut maintenance costs as well as to offer our passengers more personalised pricing based on overall demand, chosen routes, flight times, seat characteristics, and other factors. We were increasingly considering the implementation of AI, and we're happy that it turned out to be a successful project, automating our pricing system and enhancing our overall efficiency in that particular ancillary segment.

The engine behind DAP works based on AI algorithms. The project started with defining the segmentation parameters based on which the AI would determine pricing. Having fed this data into the AI, we gave it some time to learn the purchasing behaviour of our customers in real time. We don't leave the AI to operate on its own (*laughs*); it still works within the boundaries that we set according to our requirements.

The AI then studied all of the data until it finally could prepare a balanced offer to our passenger. Today, the AI solution provides a price that is closely tailored to what the customer is willing to pay for the seat. To some it may seem high, or maybe even low in some cases, but it's still a very good and balanced price, considering the particular route, day, flight time, seat type, and overall demand for the particular seat.

Now that it's up and running, how does DAP make life easier in the E-Commerce Department?

The team is pretty happy because now they have less work to do manually on the <code>Excel</code> sheets (<code>laughs</code>), which means they can now focus on other, more strategic tasks. The work is now much easier, because AI is managing it all. Most importantly, it offers more precise pricing that takes into consideration all the parameters and conditions. We're now thinking about how to utilise AI more and where else we can implement it to enjoy its advantages.

How has this award for *airBaltic* resonated with the industry? *PROS* is a huge company based in the United States, with headquarters in Houston, Texas, and we're proud to have this collaboration and that we've achieved good results.

We received the award during the PROS Outperform 2024 conference in Orlando, Florida, in the the United States. A lot of representatives from other airlines also attended the conference, and they were very interested in our experience. Everyone's looking for something innovative and new to attract more customers and increase efficiency.

Our colleagues from other airlines were literally hunting us down, eager to talk and hear about our experience. They're also thinking about how to embrace AI and how to use it to their advantage, because not only is it such a hot topic right now, but it can also be a real help.

Is this project the only thing the E-Commerce team does? Besides working closely with the Revenue Management division, our team is primarily in charge of *airBaltic's* website in terms of booking engine support, ticket sales, and merchandising of all ancillary products and services. We ensure that this process is smooth for our customers and meets all of their needs as well as ours. Revenue Management is in charge of the pricing strategy as such, while we're responsible for the whole technical part so that all the prices actually appear on the site. We also ensure that all the marketing campaigns run smoothly on our website. That requires close collaboration with the marketing



team as well. We collaborate with various departments within *airBaltic* to ensure smooth sales of our tickets and other products.

What's your own background?

In Ukraine, where I come from, I worked in the field of IT, but not in aviation; IT project management is my background. I earned a master's degree in linguistics from Kyiv National Linguistic University, but after a while, I decided to pursue a career in aviation and began studying aviation management in Poland, where I graduated from the University of Information Technology and Management.

How did you find *airBaltic*?

It was actually the other way around (*laughs*)! We in fact had two encounters.

Long before I joined the company, I was working on a project for my university studies, and when considering which airline I could do this project about, I chose *airBaltic*. Later, thinking about my future career, I applied for a position at *airBaltic* that was vacant at the time.

I applied for that job in 2020, during the pandemic. I remember I had three rounds of interviews, but I was rejected at the very end. However, *airBaltic's* HR team contacted me with an offer a couple of years later, when this position opened up again. Although I already had a job offer from a Polish company and was thinking about moving to Poland, I made the decision to move to Riga instead.

You said the airline looked quite attractive from the outside, but what did you find when you arrived and started working here?

It met all my expectations in terms of environment and the team itself, as the people who work here are extremely professional, friendly, helpful, and collaborative. I do enjoy the company culture, the transparency in all the processes, and being able to openly share ideas and have them heard and implemented.

Where do you find joy in your job? Here I have to talk about AI again – it's super interesting and something totally new! There's not that much practical information about it yet, so for me it's really interesting to observe how it works.

I also enjoy improving the website, adding something new to enhance our customers' experience so they can clearly understand what they're getting and for what price and then make a decision quickly. What I liked about *airBaltic*'s website already some

time ago, when I first explored it, was how it looked. It was clean and clear, not overloaded with information, and now that I've started working here, I can see that this trend is still being pursued. But of course, being insiders, we always notice the imperfections, the small details that can be changed or improved, even if they're not obvious to customers (laughs). But overall, it's nice and I'd like it to continue that way.

What makes your own journey as a passenger comfortable?

Smooth payment is important. In that regard, we implemented *Apple Pay* and *Google Pay* already a couple of years ago to make the experience for our customers even easier. To be honest, if there's no *Apple Pay* or *Google Pay* option on a platform, such as a shopping platform I'm visiting, I just leave it; there's no time anymore to enter card data. I really do enjoy this quick payment option.

My actual flight experience really depends on how long the flight is. If it's three or four hours or more, I do consider buying a seat with extra leg space or a window seat. I also make use of the opportunity to order a meal on board. Having a flight be on schedule is also something I look forward to. And a good mood!

5 THINGS THAT CHARACTERISE IULIIA'S DAY:

Sweet routine: Almost all of my days at the office begin with black coffee and something sweet. This is my sacred routine that boosts my energy level and mood so that I'm ready to dive into my mailbox and notes to see what challenges the new day is about to bring.

Catch-up & brainstorming

meetings: It's never boring in the E-Commerce Department; we've got dozens of projects of various scale going on at the same time. So, regular syncs with teams and colleagues from other departments as well as vendors is an inevitable part of my day to ensure we're aligned conceptually and in terms of timelines. Because I'm in charge of merchandising of our services on airbaltic.com, brainstorming sessions about what can be improved there to make our customers' journeys smoother and even more joyful are another big part of my typical day.

Planning: No project can succeed without thorough planning and regularly revisiting the plan. I religiously follow this rule at work.

Collaboration: As a project manager at a very dynamic and fast-growing airline, I can hardly imagine traditional linear project flow. That simply doesn't work nowadays. When organising the work of cross-functional teams, I believe collaboration is key, as it boosts innovation, enhances creativity, and speeds up problem solving. Hence, each of my days involves numerous big, small, and micro collaborations to achieve our common company goals.

Silent mode: Hours spent communicating and collaborating can't drive the projects on their own, so I always try to reserve at least a few hours a day for deep work when nothing distracts me and my concentration level is high. This is time for structured work and processing really complex tasks, and believe me, there are many of those as we deal with our booking engine.

HOBBY

Maksis Gustavs Auziņš has ridden bicycles since he was a young child. He learned to ride a bicycle in the vard by his home so long ago that he doesn't even remember how old he was. And he still rides today, in various amateur bicycle rides and tours but also to work on days when he doesn't have to bring along a suitcase for longer flights abroad. In fact, Maksis has never owned a car; he's never needed one. He also specifically chose to live along the route of bus no. 22, which runs between the airport and the city centre of Riga.

'This bicycle is ideal for riding on gravel roads,' Maksis explains. 'Before this one, I had a *fixie* with very narrow tires for riding around the city, but it was hard to ride it outside the city, so I've now turned more to off-road bicycles.'

One of the events Maksis enjoys are the night rides in Riga, which are organised by the local Night Ride Riga bicycle community. 'We meet by the Dailes Theatre every Friday night at 10 p.m., and then we decide which direction to ride in,' Maksis explains. 'For example, towards Sigulda...or perhaps in the other direction, towards Jūrmala and Sloka. The number of bicycle riders participating varies, but it's usually around 30 to 50 people. The whole event is a little extreme, but it's actually a lot of fun.'

Another event Maksis participates in is the annual Critical Mass Bike Ride, which takes place once a year in Riga and is very popular, with about a thousand cyclists taking part. The idea is to show that cyclists have a place in the city, too. 'I've always been in favour of cycling and pedestrian rights in the city. But our Riga is currently still a very carbased city,' he says.

The craziest ride Maksis has been on was the 135-kilometre ride from Riga to Ķegums and back. And all because the local bike shop in the Āgenskalns neighbourhood where he lives had announced an advertising campaign: ride 100 kilometres and get a free coffee! 'So a friend and I did it together for fun,' Maksis laughs. 'The shop organises a 100-kilometre challenge like that every now and then.'

Maksis' other hobby is basketball. Because he can't take his bicycle with him on work trips, he brings a basketball (with the air let out, of course), because you can find a court with a basket anywhere, and people to play with, too. Maksis has already established a circle of friends this way in Zurich, Dusseldorf, and Gran Canaria.

HOW IT ALL BEGAN

'The beginning of my story is quite fun. I remember that I really liked buses when I was a kid and wanted to be a bus driver. Later on, though, I realised that the salary wouldn't be very attractive, so I wondered what might be similar to driving a bus, but at the next level. And I realised I had to become a pilot,' Maksis laughs. Luckily, his mother worked at the airport, so at the age of 15 Maksis began working summer jobs at the airport and has been around aviation ever since. His very first job was as an assistant to an aviation security inspector, meaning that he helped scan passengers' boarding passes and slide trays along the security line.

Maksis has also worked in the duty-free shops at the airport, in customer service for another airline, and as a flight dispatcher planning flights. Then he joined the *airBaltic* Pilot Academy at age 19 and began training as a pilot. But he also had a plan B, namely, studying political science at the University of Latvia. He remains interested in politics and international relations to this day.

Maksis' studies at the Pilot Academy coincided with the Covid-19 pandemic, a time of great uncertainty regarding the future of the aviation industry and job security for pilots. But Maksis believed that the sector would weather the storm. He didn't give up, continued his studies, and nowadays the pilot profession is again in high demand. He has been flying for airBaltic for two years now.

'Of course, no one can tell you or show you what a pilot's work is really like. The simulator doesn't provide that,' Maksis laughs. 'Only when you actually begin working as a pilot do you understand that it's really a lifestyle. Some things turn out to be much more challenging than I had initially imagined, while others seem easier. But I really like my work, I like flying, and eventually I'd like to become a flight instructor. I hope it will come true!'

Flight cancellation and name change options

For your peace of mind, add the option to cancel your reservation and get a full refund in the form of an airBaltic gift card in case your travel plans change. This service costs from EUR 14.99 per passenger per direction.

Or add the option to change the passenger name on your ticket for a fee from EUR 9.99 per direction.

Heavy cabin baggage

You can take on board one cabin bag (55x40x23 cm) and one personal item (30x40x10 cm) with a total weight of eight kilograms free of charge.

However, sometimes you may need to carry more but want to avoid waiting for a checked suitcase at the baggage belt. Now you can add an extra four kilograms to your cabin baggage from EUR 11.99 and take a total of 12 kilograms on board.

Please note: If you purchase extra cabin baggage weight, your cabin baggage must still remain within the above-mentioned dimensions. Exceeding the allowed cabin baggage weight or size limits will cost EUR 75 at the airport.



Checked baggage

Add checked baggage if you want to take up to 23 kilograms, including liquids over 100 ml, which are not allowed in cabin baggage. The cheapest option is to book checked baggage along with your ticket at airbaltic.com starting from EUR 19.99. You can also add baggage anytime later at a higher price.


